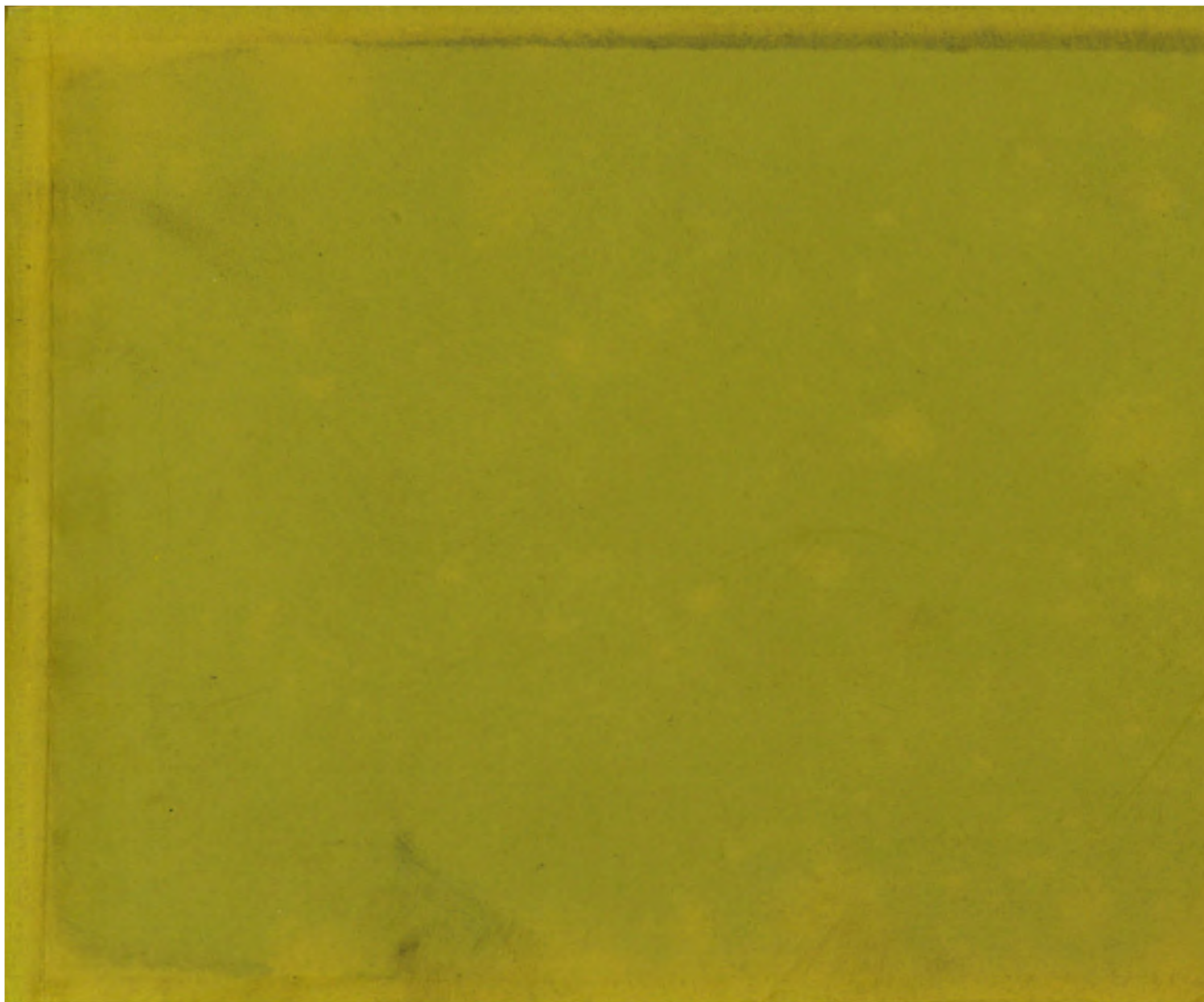

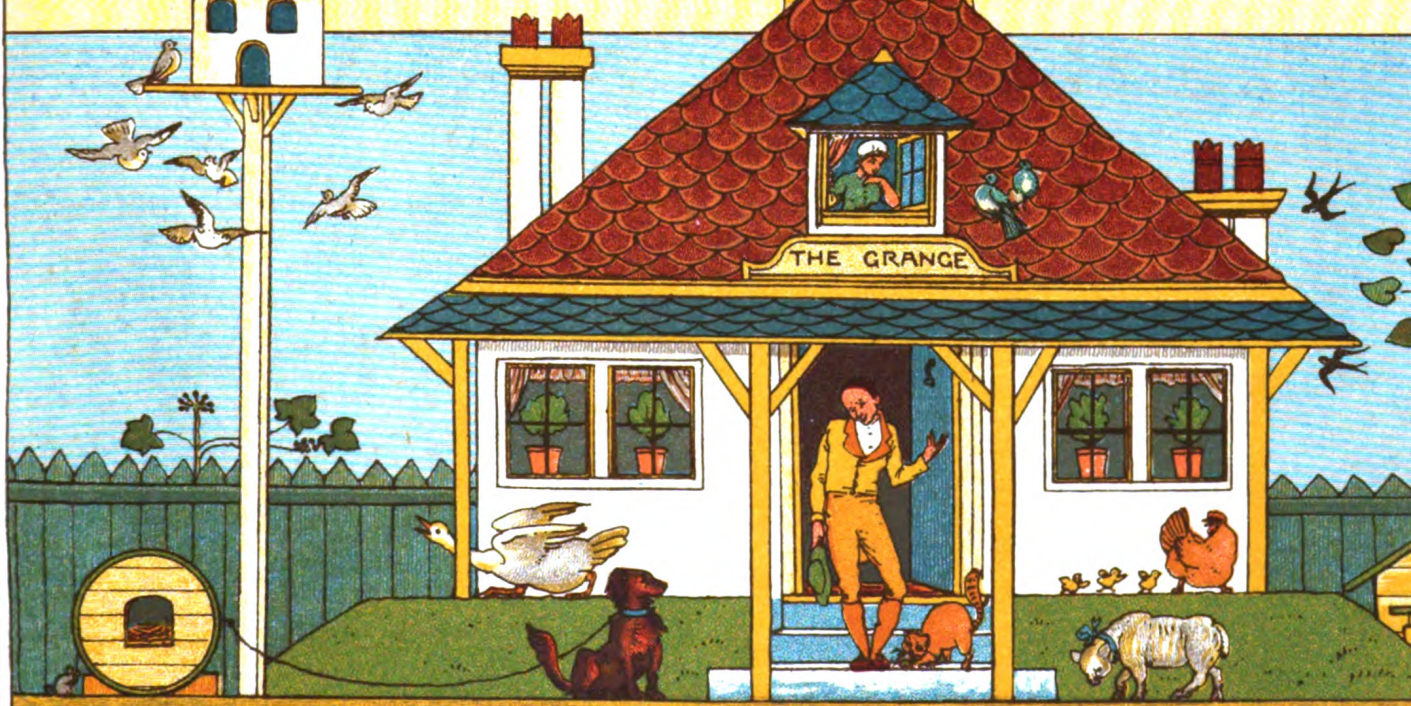

