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
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



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PREFACE.

-:0:---

THE following adaptation of the Lesser Hours of the Day—forms the first section of the "Priest's Book of Private Devotion," of which a new edition has just been issued—"a Manual compiled with the object of providing, in accordance with the full system of the Catholic Church, and in consistency with the tone and spirit of the Prayer Book, as well for those devotional wants of the Clergy, which they share with their lay brethren, as for those arising from their own peculiar functions."

The present section has long been published separately, and has been found (if the Compiler may venture to infer so much from the sale of several editions) a convenient adaptation in a portable form, when it is impracticable to use the original Offices in their fulness; but it is *only* an adaptation, and therefore necessarily eclectic.

The present edition is much enlarged. (a) The Calendar is prefixed: (b) The Prayer Book Collects for the whole of the Christian Year are now added: (c) Additional Collects, both for the Hours (in loco), and for the Black Letter Days, have been added from the Parisian and Ambrosian Breviaries, and from other sources: (d) The Proper of Seasons has been

enlarged: (e) An Office for the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed has been added: (f) and the Benedictio Mensæ affixed.

The Offices of Lauds and Vespers are not added, because the recitation of Mattins and Evensong, which is our bounden duty and service, complete the Seven Hours.


In conclusion, may the Compiler venture to request, that should this little book minister to the devotional wants of his brethren, he may have a share in their intercessions.



TABLES AND RULES

FOR THE MOVEABLE AND IMMOVEABLE FEASTS: TO-GETHER WITH THE DAYS OF FASTING AND ABSTI-NENCE, THROUGH THE WHOLE YEAR.

RULES to know when the Moveable Feasts and Holy-days begin.

EASTER-DAY (on which the rest depend) is always the First Sunday after the Full Moon which happens upon, or next after the Twenty-first Day of March; and if the Full Moon happens upon a Sunday, Easter-Day is the Sunday after.

Advent-Sunday is always the nearest Sunday to the Feast of Saint Andrew, whether before or after.

The FATHER incomprehensible, the Son incomprehensible: and the Holy Ghost incomprehensible.

The FATHER eternal, the Son eternal: and the Holy Ghost eternal.

And yet they are not three eternals: but One Eternal.

As also there are not three incomprehensibles, nor three uncreated; but One Uncreated, and One Incomprehensible.

So likewise the FATHER is Almighty, the Son Almighty: and the Holy Ghost Almighty.

And yet they are not three Almighties: but One Almighty.

So the FATHER is GOD, the Son is GOD: and the HOLY GHOST is GOD.

And yet they are not three GoDs: but One GoD.

So likewise the FATHER is LORD, the SON LORD: and the HOLY GHOST LORD.

And yet not three LORD's: but one LORD.

For like as we are compelled by the Christian verity: to acknowledge every Person by Himself to be God and Lord;

So are we forbidden by the Catholic Religion: to say, There be three Gods,

or three Lords.

The FATHER is made of none; neither created, nor begotten.

The Son is of the FATHER alone: not made, nor created, but begotten.

The HOLY GHOST is of the FATHER and of the Son: neither made, nor created, nor begotten, but proceeding.

So there is one FATHER, not three FATHERS: one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Ghost, not three

HOLY GHOSTS.

And in this Trinity none is afore, or after other: none is greater, or less than another:

But the whole three Persons are co-eternal together: and co-equal.

So that in all things, as is aforesaid: the Unity in Trinity, and the Trinity in Unity is to be worshipped.

He therefore that will

be saved: must thus think of the Trinity.

Furthermore, it is necessary to everlasting salvation: that he also believe rightly the Incarnation of our LORD JESUS CHRIST.

For the right Faith is, that we believe and confess: that our LORD JESUS CHRIST, the SON of GOD, is GOD and Man;

God, of the Substance of the Father, begotten before the worlds: and Man, of the Substance of His Mother, born in the world:

Perfect God, and perfect Man: of a reasonable soul and human flesh subsisting;

Equal to the FATHER, as touching His Godhead: and inferior to the FATHER, as touching His Manhood.

