My dear Baba,

Thank you very much for your letter of Nov. 7th. and for sending on to me Viola's long and interesting letter. I knew George would be interested to have news of Viola, so I sent her letter to him. He returned it to me yesterday. I enclose a letter I have written to Viola in case you can send this on to her. I am not sure whether it is unwise to send a letter through you, or whether it would be unwise to do so with an English stamp. I am writing direct to Agnes, but it is not possible for me to invite her to stay with me here. As you know this is a very tiny cottage and there is only one bedroom. I have also retired and am living on a small pension, not an ideal environment for a young woman who will surely miss young society. I am very sorry not to be able to help Viola by inviting Agnes to come here.

The Bulldog kennels came in 1970, but the owner refused to pay her share of the expenses so I had to ask her to leave. It was a disastrous adventure for me for I invested a lot of money helping her to get the kennels established here, thinking that it would give her a home, and at the same time, give me an interest when I retired and a pleasant companion too. I had planned to have an extension built on as a bed-sitting room for my companion, but as things turned out I am thankful I had not put that in hand, for it would have been a complete waste of more money.

I have one Bulldog, named Moses, who is an interesting animal and I am fond of him, but at times I realise that a dog makes life more difficult for a single woman. For instance, I cannot go away for a holiday for I could not afford to pay the high cost of his keep in a Boarding kennel. If only we could know how long we are going to live! I have a little money invested but I do not want to dip into that yet awhile.

I am very glad to know that your mother is with you. What a wonderful old lady she must be. Please give her my best love. I well remember how kind she was to me all those years ago when I went to Szeged.

Unfortunately, I have not seen George for a very long time. We write to each other regularly but he told me long ago that he did not want me to visit him in Hospital.
