Elevation of the unsupported Bridge above the River, 51 metres, equal to 170 feet; 157 feet; and 174 feet. The Вreadth, 6 metres and 35 centimetres; the Foot-path at each side, 88 centimetres.

Note.—The metre here employed is equal to 3 feet, 3.370 inches, English measure. The four printed statements, however, all differ. Compared with the Menai Bridge, the balance stands thus:—