Who although He be God and Man: yet He is not two, but one Christ;

One; not by conversion of the Godhead into flesh: but by taking of the Manhood into GoD;

One altogether; not by confusion of Substance: but by unity of Person.

For as the reasonable soul and flesh is one man:

so God and Man is one Christ:

Who suffered for our salvation: descended into hell, rose again the third

day from the dead.

He ascended into heaven, He sitteth on the right hand of the FATHER, GOD Almighty: from whence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

At Whose coming all men shall rise again with their bodies; and shall give account for their own works. And they that have done good shall go into life everlasting: and they that have done evil into everlasting fire.

This is the Catholic Faith: which except a man believe faithfully, he

cannot be saved.

Almighty and everlasting God, by Whose Spirit the whole body of the Church is governed and sanctified; receive our supplications and prayers, which we offer before Thee for all estates of men in Thy holy Church, that every member of the same, in his vocation and ministry, may truly and godly serve Thee; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

O merciful God, Who hast made all men, and hatest nothing that Thou hast made, nor wouldest the death of a sinner, but rather that he should be converted and live; have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, Infidels, and Heretics, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy Word; and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. Amen.

EASTER EVEN.

Grant, O LORD, that as we are baptized into the death of Thy blessed Son our Saviour Jesus Christ, so by continual mortifying our corrupt affections we may be buried with Him: and that through the grave, and gate of death, we may pass to our joyful resurrection; for His merits, Who died and was buried, and rose again for us, Thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

EASTER DAY.

Almighty God, Who, through Thine only-begotten Son Jesus Christ, hast overcome death, and opened unto us the gate of everlasting life; we humbly beseech Thee, that, as by Thy special grace preventing us, Thou dost put into our minds good desires, so by Thy continual help we may bring the same to good effect; through Jesus Christ our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

FIRST SUNDAY AFTER EASTER.

Almighty FATHER, Who hast given Thine only Son to die for our sins, and to rise again for our justifica-

tion; grant us so to put away the leaven of malice and wickedness, that we may always serve Thee in pureness of living and truth; through the merits of the same Thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

SECOND SUNDAY AFTER EASTER.

Almighty God, Who hast given Thine only Son to be unto us both a sacrifice for sin, and also an ensample of godly life; give us grace that we may always most thankfully receive that His inestimable benefit, and also daily endeavour ourselves to follow the blessed steps of His most holy life; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THIRD SUNDAY AFTER EASTER.

Almighty God, Who shewest to them that be in error the light of Thy truth, to the intent that they may return into the way of righteousness; grant unto all them that are admitted into the fellowship of Christ's Religion, that they may eschew those things that are contrary to their profession, and follow all such things as are agreeable to the same; through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER EASTER.

ASCENSION DAY.

Grant, we beseech Thee, Almighty God, that like as we do believe Thine only-begotten Son our Lord Jesus Christ to have ascended into the heavens; so we may also in heart and mind thither ascend, and with Him continually dwell, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, one God, world without end. Amen.

SUNDAY AFTER ASCENSION DAY.

O God, the King of glory, Who hast exalted Thine only Son Jesus Christ with great triumph unto Thy kingdom in heaven; we beseech Thee, leave us not comfortless; but send to us Thine Holy Ghost to comfort us, and exalt us unto the same place whither our Saviour Christ is gone before, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, one God, world without end. Amen.

to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity, and in the power of the divine Majesty to worship the Unity; we beseech Thee, that Thou wouldest keep us stedfast in this faith, and evermore defend us from all adversities; Who livest and reignest, one God, world without end. Amen.

FIRST SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY.

O God, the strength of all them that put their trust in Thee, mercifully accept our prayers; and because through the weakness of our mortal nature we can do no good thing without Thee, grant us the help of Thy grace, that in keeping of Thy commandments we may please Thee, both in will and deed; through Jesus Christ our Lord. O God, Whose never-failing providence ordereth all things both in heaven and earth; we humbly beseech Thee to put away from us all hurtful things, and to give us those things which be profitable for us: through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

NINTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY.

Grant to us, LORD, we beseech Thee, the spirit to think and do always such things as be rightful; that we, who cannot do anything that is good without Thee, may by Thee be enabled to live according to Thy will; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

TENTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY.

