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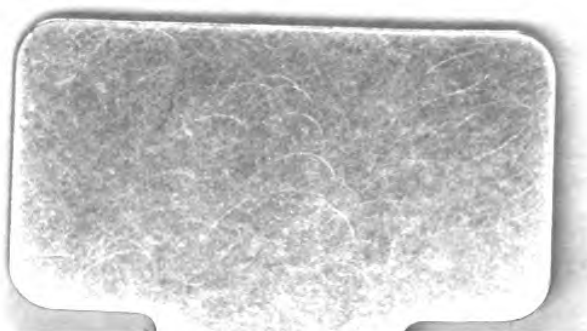

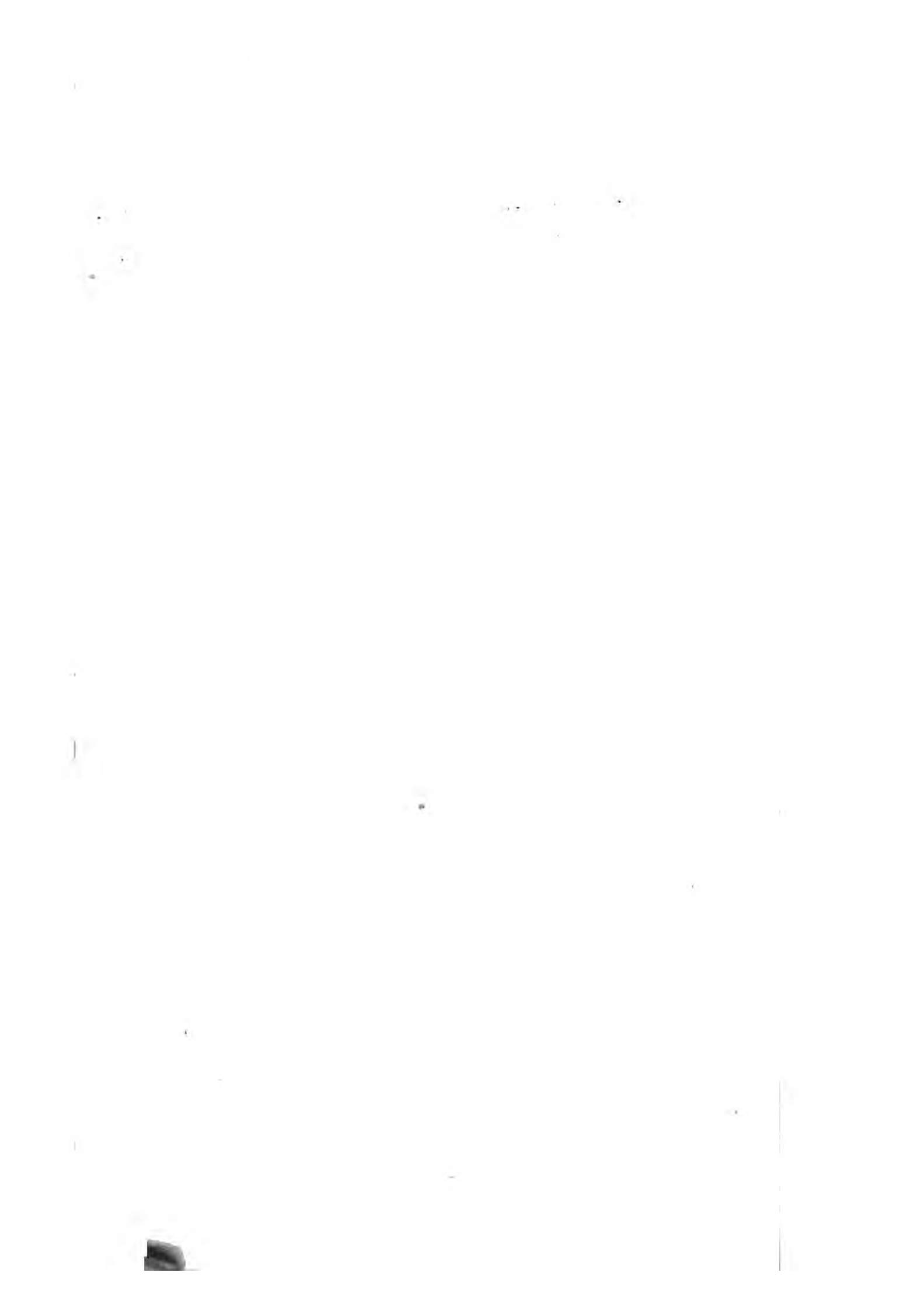

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P R E F A C E.

