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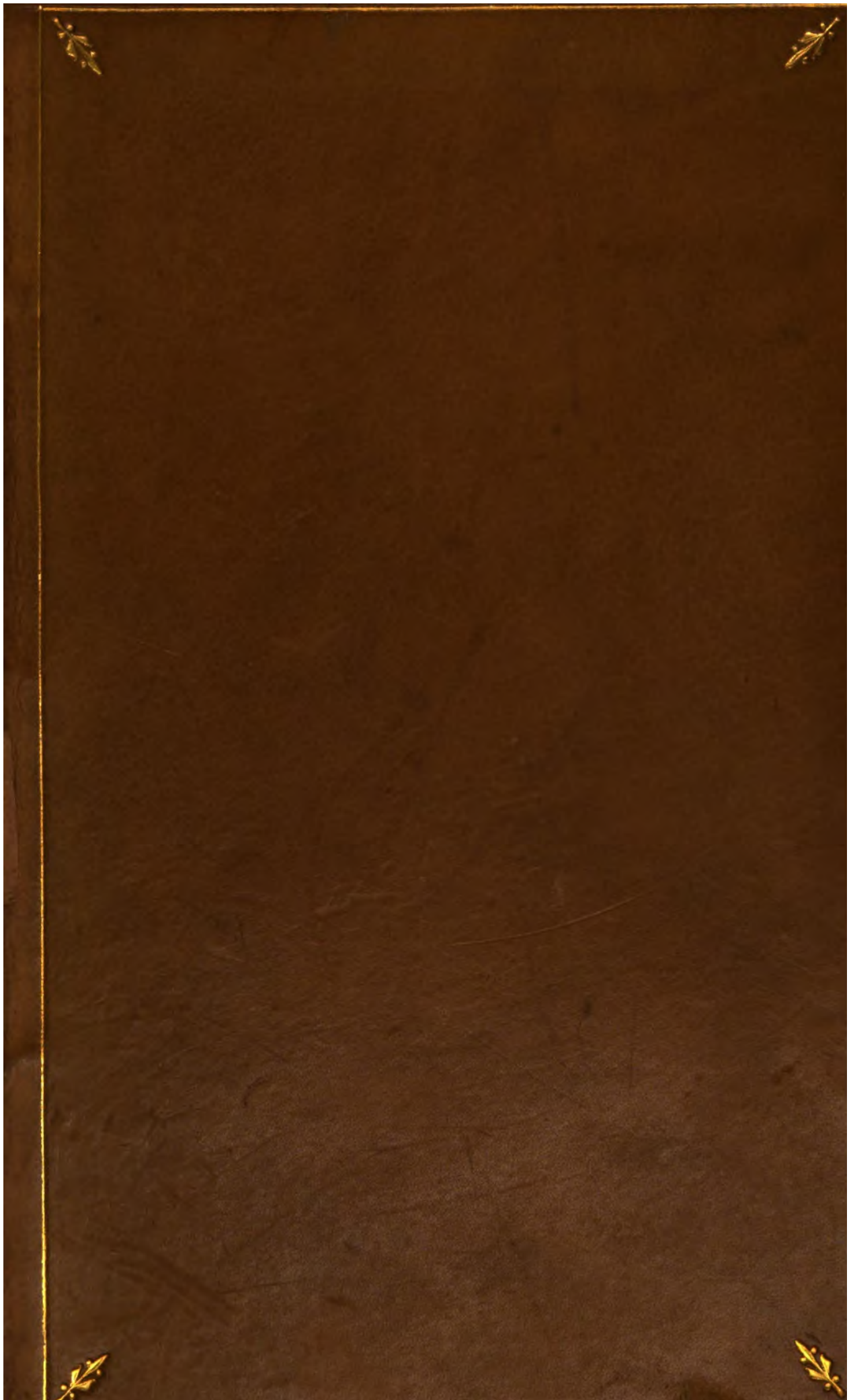
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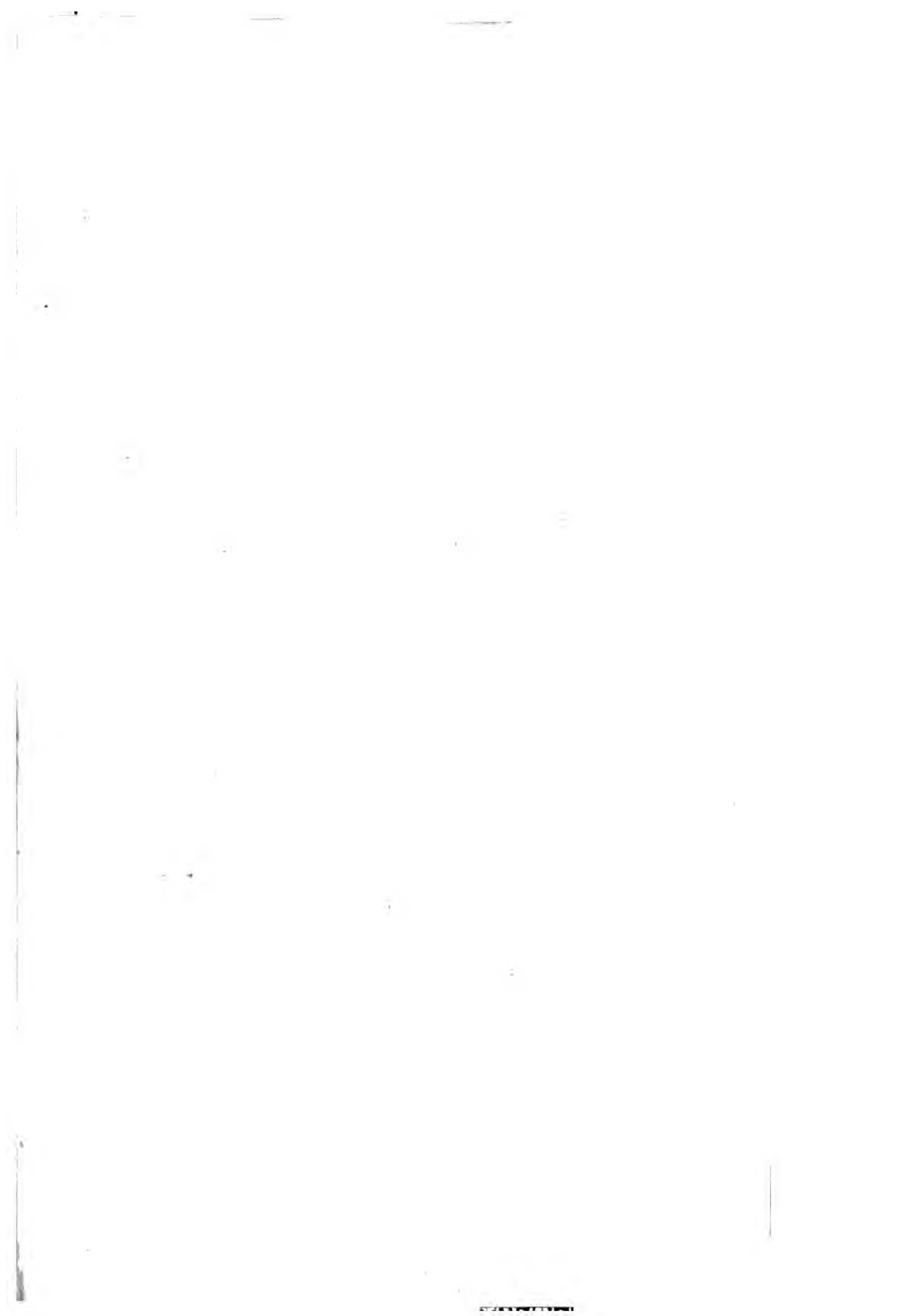