Let Thy merciful ears, O LORD, be open to the prayers of Thy humble servants; and that they may obtain their petitions, make them to ask such things as shall please Thee; through JESUS CHRIST OUR LORD. Amen.

ELEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY.

O God, Who declarest Thy Almighty power most chiefly in shewing mercy and pity, mercifully grant unto us such a measure of Thy grace, that we, running the way of Thy commandments, may obtain Thy gracious promises, and be made partakers of Thy heavenly treasure; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

TWELFTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY.

Almighty and everlasting God, Who art always more ready to hear than we to pray, and art wont to give more than either we desire, or deserve; pour down upon us the abundance of Thy mercy; forgiving us those things whereof our conscience is afraid, and giving us those good things which we are not worthy to ask, but through the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord. Amen.

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY.

O Almighty and most merciful God, of Thy bountiful goodness keep us, we beseech Thee, from all things that may hurt us; that we, being ready both in body and soul, may cheerfully accomplish those things that Thou wouldest have done; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY.

Grant, we beseech Thee, merciful LORD, to Thy faithful people pardon and peace, that they may be cleansed from all their sins, and serve Thee with a quiet mind; through JESUS CHRIST OUR LORD.

Amen.

TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY.

LORD, we beseech Thee to keep Thy household the Church in continual godliness; that through Thy protection it may be free from all adversities, and devoutly given to serve Thee in good works, to the glory of Thy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

O God, our refuge and strength, Who art the author of all godliness; be ready, we beseech Thee, to hear

the devout prayers of Thy Church; and grant that those things which we ask faithfully we may obtain effectually; through JESUS CHRIST OUR LORD. Amen.

The following Collects are simply intended to be supplementary to those in the Book of Common Prayer.

EMBER DAYS IN ADVENT.

GRANT we humbly beseech Thee, O heavenly FATHER, that with Simeon, Anna, and all Thy devout servants who waited for the consolation of Israel; we may at this time so wait upon Thee in fasting and prayer, that by the celebration of the approaching Festival of the Nativity of our Blessed Redeemer, we may like them be filled with true joy and consolation; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE VIGIL OF THE NATIVITY (from "the First Prayer Book," 1549).

O God, Who makest us glad with the yearly remembrance of the birth of Thy only Son Jesus Christ; grant that as we joyfully receive Him for our Re-

deemer, so we may with sure confidence behold Him when He shall come to be our Judge; Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, One God world without end. Amen.

CHRISTMAS DAY (at midnight).

O God, Who hast caused this most holy Night to shine with the brightness of the true Light; grant, we beseech Thee, that as we have known on earth the Mysteries of that Light, so we may also obtain the full enjoyment of it in heaven; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord; Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

OCTAVE OF THE EPIPHANY.

O God, Who through Thine only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, hast endued the waters of Baptism with the grace which halloweth to eternal life; grant we beseech Thee that we who have received the mystical washing away of sin, may so keep our baptismal robes undefiled, that we may be found worthy at the last to sit down at the marriage supper of the Lamb; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. O God, Who didst send Thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ into this world, that He might humiliate Himself to our estate and recall us to Thee; Who when He drew near Jerusalem that He might fulfil the Scriptures, suffered the multitude to strew His path with palms and scattered garments; grant, we beseech Thee, that we may prepare for Him in our hearts the way of faith, and adorn that way with the fruits of righteousness, so that we may be worthy in this Holy Season to follow His steps; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

WEDNESDAY IN HOLY WEEK.

O LORD JESUS CHRIST, Who on this day was content to be sold to Thine enemies, that Thou mightest redeem Thy people from the power of the devil: grant that we, being redeemed by Thy precious Blood, may never betray Thee by our sins; Who livest and reignest with the FATHER and the HOLY GHOST, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

MAUNDY THURSDAY.

O God, Who unto us, in the Blessed Sacrament, hast left a memorial of Thy Passion: grant that we may so venerate the sacred mysteries of Thy Body and Blood here on earth, that we may evermore perceive in ourselves the fruit of Thy Redemption; Who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Ghost, one God, world without end. Amen.