THE Author of this little volume of Prayers, appreciating the Spirit which influenced the compilers of our Liturgy, and other public services, to search, and enabled them to find, amid the sacred treasures of antiquity, that strain of devotion, purity of doctrine, and sound form of words, for which these compositions are inimitable, has been induced to examine, and has deduced from the same source, a form of Family and Private Prayers, which he believes will be found to coincide with the principles

of our Liturgy and Litany, and with the Doctrines of the Church. He is under the impression that a variation in our private devotions, from the form and phraseology which render our book of Common Prayer so peculiarly adapted to public worship, is desirable; the feelings and expressions with which we pray in private, and in our families, not being so generalized as in our public exercises of devotion.

It cannot be doubted, but that both our public, family, and private prayers, should, as much as possible, embody in them the most essential and leading doctrines of the Bible and the Church; for the character of our devotion must greatly depend on the views we hold with regard to particular Doctrines, the Sacraments, and other ordinances of religion.

E. g. As relates to doctrines¹: if we put a limitation to the universally comprehensive character of the death of Christ, and by our private interpretation of Scripture be led to deny that its efficacy is co-extensive with the race of man, and to maintain that it is limited to individuals who have been *effectually called*; the spirit and character of our prayers and intercessions will be materially altered: or if, claiming the special guidance

of the Spirit, and superseding the written witness to the truth, we should interpret Scripture according to the sense in which it is understood by the advocates of Calvinism, who, forgetting that "secret things belong to the Lord," insist that God has eternally, irrevocably, and unconditionally predestinated some to eternal life, and reprobated or *passed by* others; (thus necessarily destroying man's agency and responsibility) our prayers will be offered up under the influence of this erroneous impression, leading to uncharitable and dishonourable notions of the goodness and grace of God, or to unjustifiable self-confidence¹. (Refer to the Westminster Confession of Faith, and Brown's Dictionary of the

Bible, for the Calvinistic view of God's decrees.)

Again, if adopting the sentiments of those who maintain that the same Spirit which dictated Scripture, guides every man who desires to know the truth to a right understanding of it, we disregard the voice of antiquity, which witnesses that the office and work of the Holy Spirit, is to sanctify us through the truth as already understood and communicated to us through God's appointed means; are we not in danger of erring as widely, and in the same manner, as the Church of Rome, which claims a special guidance for the *living judge* above the *written rule*¹?

Thus, if we admit the propriety of sanctioning the countless and contradictory expositions which the private judgment of modern interpreters imposes on revealed truth, our prayers must assume a tone corresponding with the views we may happen to hold on such important points¹.

The character of our devotions will be greatly influenced by the truth and consistency of our principles; and in this respect it is of no small importance whether, with the Primitive Church, we feel the *necessity* of being united to the One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church, one perpetual visible living body, com-

posed of persons separated from the rest of the world, elected, regenerated, and made Christ's by adoption, in intimate and mysterious communion with the invisible company of spirits, constituting one holy assembly, of which Christ is the Head, the only authorized channel of God's gifts and graces, blessed with One visible Ministry in One unbroken line of succession from the Apostles, alone empowered, and therefore alone justified, in exercising the ministerial commission, or guided by opinions broached within the last few centuries, and believing that every modern community of *professing* Christians (some rejecting one portion of Christianity and some another, as private judgment or caprice may dictate) composes a Church, we admit the propriety or harmlessness of men taking upon them the office of the ministry, whom

God has not called, and the Church has not sanctioned; who intruding into the office of Christ's priesthood, disturb the peace of the Church, contaminate its faith, and profane or nullify its Sacraments. For such persons, we pray in our Lord's words, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."