INTRODUCTION



Have omitted the Names of several Families descended from the Tribes, and other that bore Coat Armory within the said six Counties, by reason that it is impossible for me to have the paternal Descent of every Family, for though some have augmented their Estates, others perhaps of more Ancient Family by Division, and sub-division of gavel Kind, (or by some other means) have brought it almost to nothing, and some utterly extinguished, for I copied several Pedegrees out of old Manuscripts, that have been written above a 100 Years, expir'd without any Addition thereunto: Therefore it must needs be too difficult a Task for me to Recollect the Names of remote extant Families, for which neglect I'm dubious of being subject to the clamorous Censure of several Men.

The institution of Armes is not new, but very Ancient, derived almost from the beginning of the World, so their use was not limited to some few particular Nations, Kingdoms and Countries, but most largely spread all the World over, in so much as there is no Nation, Country or People, so savage or barbarous, but that they have their particular Signs, where-
by

by they may particularly and distinctly be known and discerned from others, as in Example. The Nations of the *Isralites* bore for their Ensigns the *Hebrew Letter Tau*, The *Scythians* a *Thunderbolt*, The *Egyptians* an *Ox*, The *Phrygians* a *Swine*, The *Thracians* *Mars*, The *Romans* an *Eagle*, The *Persians* a *Bow* and *Arrows*.

The Tokens which we call Arms became remunerations for Service, and were bestowed by Emperours, Kings and Princes, and their Generals, and their chief Commanders in the Field upon Marshal Men, whose valorous Merits required due Recompence of Honour answerable to their worthy Acts, the remembrance whereof could not better be preserved unto Posterity, then by these kinds of honourable Rewards,

The first we read of that made this use of them was *Alexander* the Great, being moved thereunto by the perswasion of *Aristotle* his Schoolmaster, who having observed his magnificent Mind in rewarding his Soldiers to the full of their Deserts, did at length prevail with him so much, as that he caused him to turn the current of his Bounty another way, and to recompence his Soldiers with these marks or tokens of Honour: Which he bestowed on them in hereditary Testimonies of their glorious Merits.

Arms were sometimes depicted or embroidered upon the Garments of Men, and chiefly upon the uppermost Vestures of military Persons, especially Emperours, Kings and their Generals, and other Commanders in military Services, used to cast over their Armour a kind of short Habit, as a Jacket, Mandylian or such like, where upon their Arms were richly beautified and curiously wrought

wrought, to the end, that in time of Service, their Soldiers who could not be directed by the Ear (by reason of far distance that were often times upon occasion between them and their Commander) there might by their Eye be instructed according to the necessity of the present Service, might by ocular observation of their Commander being so eminently clad) know and discern their fit times and opportunities of marching, making a stand, assailing, retiring and other their like Duties, whereupon that kind of short Garment was called a Coat Armour, because it was worn aloft upon their Armour,

late

late of *Ty'n y Bwlch*, *Charles Oliver* of *Tredderwen Drover*, *Lewis ap Lewis* late of *Coed y Clawdd* with most parts in *Mochnant uwch Rhaiadr*, *Pennant Melangell*, and *Cwm nant ffyllon*, with innumerable others elsewhere.

Evan ap Llewelyn ap Griffith ap Evan ap Ririd ap Howel ap Trahairn ap Cynfrig ap Pasgen ap Gwyn ap Griffith Lord of *Gildsfield* *ap Beli ap Selyf ap Brochwel ap Aedden ap Cyngen ap Elizabethau, ap Gwylawg ap Beli ap Mael Mynan* alias *Mynogion ap Selyf Sarff Cadau ap Conan Warryn ap Brochwel Ysgithrog*. The said *Evan ap Llewelyn* married *Margaret* Daughter and Heir to *Thomas Pursel*, descended from the Family of *De porcellis* who bore *Barri* ~~subito~~ *Argent and Gules* on a bend *Sable* three *Boars-heads* erased of the first, *Armed or tusked Or*, which Coat her Son and Posterity bore ever after.