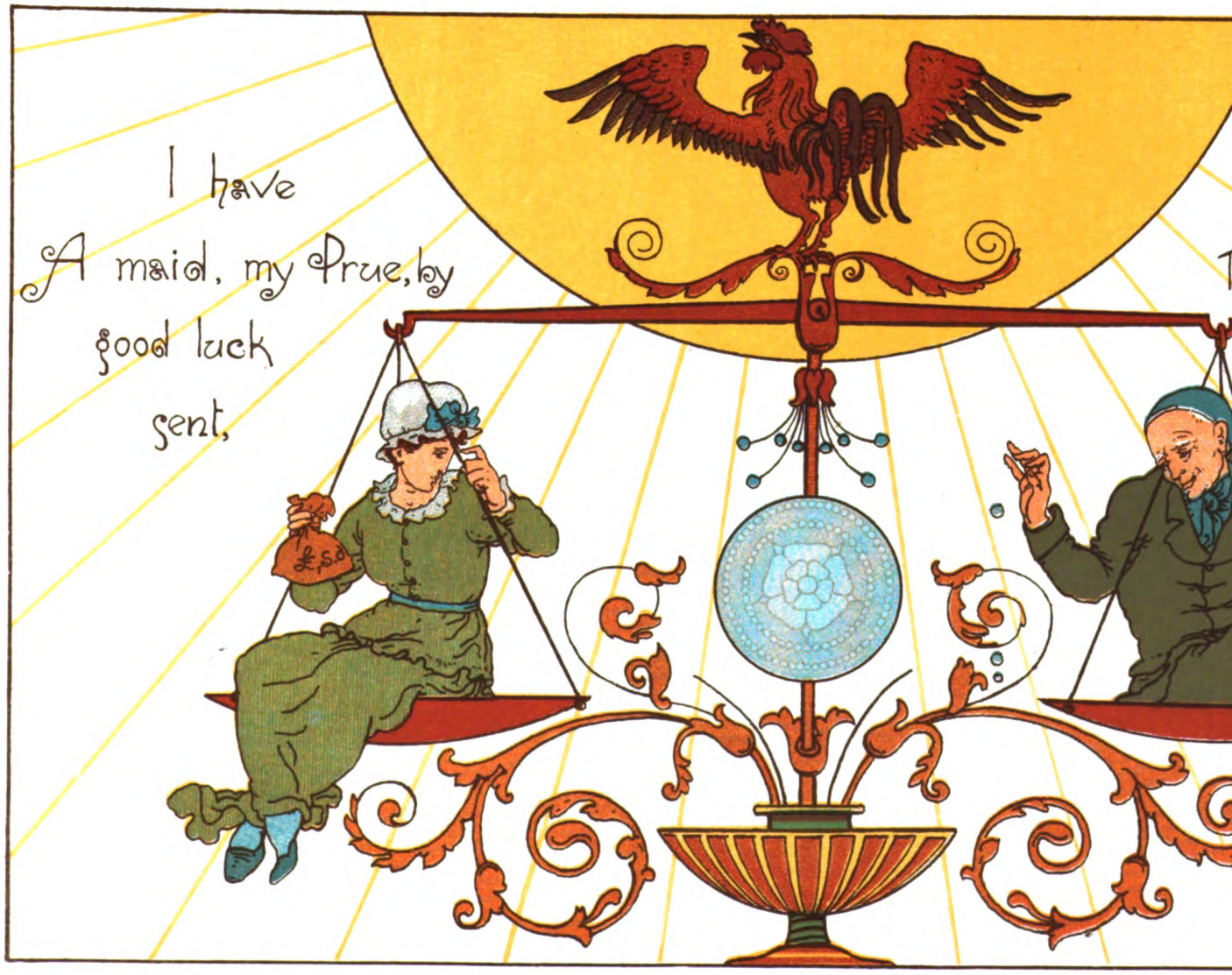

Where care none is, slight