Not less important, as concerns our devotional exercises, will it prove, whether our explanation of the doctrines of original sin, free-will, justification by faith, and good works, be dependent upon the sense of the Church of Christ, or upon the sentiments of the adherents to the modern system of Calvinistic Theology.

Again, as relates to the Sacraments, if we carry back our researches into these essential ordinances to the times of Zuinglius *only*, and fix upon him and his mystic contemporaries as the resting-

place for our knowledge of the true meaning of Revelation, and if with their school we hold Baptism to be a mere title to the name of Christian, and not, as Universal Tradition with one consent testifies of it, “*Regeneration* ¹ ;” denominating it “the baptism of regeneration to God ² ;” “a putting away the sin of our birth ³ ;” “the old man dying and the new man being born ⁴ ;” “the water cleansing the body, the Spirit cleansing the soul ⁵ ;” “a Sacrament extinguishing in Christ our former sin, and beginning in us a new condition of life, made by one actual administration for ever available ⁶ .” Or as the Anglo-Catholic Church testifies of it, that it is “a death unto sin, and a new

birth unto righteousness¹.” (The unequivocal meaning of which is implicitly stated in the office of Confirmation, “Almighty God, who hast vouchsafed to regenerate these thy servants by water and the Holy Ghost, and hast given them forgiveness of all their sins, *strengthen* them, we beseech Thee, with the Holy Ghost the Comforter.” And confirmed by the Homily on Salvation, which asserts that “infants *being baptized*, and dying in their infancy, are by this sacrifice washed from their sins, brought into God’s favor, made His children, and inheritors of His kingdom of heaven.”) “As to infants, their innocence and incapacity are to them in-

stead of repentance, which they do not want, and of actual faith, which they cannot have¹." Or, as Scripture testifies of it², "A being born of water and of the Spirit," to fit us for heaven. If, I say, in regard to this gracious and purifying Sacrament, we adopt the views of the Geneva reformers, our prayers will be offered to God in a lamentable ignorance of the privileges, and blessings, and promises, of which we are the partakers.

Nor has the Sacrament of the blessed Eucharist less claim to our most reasonable and serious attention. If we lower it into a mere commemorative rite, and

the consecrated elements into mere sensible symbols, set apart for a sacred purpose, viz. to eat and drink of them in imitation of our blessed Lord's eating and drinking at the last Supper, to show forth his death, while we dissent from the primitive belief, that there is "the real participation of Christ and of life in His body and blood by means of this Sacrament," and that special grace is conferred mysteriously through the consecrated elements on the worthy receiver ; our special prayers, both antecedent and subsequent to this solemn service of the Altar, will be devoid of much of that reverential awe and holy love which they will experience, who, not deviating from the Catholic and Apostolic doctrine of the Eucharistic Sacrifice, account of it as a commemorative representative Sacrifice, as well

as a feast upon a Sacrifice, that whereon it is offered being called an Altar in respect of the former, the Lord's Table in respect of the latter.

The doctrine of the Eucharist, as maintained by the Catholic Church, is plainly defined by the following quotations.

“A Sacramental representation of that one only *bloody* sacrifice offered up once for all¹.”

“The continuation of the flesh and blood of this sacrifice, by a sacrifice of remembrance².”

“A sacrifice, an example of *the* sacrifice, that that we do, being done in remembrance of that that was done³.”

“For there is one flesh of our Lord Jesus Christ, and one cup in the unity of His blood. One Altar, as there is

one Bishop, together with the Presbytery, and Deacons, my fellow servants ¹."

"So often as we do celebrate the Eucharist, so often do we offer Christ in a mystery, and sacrifice Him by commemoration or representation ²."

"The commemorative sacrifice of the body and blood of Christ, in which the action and sufferings of our great High Priest are represented and offered to God on earth, as they are continually by the same High Priest Himself in heaven. The Church on earth doing, after its measure, the same thing as its Head in heaven; Christ in heaven presenting the sacrifice and applying it to its purposed end ³."