Perhaps some will Question, why I give the Priority of all these succeeding Documents to *Brochwel Ysgithrog*, my Censure is because *Brochwel's* Coat Armour is the most primitive Coat now in use within the six Counties of *Northwales*. So 'tis possible it ought to have the precedency of others. One *Brochwel ap Aeddan* aforesaid, (which was about nine Descents after *Brochwel Ysgithrog*) had a particular Coat viz, parted per pale *Gules*, and *Or* two *Lions Rampart* and endorsed counter-chang'd of the Field, but all their Posterity (excepting the offspring of the forementioned *Evan ap Llewelyn*) gives the Coat of *Brochwel Ysgithrog* and the other of *Aeddans* came to be of no effect, but in all other Tribes the later Coat is observed.

This

This *Brochwel* is called of the Latine Writers *Brecinallus* and *Brochmaelus*, of whom it is thus written in *Historia diva monacella*.

Fuit olim in Powysia quidam Princeps illustrissimus nomine Brochwel Ysgithrog, consul Legecestriae, qui in urbe tunc temporis, Pengwern Powys, nunc vero Salopia dicta est, habitabat: cujus domicilium seu Habitaculum ibi Steterat, ubi collegium divi Ceddæ nunc situm est.

That is

There was sometimes in *Powys* a Noble Prince, named *Brochwel Ysgithrog* Consul or Earl of *Chester*, who dwelt in a Town then called *Pengwern Powys*, and now *Salop*, whose dwelling House was in the very same place where the Colledge of *St. Chadd* now standeth.

Owen Gwynedd Prince of *Northwales* and Sovereign of all *Wales*, for the Princes of *Southwales* and *Powys* were but Tributaries to the Princes of *Northwales*. *Owen Gwynedd* bore vert three Eagles displayed in Fess, Or descendants from *Owen Gwynedd* are *Lloyds* of *Rhiwodog* alias *Rhiwaedog*, *William Wynn* of *Clenenney*, whose Daughter and Heir called *Elinor*, married first *John Owens* Esq; Father to *Sir John Owens* of *Clenenney*, 2dly *Sir Francis Evers* Knight, *Robert Owen* of *Cefn y van* now called *Estym cegid*, whose Daughter and Heir called *Catherin*, married *Robert Wynn* of *Glyn in Ardudwy* Esq; *Wynn's* of *Gwudur*, *Sir John Wynn* of *Watstay* Baronet, *Wynns* of *Maes mochnant*, of *Bertbdu* and *Bodesgallon*, of *Cesel Gyfarch* and *Bodveddan* and *Conway*, *Lloyds* of *Havod Lwyfog*, *Annyls* of *Park*, *Hughes* of *Chwaen*.

One *Meredith ap Evan ap Meredith* Father to *John ap Meridith*, Ancestor to *Lloyds of Rhimedog, Clenneney* and several others, married *Margaret* Daughter and Heirs to *Einion ap Ithel* of *Rhimedog ap Gwrgenau Vaughan*, ap *Gwrgenau ap Madog ap Ririd Flaidd*, in which *Margaret* Daughter and Heir to *Einion ap Ithel* depends the Antiquity of *Rhimedogs* House.

One *Meredith ap Howel ap David ap Griffith*, ap *Cariadog ap Thomas ap Rhodri ap Owen Gwynedd*, the said *Meredith ap Howel*, (as it is evident by the extent of *Northwales*, made in the 26th Year of King *Edward* the Third) was the Heir of *Gwely Griffry*, the said *Meredith* had two Sons *Evan* and *Robert*, and a Daughter called *Marsti* married to *Jenkin Conway* of *Ruddlan*. The Families descended from *Evan ap Meredith* viz, *Rhimedog, Clenneney, Ystym cegid, Brynkyr, Park*, and several others, affirm *Evan ap Meredith* to be the elder Brother, which I find by all Books to be most probably, those that are the Posterity of *Robert ap Meredith* viz. *Gwudur Cesel Gyfarch, Hafod Lwyfog*, and several other Families have this Reason to think that *Robert* was the Elder Brother to wit, that the King's write is all at present, or was lately to be seen, directed to *Robert ap Meredith, Meredith ap Evan* and *Meredith* his Nephew, and the principal Gentleman in *Ewionydd*, for the Apprehension of *Evan ap Robin Herwr*, a notable Rebel and outlaw, and others of his Confederates, which write doth place *Robert ap Meredith* first before his Nephew *Meredith ap Evan ap Meredith*, which fortifies the opinion of them that maintain *Robert* to be elder than *Evan*, but howsoever it be, the Gavel kind
and

and the Custom of the Country not yeilding to the elder Brother any Prerogative or Superiority more then the Younger, and not a matter to stand upon.

Evan ap Meredith ap Howel afore said, married in his youthful Days, with *Leicki* Daughter to *Howel ap Meyrick* of *Nanney*, and begat by her only *Meredith ap Evan ap Meredith*, when in his Youth he matched with *Margaret* Daughter and Heir to *Einion ap Ithel* of *Rhivedog* afore said.

This *Einion ap Ithel* was Esquire to *John* of *Gaunt* Duke of *Lancaster*, to whom he gave Pension of 20 Marks, issuing out of his Mannour of *Halghton*, the Charter was to be seen in *French* with the Duke's Seal at Arms in the custody of *John Owen* of *Tstym cegid*, the Heir of *Owen ap John ap Meredith*.

The afore said *Meredith ap Evan* by the Daughter of *Einion ap Ithel*, had *John ap Meredith* and *Robert Abot* of *Enlli*, *Gwenbwyvar* married, to *Lewis ap Howel ap Llewelyn* of *Anglesey*, and *Catherin* married to *David Lloyd* of *Abertanad*, ap *Griffith ap Evan Vaughan*. The afore said, *John ap Meredith* married, and was at Man's Estate before his Grandfather's Brother, *Robert ap Meredith* married, for it is by tradition that the said *Robert Meredith* was near four score Years old before he married: And then in his dotage fancied and married *Angharad* Daughter to *David ap Llewelyn ap David* of *Gaven* walgoed in *Carn digan* Shire, whose Wife was the Daughter of *Rhydderch ap Evan Lloyd* of *Gogerthan*, and by her had *Evan ap Robert* Father to *Meredith ap Evan*.

