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SUMMARY

This report describes archaeological resolution of a possible site at Tirquin Townland, County Cavan. Investigation of a subsoil anomaly did not yield any archaeologically significant information and the single context is interpreted as root disturbance.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

Project Location

The proposed Cavan bypass stage 2 Scheme commences at the existing N3, 1.5km east of Cavan town, extending in a predominantly northeast to southwest direction to the existing N55, c.2.5km south of Cavan town. There is also a secondary link connecting the N55 at Moynehall to the Ballyjamesduff road. The development may be located on 6" sheet 25 Co. Cavan and at National Grid 242987E 302983N.

Location of Site 4

The site was located to the South of site 2 in field 8 of testing report. The part of field 8 containing site 4 consisted of gently sloping flat pasture, rising up to the Southeast. One additional test trench was excavated to delimit the feature and test for possible associated features.

The Scope of the project

The aim of the archaeological excavation was to fully resolve and preserve by record archaeological remains within the road-take at site 4, thus facilitating road construction. The area opened reflected the centreline testing results.

Circumstances and dates of fieldwork

All cuttings were topsoil striped by tracked-excavator with a toothless bucket. Subsoil surface was manually cleaned down and archaeological features fully recorded and manually excavated. The works were conducted during week ending Friday 3rd September. The on-site team consisted of a site director (the author), a supervisor, one assistant, and a general operative.

2.0 ARCHAEOLOGICAL AND HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Testing Resumée

The site was initially discovered during centreline testing. The testing was conducted under licence

04E0968 and reported separately. The site presented as an oval spread of charcoal on subsoil surface.

An additional test trench was excavated to delimit the feature and test for possible associated features.

Prior to testing there were no surface anomalies to denote possible archaeological features. The land

was under mature pasture.

3.0 SITE SEQUENCE: EXCAVATION

Introduction

The excavation uncovered one feature. The feature possessed maximum dimensions of 98cms from

northeast to southwest by 21cms from southeast to northwest. It was curvilinear and is best described

as banana shaped in plan. The feature extended 2-4cms into the subsoil surface. The subsoil surface

did not evidence scorching or discoloration. The single fill was dark brown loamy clay which charcoal

flecks.

Natural and topography

The part of field 8 containing site 4 consisted of gently sloping flat pasture, rising up to the Southeast.

Prehistoric

No finds or features to denote possible activity on the site. Excavations at adjacent site 2 located c

125m north, (04E173 Channing) uncovered possible Bronze Age activity in the form of burnt deposits,

troughs, pits and possible prehistoric pottery and lithics.

Medieval Post-medieval and modern

The feature is interpreted as a single agricultural or root feature, probably associated with field

improvement works.