And in accordance with the formularies of our portion of the Church¹.

“Not only a *sign*, but a *sacrament* of our redemption by Christ’s death,” “a partaking of the body and blood of Christ.”

“Our Saviour Jesus Christ not only dying for us, but also being our spiritual food and sustenance in that sacrament.”

“A Communion of the body and blood of our Saviour Christ.” “Receiving these holy mysteries with the spiritual food of the most precious body and blood of his Son our Saviour Jesus Christ.”

“Becoming members *incorporate* in the mystical body of His Son².”

“The body and blood of Christ which are *verily* and *indeed* taken and received by the faithful in the Lord’s Supper³.”

And as propounded to us according to the tenor of Scripture, Eating the flesh and drinking the blood of the Son of Man¹. Eating His body, and drinking all of us of His blood². Being guilty of the body and blood of the Lord, not discerning the Lord's body³.

Thus the Catholic doctrine of the Eucharist, that the body and blood of Christ are verily and indeed taken and received by the faithful, who are strengthened, refreshed, and have grace imparted to them by the spiritual, mysterious, and real presence of Christ, which is equally removed from Popish Transubstantiation, the Consubstantiation of many of the Lutheran Reformers, and the Ultra Protestant views of many within the

pale of the Church, as well as of the followers of the innumerable sects of Zuingli-Calvinists, is calculated to constrain us to have a deeper gratitude, and a more fervent devotion, from the true consideration “of the innumerable benefits which by His precious bloodshedding He hath obtained to us.”

As relates to the other ordinances of the Church, most of which bear upon them the venerable stamp of antiquity, many of which are traced to the times of the Apostles themselves, such as the observance of the Nativity, the Circumcision, the Epiphany, the Purification, the Annunciation, Good Friday, Easter day, Ascension day, Whitsunday, Trinity Sunday; &c. the regard paid to the season of Lent, as a period of humiliation and self-examination, and to those days ordained to be observed in Commemoration of the

Apostles, the Baptist, the Evangelists, and the first Martyr; a respect to the ceremonies, of kneeling at the Eucharist, bowing at the name of Jesus, using the sign of the Cross in Baptism, &c. they will tend to keep alive holy, penitent, and devout tempers, and to increase the true spirit of piety, by statedly recalling each part of our Saviour's finished work for us, by bringing continually before us such noble examples of holy cheerful obedience, and through sensible signs affecting and influencing our consciences and hearts.

The writer of these observations, and of this little book of Prayers, is deeply impressed with the paramount importance of Christians possessing written forms of prayer, adapted for public and family worship, as the only means of conveying a simultaneous expression of

the feelings of their hearts, to the mercy-seat in Heaven, and of avoiding the irreverent mode of expression, the repetitions, incoherencies, and want of adaptation to circumstances so prevalent among those who pray or try to pray extempore. The same arguments which may be employed to point out the advantages of written forms for *public* and *family* worship, are to a great extent applicable to *private* prayer. Forms prevent our thoughts wandering from the true spirit of prayer in search of ideas, and expressions. By them we have the advantage of knowing that we shall not pray amiss through the rashness of our mouths, nor by our haste to utter any thing before God. And unanimity will for the most part be secured, in the public, family, and private worship of God.

Mr. Newman, whose piety, zeal, and

talents, are unquestionable, and whose Sermons ought to be in every private and family library, has admirably stated the propriety and advantage of private, as well as public *forms* of prayer, in *vol. i. serm. 20.*

And Mr. Boyd, of Londonderry, (whose book “On the Church,” containing a series of sermons, “On the character and privileges of the Church of Christ,” “Episcopacy,” “The lawfulness and expediency of forms of prayer,” and “The rites and ceremonies of the Church,” claims for him the thanks and esteem of all who wish to tread in the good old paths of primitive Christianity) has stated in a masterly manner the authorities for, and the advantages resulting from precomposed forms of prayer ¹.