Evan ap Robert of Gwudur, and three Daughters.

It is certain that in the Time of King *Henry* the fourth *Evan ap Meredith* having matched his Son as is afore said to *Einion ap Ithels* Daughter, who belonged to the House *Lancaster*, *Evan* held stedfastly to that House when *Owen Glyndwr* rebelled, so that in the time of that War the said *Evan ap Meredith* and *Hwlkin Lloyd* of *Glyn Lliron* had the Charge of *Caernarvon* Town, and an English Captain was on the Castle, in Revenge whereof *Owen Glyndwr* burned his two Houses, *Cefn y van* and *Cesl Gyfarch*, in the continuance of this War *Evan ap Meredith* Died at *Caernarvon* and was brought by Sea, (for the Passage by Land was shut up by *Owen's* Forces) to *Penmorva* his Parish Church to be Buried. *Robert ap Meredith* his Brother, taking the contrary side was out with *Owen* as may be gather'd by a Pardon granted him by King *Henry* the fourth, and by King *Henry* the fifth then Prince of *Wales*, which is (or was lately to be seen.

During *Robert ap Meredith's* Time, the inheritance descended to him, and his Brother *Evan* was not parted after the custom of the Country being *Gavel* kind, but *Evan* being married and enjoyed both Houses viz. *Cefn y Van*, and *Cesl Gyfarch*, neither was the Inheritance between their Posterity, divided until such time as *Evan* the Son of *Robert* was married, and had Children as may appear by Indentures between *Evan ap Robert*, and *John ap Meredith* Grandchildren to the other Brother *Evan*.

Griffith ap Conan Prince of North *Wales* Anno 1078 had by his Wife *Angharad* Daughter to

Owen

Owen ap Edwyn Prince of *Englefield*, *Owen Gwynedd* Prince of *North Wales*, *Cadwaladr* and *Cadwallon* who was slain before his Father's Death and several others. *Griffith ap Conan* Reigned fifteen Years, his troublesome Life and famous Acts were compiled by a most Famous and Ancient *Bard* of *Wales*, and found with the Posterity of the said *Griffith* in the House of *Gwudur* in *North Wales*, and at the request of *Morris Wynn* of *Gwudur* Esq; (who had the same in a most Ancient Book written and was lineally descended from him,) was Translated into Latine by *Nicolas Robinson* then Bishop of *Bangor*, and were extant *Anno 1651*,

Owen Gwynedd was Prince of *Norrh Wales* after his Father, and married first *Gwladus* Daughter to *Llowarch ap Trahayrn* Lord of *Dyved* alias *Demetia*, by whom he had only *Jerwerth Drwyndwn*, who was deposed of the principality by reason of the blemish upon his Nose, and forc'd to take Sanctuary at *Pennant Melangell*, where he Died and was inter'd, whose Tomb or Monument is to be seen to this very Day.

Owen Gwynedd, had by his second Wife *Christan* Daughter to *Grono ap Owen ap Edwyn David*, who succeeded him in the principality *Rhodri* Lord of *Anglesea*, and *Cadwallon*, *Abbot* of *Bardsey* and several others.

Rhodri Son to *Owen Gwynedd*, married the Daughter of *Gotherick* King of *Man*, *Anno 1243*, And *Rhodri* by the help of the said *Gotherick* invaded *Anglesey*, but within one Year thence expelled by the Sons of *Conan ap Owen Gwynedd* his Nephew who held the Isle to themselves.

Rhodri ap Owen Gwynedd lieth buried at the Colledge of *Caergybi* or Holyhead, and left Issue to survive him *Griffith, Thomas* and *Einion*.

The atorementioned *John ap Meredith* married *Gwenhwyvar* Daughter to *Grono ap Evan ap Einion* of the Tribe of *Collwyn ap Tangno*, by whom he had five Sons, and five Daughters, who all Survived their Father, excepting *Robert* who was slain near *Ruthyn* without Issue in this manner.

The *Thelwales* of *Ruthyn*, being Gentlemen that came there with the Lord *Gray* (to whom the King bestowed some part of the Vale of *Clwyd*, being at contention with a Kindred of that Country called the Family of *Griffith Goch ap Evan ap David Vaughan*, ap *David ap Ferwerth ap Comryd ap Cadvan*, those being more in Number then the *Thelwales*, although the *Thelwales* carried the whole Offices and Command under the Lords thereof, the Earl of *Kent* then Treasurer of *England*, advised the *Thelwales* to take the Castle of *Ruthyn* for their Defence, where they were besieged by the contrary side, until the Siege was raised by *John ap Meredith* Sons and Kindred, to whom the *Thelwales* sent for Aid, in that Exploit *Robert* the Son of *John ap Meredith* was slain with Arrow at *Coed Marhan*, in an Revenge thereof many of the other side were Slain then and after.

About the same time there happened some variance between *William Griffith* of *Penrhyn*, Chamberlain of North *Wales*, and *John ap Meredith*. Who both at that time bear chief Rule in the Country, the one by Reason of his Authority, that all should reverence and obey him, the

the other in regard of his Descent, and Kindred, and Ability in his Country, acknowledging none but his Prince his Superiour, hence grew the Debate (*nec Casar ferre majorem pompeius ve peram*) which continued long. To *John ap Meredith* his Kindred and Friends cleave stedfastly like couragious Men. So then it began to be a Proverb or Phrase, to call the Family of *Owen Gwynedd* (*Tylwyth John ap Meredith.*) This varience continued in their Posterity long after, till with Matches and continuance of Time it was wore out

