SUMMARY

This report comprises the final results of the archaeological excavation of AR048 in the townlands of Sheepstown and Ballygeardra, Co. Kilkenny. This excavation was undertaken as part of the archaeological programme for the N9/N10 Kilcullen to Waterford Scheme: Waterford to Knocktopher section. The excavation was conducted by John Channing under Ministerial Direction for Valerie J Keeley Ltd from 20 July to 10 August 2006.

Excavations at this site produced a deposit of heat-cracked stones, silt and charcoal.

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1.0 INTRODUCTION

Valerie J Keeley Ltd was appointed by Kilkenny County Council to excavate archaeological sites first

identified during a programme of centreline testing (Margaret Gowen & Co Ltd, 2006).

The scope of the archaeological measures was:

• To strip the topsoil from an area measuring approx 1600m² along the road corridor and locate

the previously identified archaeological features and any other archaeological features that

may be present in this area.

Photograph and plan any archaeological features or potential archaeological features.

• Excavate all archaeological features identified, record their contexts and sections; retaining

samples where necessary, in order to resolve them by means of preservation by record.

Reinstatement of excavated areas where required.

2.0 PROJECT BACKGROUND

The proposed excavation was carried out following the initial archaeological assessment by Valerie J

Keeley Ltd (2005) and completion of the subsequent centreline testing (Margaret Gowen & Co Ltd,

2006). The goal of this project was to preserve by record the archaeological site/s exposed within the

take of the proposed route.

These works took place in accordance with the Directions issued by the Minister for Environment,

Heritage and Local Government under Section 14A(2) of the National Monuments Acts (1930-2004), in

accordance with the terms of the Contract between Kilkenny Council and Valerie J Keeley Ltd

and according to the terms of the Code of Practice agreed between the National Roads Authority and

the Minister of Arts, Heritage, Gaeltacht and the Islands. The excavations also complied with the Policy

and Guidelines on Archaeological Excavation (Govt of Ireland 1999) and were overseen by the Project

Archaeologist.

The proposed development will involve the construction of one section of a new N9/N10 road between

Kilcullen and Waterford.

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3.0 SITE DESCRIPTION

The site (AR048, E3017) was located adjacent to, but separated by a stream from AR047. The ground consisted of boggy grassland currently under pasture, *c*1.7km northeast of Newmarket village and 1.7km southwest of Knocktopher in the townlands of Ballygeardra and Sheepstown, Co Kilkenny. The remains of a horizontal mill (SMR no KK031-020) were located nearby.

4.0 METHOD

The topsoil at this site was removed from the site utilising a hydraulic excavator under the direction, supervision and monitoring of a qualified archaeologist. Once the topsoil had been removed, the entirety of the site area was cleaned back to reveal the features identified during the previous testing (see above) and to try to identify any new features which may have been exposed.

Upon location all archaeological materials were cleaned and excavated by hand using methods appropriate to their composition, nature and date. All archaeological contexts were photographed and planned (in relation to the site grid) prior to excavation. Sections were excavated through all features to obtain profiles and to expose the stratigraphic sequences and then fully excavated. Features that proved to be of modern origin tended not to be fully excavated.

The composition, stratigraphic position and interpretation of all contexts were recorded on a context sheet prior to excavation. Contexts have been sampled for palaeobotanical material, radiocarbon dating, petrology and wood identification, where appropriate. All sections and cut features were photographed and drawn. The position of all finds and samples were recorded in three-dimensions (where practicable) in relation to the site-grid.

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5.0 RESULTS

Excavation revealed a deposit of black, friable, silt, charcoal and heat- cracked stones ([c7]= [c8]=[c15]),

located beside a modern boundary ditch [c10]. The deposit was sealed by a layer of peat [c3] and cut

by a test trench [c5]. The remaining deposits were non-archaeological and consisted of stony silty clay

[c4], light-grey sand containing flecks of organic matter [c9], stones and charcoal [c12], dark brown peat

with stones and charcoal [c13] and coarse sand with decayed burnt stone [14].

6.0 DISCUSSION

The archaeological assessment report (Margaret Gowen & Co Ltd, 2006, p.19) identified the burnt

deposit ([c7]=[c8]=[c15]) and a sub-round depression within the grey marl subsoil which, when

excavated, appeared to be a natural feature. The remaining recorded features appeared to be of

modern origin, probably up-cast from the ditch or deposits made during land improvement works.

7.0 CONCLUSION

The burnt spread did not extend to the boundary dividing AR047 and AR048. The full extent of this

feature appeared to be cut by the boundary ditch, which possibly truncated any associated features.

The spread could be the remains of a single episode of land clearance activity pre-dating the boundary

in this area.









Fig. 2 Location of AR048 on OS mapping.					Reichon House Tel: (+353) 056 4440236 Kilkenny Road Castlecomer Co. Kilkenny. Website: www.vjk.je Client Kilkenny County Council






Plate 1: E3017_010. Pre-excavation view of Area 48 with topsoil removed.