EASTER DAY (from the "First Prayer Book," 1549).

O God, Who for our redemption didst give Thine only-begotten Son to the death of the Cross, and by Thy glorious Resurrection hast delivered us from the power of the enemy; grant us so to die daily unto sin, that we may evermore live with Him in the joy of His Resurrection; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

EASTER-TIDE.

O God, Who gladdenest our hearts by the Festival of the Resurrection of Thy dear Son our Lord: mercifully grant that we, who now celebrate these joyous days on earth, may, at length, attain to the eternal Easter in heaven; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

ROGATION DAYS.

O Almighty God, Who hast promised that summer and winter, seed-time and harvest shall never cease: and that they who seek Thy kingdom, and the righteousness thereof, shall obtain all things necessary for their bodily sustenance; look mercifully upon the earth, now covered with the fruit of Thy bounty, and grant us such favourable weather, that in due time we may reap the increase thereof to the glory of Thy Holy Name, the relief of them that are needy, and the supply of our own necessities; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

EMBER DAYS IN WHITSUNTIDE.

Amen.

XI. UPON A BIRTHDAY IN THE FAMILY.

O Almighty God, Who hast mercifully preserved Thy servant our dear brother during the past year: we render Thee thanks for the blessings conferred upon him during its course. We pray Thee to pardon whatsoever sins, through the frailty of his nature, he may have committed, and beseech Thee so to preserve him by Thy grace during the new period of his life on which he has now entered, that growing in years he may also grow in Thy grace, and ever remain in the number of Thy faithful and elect children; through IESUS CHRIST our LORD. Amen.

Almighty and most pitiful God, Who hast of Thy mercy said, Suffer little children to come unto Me: we beseech Thee to give us grace to submit to Thy Blessed will, and to thank Thee for our little one whom Thou hast taken from the miseries of this sinful world. Amen.

Amen.

O Lord Jesus Christ, Who didst charge the Apostles to preach the Gospel to every nation; prosper, we pray Thee, all Missions both at home and abroad (especially ——). Give them all things needful for their work, to the quickening of many souls, and the glory of Thy holy Name. Support, guide, and bless the Clergy who labour in them: give them grace to bear faithful witness to the Truth, endue them with ardent zeal and love, make them patient under disappointments, and submissive under persecutions, that they may turn many to righteousness, and may win to themselves a crown of glory; through Thy merits, Who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Spirit, world without end. Amen.

XXIV. FOR TRAVELLERS BY SEA OR LAND.

O God, who didst call Abraham to leave his home, and didst protect him in all his wanderings: grant to those who now travel by land or sea (especially ——) a prosperous journey, a quiet time, and a safe arrival at their journey's end. Be to them a shadow in the heat, a refuge in the tempest, a protection in adversity; and grant that, when life's pilgrimage is over, they may arrive at the heavenly country; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

XXV. FOR MOURNERS.

O God, Who dost hear the cry of Thy children and number their tears: have mercy upon those whom Thou hast afflicted in Thy love, and enable them to bow before Thee in humble submission to Thy appointment. Thou Who didst weep over the grave of Lazarus, assuage their tears and grant them grace to submit to Thy Will, knowing that it is a Father's hand which holds the rod; and grant them, when this life of trial and separation is ended, to find with him who has been taken from them a joyful entrance into Thy kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Grant them, O Lord, we beseech Thee, a place of refreshment, light, and peace, in the bosom of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, where all sighing and sadness are banished away, and the light of Thy countenance shineth for ever; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

XXIX. ON THE DAY OF A DEATH OR BURIAL.

O God, Whose nature and property is ever to have mercy and to forgive: we humbly beseech Thee, for the soul of Thy servant M. Amen.

XXX. AFTER AN EARLY COMMUNION.

O Merciful Lord God, Who dost vouchsafe to feed us Thine unworthy children with that Living Bread which cometh down from Heaven, and giveth life unto the soul; so strengthen and sustain us, we beseech Thee, by Thy most precious gifts, that we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy attain everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

XXXI. BEFORE A CONFIRMATION.

V. Deliverance from Pestilence.