This *John ap Meredith* was kin to *Owen Tudor* who had married *Queen Catherin*, Relict to *King Henry* the fifth; *Queen Catherin* being a Frenchwoman born, knew no difference between the *English* and the *Welsh* till her Marriage with *Owen Tudor*. Whose Kindred and Country being objected by some *English Men* of her Adherence, made her desirous to see some of her Kinsmen, but within short time after *Owen Tudor* and *Queen Catherin* were taken in some conflict (by Favourites to the House of *York*) and caried Prisoners to *Caerlleon* upon *Wysk* Castle in *Monmouth* shire, whereupon *Owen Tudor* sent for *John ap Meredith*, and *Howel ap Llewelyn ap Howel*, who brought with them a Hundred of *North Wales* Gentlemen and Kinsmen to *Owen Tudor*, Men of goodly Stature and Personage, but wholly destitute of the *English* or *French* Tongue, for when the *Queen* spoke to them in divers Languages, and they not able to answer her: She said they were the goodliest dumb Creatures that ever she saw, but at their return within a Mile or two from *Caerlleon* they were beset by Enemies,

(as it was thought) very near twice in Number, most part were the Castle Garison under the Command of one *Waring ddu* or black *Waring*, and others belonging to the House of *York*. But *John ap Meredith* made an Oration to comfort his Men, desiring them to remember at that time the honour and credit of their Ancestors, and concluding that it should never in time to come, be reputed, that there was the place where a Hundred of North *Wales* Gentlemen fled. But that the place should bear the Name, that there a Hundred of North *Wales* Gentlemen were slain. And for that his Kinsmen there, had brought with them all their Sons; others had but one Son to succeed in their Name and inheritance as *Howel ap Llewelyn* and others, he placed all these in the Rearward out of the fury of the Fight. Placing his own Sons in the Vawards with himself to lead, where he was sore wounded in the Face, whereof he was called *Esquire y graith* to his dying Day: But God gave his Enemies the overthrow, he opening the Passage with his own Sword.

Blethyn ap Cynvyn, Prince of North *Wales* and *Pwys Anno 1068*. Bore Or Lion Rampant Gules descendants from *Blethyn* were *Howel ap Evan ap Jerwerth* of *Glasgoed* Esquire, whose Daughter and one of his two Heirefs called *Marred*, Married *Howel ag Moris ap Evan ap Jerwerth*, stands the Antiquity of the House of *Glasgoed*. The other Daughter to *Howel ap Evan ap Jerwerth* called *Gwenhwyvar* was married to *Meredith Lloyd* of *Llwyn y Maen*, *Howel ap Evan ap Jerwerth ap Einion Gethin* of *Cynlleth ap Jerwerth*, ap *Cadwgan ap Rivid ap Rhiwallon ap Blethyn ap Cynfyn*, but by *Morris Evans* of *Llanvillings*

Llanvillings Book, Ririd ap Rhiwallon ap Blethyn ap Cynvyn, the which I take to be Erronious, for *Rhiwallon* should have been excluded. Other descendants from *Blethyn ap Cynvyn* (whose Predecessors bore no other Coat since) were Captain *John Lloyd* of *Plas uwch y voel* in *Rhiwlas*, *Thomas Rogers* of *Bergedyn*, *Prinalld* of new *Chapel*, *Henry Lloyd* of *Bryn*, and *Edward Lloyd* of *Gwyddelwern* Gentlemen.

There are more descended from some Branches of *Blethyn ap Cynvyn* who had particular Coats as *Griffith Maelor* Lord of *Bromfield* ap *Madog ap Meredith* ap *Blethyn ap Cynvyn*, *Einion Evell* Lord of *Cynlleth*, *Cynwrig Evell* Lord of *Eglwysseagle*, *Owen Brogentyn* Lord of *Edeirniion* and *Dinmael*, *Llewelyn Vaelgrwn* Lord of *Main* and *Ririd voel* of *Blodwel*, the Posterity of those Antecedent Families, bears their Coat to this very Day as shall be shewed hereafter.

Rhiwallon ap Cynvyn ap Blethyn bore Or Lion Rampart Gules Armed and langued Azure, on a Canton of the third, a dexter Hand coup'd at the wrist, Argent in precise middle, chief a cressant of the first for difference of a younger Brother, Descendants from *Rhiwallon ap Cynvyn* viz, *Edward Maurice* of *Henvache* Gentleman, *John Davies* of *Trewylan* Gentleman, *John Davies* of *Rhiwlas* Antiquary, *Richard Foulks*, *Humphrey Jones*, *Griffith Pugbe*, and *Edward Thomas* of the same Gentlemen. *Daniel Thomas* of *Havod y Garreg*, and *John Thomas* of *Bryn Eglwys* and several others. *Rhiwallon ap Cynvyn* was Brother to *Blethyn ap Cynvyn*, and jointly ruled the Principality which his Brother

Blethyn

Blethyn, during his Life as witnesseth *Doctor Powels Chronicle*, and several other Authors, *Rhiwallon* was slain at *Maes Mechain* in the Year 1068, fighting with *Itbel* and *Meredith* the Sons of *Griffith ap Llewelyn ap Seisyllt* commonly called *Griffith y Tywysog dewr*.

Mr. Moris Evans of *Llanvilling*, takes the Antecedent *Rhiwallon* to be the Son (and not the Brother) of *Blethyn ap Cynvyn* alledging that all the Sons of *Rhiwallon ap Cynvyn* were slain with him at *Maes Mechain* aforesaid, but all other Writers are of congruent Oppinion that *Rhiwallon ap Cynvyn* left four Sons, and two Daughters to survive him, viz. *Cariadog Griffith Milir*, and *Ririd*, *Gwladus* married to *Rees ap Tudur* or *Tewdwr mawr* Prince of South Wales, and *Jonet* married to *Ednyved ap Llowarch, Gam ap Lluthocca ap Tudur Trevor* but some nameless Author takes three of those Sons to be the Sons of *Rhiwallon ap Gwyn*, viz. *Cariadog, Griffith*, and *Milir*, but of *Ririd* (which was the Progenitor of the Antecedent Families) *Gwladus*, and *Jonet* he makes no dubious fuspicion.