things do lightly please.



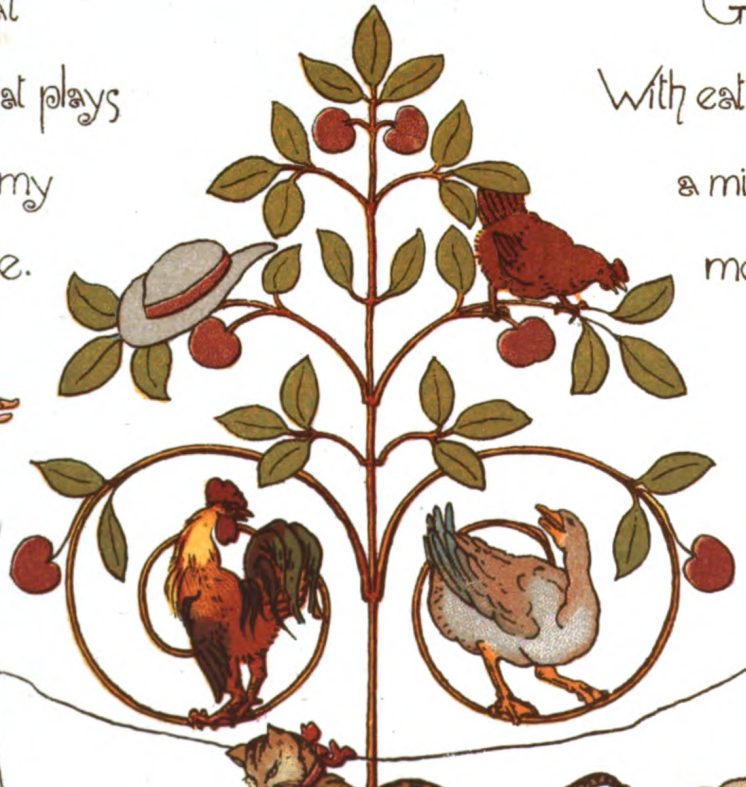