The Author has founded these prayers on the doctrines contained in the ancient Liturgies and Litanies, and arranged them as far as he considers practicable according to the formularies of the primitive Church: he would not, however, so confine the persons using them, as to prevent their occasionally introdu-

and hostile attacks of the Ministers of the Presbyterian connexion, and of the several Dissenting sects in the city, upon the doctrines and constitution of the Church of England and Ireland. It is much to be regretted that the Author should have admitted and reasoned upon the admission, that Churchmen and Dissenters ought occasionally to sink those differences which would prevent their *uniting*, to extend the blessings of Christianity; this is not paying due honor to the *One Catholic Church*, nor duly esteeming the *One Catholic Doctrine*. The tendency to low Church principles in Ireland, is supposed to arise from the false impression that Episcopalians and Sectarians ought to meet on one common ground to repel the aggressions of Popery. Nothing can be more absurd, for the ground taken by the Episcopalian and the Dissenter must be totally different.

have an interest in Thy continuing
and unchangeable priesthood. O Hea-
venly Father, for the sake of Thy be-
loved Son, remember Thy universal
Church, and exalt it before men, that
they may look at it as the living wit-
ness to the truth as it is in Jesus ; and
graciously grant that its members hav-
ing been baptized into Christ, may put
on Christ, and may its ministers especially
() our Minister and () our Bishop

be faithful stewards of Thy holy mysteries.
 O Lord, relieve the distressed, comfort
 the afflicted, soften the hearts of the
 impenitent, and let the righteous go on
 their way rejoicing; and may all our
 dear relations, friends, and benefactors,
 * Introduce (especially*) unite with this
 individuals family in living to Christ,
 and their special cases. that thus we may find it gain
 to die, and be united to Father, Son,
 and Holy Spirit, One God, world with-
 out end. *Amen.*

Thanks= Almighty Lord, we give
 giving. Thee hearty thanks for our
 creation, for Thy kind providence, and
 for the revelation of Thy will, for Thy
 Church, sacraments, and ministers, for
 the Bible, and Thy ordained means of
 interpreting it according to the truth;
 we bless Thee for the succession of the
 seasons, and the fruits of the earth, for

another week added to our lives, for all the mercies we have received, and for all that we have done well throughout its course ; we thank Thee for our education, talents, and health, and for Thy care of our eternal interests : but above all we thank Thee for the revelation of eternal life, through our ascended Saviour, and for holiness imparted through His blessed Spirit. Lord be praised for these and all other blessings, through Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour. *Amen.*

A PRAYER

TO BE USED BEFORE PARTAKING OF
THE EUCHARIST.

(Compiled from the Ancient Liturgies.)

O LORD, our God, the bread that came down from Heaven, the life of the world, *we* have sinned against heaven, and before Thee, and *are* not worthy to partake of Thy immaculate mysteries: but, O merciful God, do Thou make *us* worthy of Thy grace, that kneeling at Thy sacred altar *we* may receive Thy holy body and precious blood, not to *our* condemnation, but for the remission of *our* sins, and eternal life. O teach *us* to perfect holiness in Thy fear; and unite all of us who receive this one bread, and one cup, in the communion

of one Holy Spirit, that having the testimony of a good conscience, and partaking of Thy body and blood worthily, we may have Christ dwelling in our hearts, and may continue the temples of Thy Holy Spirit, that with all those who have departed this life in Thy faith, and fear, we may inherit the kingdom prepared for us by Jesus Christ our Lord.
Amen.

NOTES.

THE Author strongly recommends the introduction of the Collects from the Book of Common Prayer, into these forms for private and family worship, to be used immediately before the Intercession ; those for Sundays to be repeated throughout the week : inde-

pendent of their adaptation to the states and circumstances of Christians at all times and seasons, and of their embodying a system of the purest divinity, they will vividly remind us of the persons and occasions to recal which they were wisely framed by our Church, and thus daily teach us a useful and improving lesson.

Wheresoever the words *Elect* or *Election* occur in these Prayers, they are to be understood as applied to all who have been baptized into Christ's Catholic Church.