It is evident by *Dr. Powels Chronicle*, that *Blethyn ap Cynvyn* left never a Son surviving him call'd *Rhiwallon*, but I find by most Books of Pedegrees, that *Blethyn* had a Son call'd *Rhiwallon* that Died before his Father without Issue.

Griffith Maelor Lord of both *Bromfields* and *Tal bore* Argent Lion Rampant Sable Armed and Langued Or.

I hope it will be no impediment to to the Reader to permit me to give a brief account of the Partition of *Powys Land*.

After

After the death of *Blethyn* ap *Cynfyn*, his Son *Meredith* ap *Blethyn* was disinherited of *NorthWales*, and become only Prince of *Powys*, neither was his Father but an Usurper to *NorthWales*; For the Right of Inheritance was then in *Conan*, the Son of *Edwal* ap *Meyrick* ap *Edwal Foel*, ap *Anarawd* Prince of *Northwales*, Eldest Son to *Roderick* the Great, for the mother of *Blethyn* ap *Cynvyn* (in whose Right he claimed the Principality) was *Angharad* Sole Daughter and Heir to *Meredith* ap *Owen* ap *Howel Dda* ap *Cadell* Prince of *Southwales*, second Son to *Roderick* the Great, neither had *Meredith* ap *Owen* any Right to *Southwales*, for that *Einion* ap *Owen* the father of *Tudur Mawr*, was Eldest Son of *Owen* ap *Howell Dda*. But the Right he had to *Powys*, was in *Angharad* Daughter and Heir to *Llewelyn* ap *Mervyn*, which *Mervyn* was third Son to *Roderick* the Great, to whom he had given the Principality of *Powys* which *Angharad* had married *Owen* ap *Howel Dda*, *Meredith* ap *Owen*'s Father, but the aforementioned *Angharad* Daughter to *Meredith* ap *Owen*. had been first married to *Llewelyn* ap *Seisyllt* before *Cynvyn* ap *Grwstan*, Father to *Blethyn* ap *Rhiwallon* ap *Cynvyn*.

Blethyn ap *Cynfyn*, married first to *Haer* Daughter and Heir to *Gillin* ap *y Blaidd Rhudd* Lord of *Gest* and *Evionvdd*, and had by her *Meredith* ap *Blethyn*, and several others, *Blethyn* married Secondly the daughter of *Griffri* ap *Carwed* by whom he had several Sons.

Meredith ap *Blethyn* Prince of *Powys*, married *Hunydd* daughter to *Eunydd* ap *Gwerngwy*
 C Lord

Lord of *Dyffryn Clwyd* and *Alington*, by whom he had several Sons; *Madog*, *Griffith*, *Howel* and *David* ap *Meredith*, and a Daughter called *Dyddgu* married to *Cadwalader* ap *Griffith* ap *Conan*.

Madog and *Griffith* the two Eldest Sons of *Meredith* ap *Bleddyn* divided *Powys* between them: *Madog* had for his part *Powys Vadog* viz both *Bromfields Tal*, *Hopdale*, *Edeirnion*, *Dinmael*, *Nantheudwy*, *Cynlleth*, *Mochnant*, *Ise Rhaiadr*, and *Mechain Ise Coed*, *Griffith* had for his part the other half of *Powys* called afterwards *Powys Gwenynwyn*, from *Gwenynwyn* Ion to *Owen Cyfeiliog*, ap *Griffith* ap *Meredith* viz *Poole*, *Teirtref*, *Deuddwr*, *Ystrad marchell*, *Swydd Llannerch Hudol*, *Caer-Enion*, *Mechain uwch coed*, *Mochnant uwch Rhaiadr*, *Plâs Dinas*, *Arwystl*, and *Cyveiliog*.

Meredith ap *Blethyn*, married secondly *Eva* daughter to *Blettrus* ap *Ednowain Bendew*, by whom he had *Ferwerth goch* ap *Meredith* who married *Mawd* daughter to *Roger de Manley*, of *Cheshire*, by whom he had a Son called *Sr. Griffith Vaughan* Kt. of the *Rhodes*, and Lord of *Crignon* and *Bergedyn* in the Parish of *Guilsfield*. This *Sr. Griffith Vaughan* was called in the *Brittish Tongue*, *Y Marchog gwyllt o gae Howel*, and was Ancestor to the *Kynastons* of *Hordley*, *Oteley* or *Watley*, of *Morton*, of *Bryngwyn*, of *Trewylan*, of *Llwyn y Mafsis*, of *Pant y Byrsley*; And all other *Kynastons* in the *Adjacent Counties*, with several others about *Kimmerley* and *Knockyn* and elsewhere.

But to return to *Madog* ap *Meredith* (who had that part of *Powys* as before is specified) he married *Susanna* daughter to *Griffith* ap *Conan*

Conan Prince of *Northwales*, and had by her several Sons between whom he parted his Estate, See *Dr. Powels Cronicle* Page 211.

Madog ap Meredith was Lord of *Oswestree* and built that Castle Anno 1148. And *Caer-enion* Castle Anno 1155, et obit 1160.

Griffith Maelor, Eldest Son to *Madog ap Meredith* held most part of his Fathers Inheritance excepting *Mechain Ise Goed*, which was Proportion of his brother *Owen*, and *Edeirnon* and *Dinmael*, was the Proportion of *Owen Brogentyn*.

Griffith Maelor married *Angharad* daughter to *Owen Gwynedd* Prince of *Northwales* and by her had a Son called *Madog ap Griffith Maelor* who held his Fathers Inheritance, and built the *Abbey of Vale Crusis*, in the Parish of *Llan Tyfilio* in *Yale*, commonly called in the *Brittish Tongue*, *Mynachlog Llan* or *Glyn Egwyftl* Anno 1200. *Madog ap Griffith Maelor* married *Gwladus* Daughter to *Ithel ap Rees ap Ivor ap Howel ap Morgan* of *Evas*, ap *Morgan bir*, ap *Jestyn ap Gwrgan* Prince of *Glamorgan* and by her had four Sons viz, *Griffith* Lord of *Dinas Bran*, *Meredith Howel* and *Madog, Vaughan*, who died all without Issue excepting *Griffith* Lord of *Dinas Bran*, who married *Emme* daughter to *James* Lord *Audeleigh*, who had for her Joynture that *Bromfield* which lay in *Flintshire*, and was from that time called *Maelor Saesneg*, because She was an English Woman, *Griffith* called Lord of *Dinas Bran* (because he lived in that Castle) had Issue by the said *Emme* Four Sons viz. *Madog Vaughan* who had both *Bromfields*, whose guardianship (being an Infant) was given by King *Edward*, the Second (Sir named *Caernarvon*) to *John* by some Books *William*) Earl Warren, who possessed all his

his Inheritance and built *Holt* Castle. The Second Son was *Llewelyn*, who had *Nantbeudwy*, whose tutorship was granted to *Roger Mortimer* third Son to *Roger Mortimer* Lord of *Wigmor*, Son to *Ralph Mortimer* of *Wigmor*, and *Gwladus Ddu*, Daughter to *Llewelyn ap Ierwerth Drwyndwn*. This *Roger Mortimer* possessed all his Lands and Rebuilt *Chirk* Castle in the Comote of *Nantbeudwy*, then called *Castle Crogen*, and the Infants were never heard of. The third Son to *Griffith* Lord of *Dinas Bran*, was *Griffith y Barwn Gwyn*, who had to his proportion *Yal* and *Glyndyfrdwy*, because he was bred and born in that Vale, for fear of being served as his Brothers were. The Fourth and youngest Son to *Griffith* Lord of *Dinas Bran* was *Owen*, who had one moiety of *Cynlleth* (called after his name *Cynlleth Owen*) while he was in Expectation of being a Bishop, because he was a good Scholar, but he died young before he was prefer'd, and that moiety of *Cynlleth* came to his Brother *Griffith y barwn Gwyn*, or the White Baron, who married *Margaret* Daughter to *Griffri* ap *Cadwgon*, and had Issue *Madog grupul* who held his Fathers Inheritance excepting *Yal* and married *Margaret* Daughter to *Rees Meredith* ap *Rees Grug* Son to Lord *Rees* ap *Griffiith* ap *Rees* ap *Tudur mawr*, and had Issue *Madog Vaughan* and *Margeret* married to *Griffith* ap *Owen* ap *Blethyn* ap *Owen Brogentyn*; *Madog Vaughan* held his Fathers Inheritance. and married *Gwenllian* Daughter to *Ithel Vaughan* of *Englefield*, ap *Ithel gam*, ap *Meredith* ap *Uchdryd*, ap *Edwyn*, and had Issue *Griffith* of *Rbudd* who held his Fathers Inheritance and married

married *Elizabeth* Daughter to Lord *Strang* of *Knockin*, and had Issue *Griffith Vaughan*, and *Isabel* married to *Grono ap Griffith* of *Penllyn* ap *Madog ap Jerwerth*, ap *Madog ap Ririd Flaidd*. *Griffith Vaughan* married *Elen* Daughter to *Thomas ap Llewelyn ap Owen* of *Southwales*, ap *Meredith* Son to Lord *Rees*, ap *Griffith ap Rees* ap *Tudur Mawr*, *Griffith Vaughan* had Issue by the said *Elen*. *Owen* Lord of *Glyndwfrdwy* and half *Cynlletb*, married *Margaret* Daughter to *Sr David Hanmer*. The second Son was *Tudur ap Griffith Vaughan*, who married *Maud* Daughter to *Evan ap Howel ap Evan*, ap *Adda ap Awr*, of *Trevor*, and by her had one Daughter and Heir call'd *Lowry* married to *Griffith ap Einion* of *Gwyddelwern* ap *Griffith ap Llewelyn ap Kynfrig ap Osborn Fitz-gerald*, *Griffith Vaughan*, had four Daughter viz. *Lowry* married to *Robert Puleston* of *Emeral* alias *Ember-hall Esq;*. *Morwydd* married to *Sr Richard Crofft*, *Isabel* married to *Adam* or *Adda ap Jerwerth ddu* of *Pengwern* in *Chirk land*, and one other married *David ap Ednyved gam*, ap *Jerwerth Voel*. *Owen* Lord of *Glyndyfrdwy* alias *Owen Glyndwr*, upon some Contention between him and the Lord *Gray* of *Ruthyn*, for a parcell of *Cammons* near a place called *y Croese*, which is upon the meer between the said two Lordships, After he had worsted the Lord *Gray*, he Joyn'd his Forces with *Henry Percy* Earl of *Northumberland*, and *Roger Mortimer* Earl of *March* Anno 1400. Who were then in Armes against King *Henry* the Fourth, who vanquished them in Battle at *Old field*, alias *Bull field*, now call'd *Battlefield* near *Shrewsbury*. and *Owen* forfeited

forfeited his Estate to the King, and left six Sons to survive him *viz.* *Griffith, Madog, Meredith, Evan or John, Thomas* and *David*, who as it seemes) fearing the punishment of the Law, did either abscond themselves, and deny their Descent, or Else went to some Forreign Countrey where they, nor any of their Posterity, were never known as farr as I can discern (though I have made diligent search and Inquisition therein) but that are Illegitimate descended from *Evan. Owen Glyndwr* had five daughters, as *Alice* married to *Sr John Skudamore* of *Staffordshire*. *Jane* married to *Henry Gray* of *Ruthyn*, *Jennet* married to *John Crofft*, and secondly to *Sr Richard Mannington*, *Myvanwy* married to *Llewelyn ap Adda ap David* of *Cam-belig*, ap *Jeva ap Adda*, ap *Awr* of *Trevor*, and *Margaret* married to *Phillip Price* of *Llanar-men in Yal*.

Dr. Powel Exclaimes against the Title of *Owen Glyndwr* to the Principality of *Northwales* in the time of King *Henry* the Fourth, alleadging that he was descended but from a younger brother of the House of *Powys*, the which no man can contradict but the only colour of title he could to the Principality of *NorthWales* (to my knowledg) was this. *Llewelyn ap Griffith* the last Prince of *Northwales* slain at *Buellt* in *Brecknockshire* Anno 1212. Left but two Daughters to survive him, the one was a Nun at *Shaftbury*, the other Daughter call'd *Katherin* married *Phillip ap Ivor* Lord of *Isy Coed*, whose Daughter and Heir call'd *Elinor Goch*, married *Thomas ap Llewelyn ap Owen* of *Southwales*, and *Ellen* Daughter to the said *Thomas ap Llewelyn* married

married *Griffith Vaughan* Father to *Owen glyn-dwr*, as before is specified.

Doctor *Powell's* Cronickle makes *Griffith ap Llewelyn ap Ierwerth drwyndwn* to be illegitimate, the which is most Erronious, for it is evident by several Authors, and Impartial Antiquaries, that *Llewelyn ap Ierwerth* was married first to *Tanglwst* Daughter to *Llowarch Goch* Lord of *Rhos, Rhyvoniog, and Anglesey*, Son to *Llowarch Howlwrch*, and begat by her *Griffith*, and *Gwladus Ddu* married to *Ralph Mortimer of Wigmore*, Secondly *Llewelyn ap Ierwerth* married *Joan* Daughter to King *John*, and by her had Issue *David*, who Succeeded him in the Principality, *Gwenllian, Angharad* and *Marred*; And the White Book of *Hergest*, a very fair and Ancient Manuscript verifies the same, viz, *Lewelinus Jervafij filius Princeps Wallie primo respondavit Tanglwst idem Lewelinus despondavit Joanem Filiam Llowarch Vaughan alias Goch de qua gennit Griffith et Gladus Ddu Uxorem Radulphi de Mortumari, post mortem dicte Tanglwst idem Lewelinus despondavit Joanam filiam Johannis Regis Anglia de qua gennit David Principem et Gwenlliant Uxorem Jo. Lacy Comitis Lincolnie, et Angharad primo desponsata Johanni de Brevis Domino de Brecon post cujus decessum desposata fuit Malgoni Vaughan ap Maelgon ap Rees et ex eadem uxore gennit filiam qua maritate est Johanni Scotico Comiti Cestrie qui fuit nepos Ranulphi Comitis Castrie ex parte sororis sui.*

Furthermore, one *David Benfras* in the Funeral Elegy of *Llewelyn ap Ierwerth*, gives his two Sons in general the names of Princes, and prefers

Griffith before *David*; Whereupon it may be Concluded that if *Griffith* had been a bastard, in all likelihood the Bard would not presume to prefer him before *David* being legitimate, neither had given him the Title of Prince, but that it was his Birth right. And *Polidar Virgil* in the Sixteenth Book of his History of *England* denoteth that *Griffith* was his Fathers lawfull heir, and that *David* was an Usurper of the Principality upheld by the King of Englands favour in these words. *Id temporis Lewelinus Walliæ Princeps E vita migravit deinde inter Griffinum et David filios Ejus de principatum est: quem ad ultimum David etsi minor natu favente Henrico assecutus est: and a little after multos Wallorum mimiserebat casus Griffini, qui per prodicionum a vita principatu fraudatus in carcere esset insedibatque in illorum animis tanti faoinoris memoria*

You heard how the Posterity of *Griffith Maelor* came to be Extinguished, I shall give you a brief Account how two Lordships of the other Moety of *Powys* (called *Powys Gwenynwyn*) remains in the Heir's generall to this day viz, the Lordship of *Plas Dinas* in the possession of *John Kynaston* of *Hordley Esq;*, and the Lordship of *Mowddwy* in *Richard Mytton* of *Hailston Esq;*'s Possession.

Griffith ap Meredith, second Son to *Meredith ap Blethyn* had the Moety of *Powys* as before is Exemplified, he married *Gwervil* Daughter to *Gwrgennau*, ap *Howel* Lord of *Keri* and *Cedwen*, ap *Jeva* ap *Cadwgan*, ap *Ethelystan Glodrudd*, and had by her *Owen Cyfeiliog*, *Kynvrig*, and *Ririd Voel* of *Blodwel*, *Owen Cyfeiliog* held his

his Fathers Inheritance, and builded the Abbey of *Ystrad Marchell*, he married *Gwenllian* Daughter to *Owen Gwynedd* Prince of *Northwales*, and had by her a Son called *Gwenynwyn*, who held his Fathers Inheritance, excepting *Llanerch Hudol* and *Bronjarth*, which was given to *Ma eleri* base Son to *Owen Cyveiliog*, *Gwenynwyn* Lord of *Powys*, *Gwenynwyn* married *Margaret* daughter to Lord *Rees ap Griffith ap Rees* and had by her a Son called *Griffith ap Gwenynwyn* Lord of *Powys* who married *Margaret* daughter to *Sr. Howel y Pedole*, Son to *Griffith ap Meredith ap Methusalem ap Hwua*, ap *Cynddelw*, by whom he had six Sons, viz, *Owen*, *Llewelyn*, *John*, *William*, *Griffith Vaughan* and *David*, between whom he Parted his Estate,

Owen the Eldest Son married *Hawys* Daughter to *Phillip Corbat* of *Course*. by whom he had the Lorship of *Tal y Bont*, and by her had one Daughter called *Hawys gadarn*, who held her Fathers Estate; and married *John Charlton* of *Appley* in the County of *Salop*, but her Uncles *Llewelyn* *John*, *Griffith Vaughan* and *David* contested with her, aleadging that it was Contrary to the Lawes and Custom of *Wales* that any Daughter should inherit any Lands therein, but the said *John Charlton* being a favourite to King *Edward* the first by whose assistance the Uncles were discomfited and *Llewelyn*, *John*, and *David* taken Captives and imprisoned at *Harddlech* Castle where the King kept an English Garison, but *Griffith Vaughan* held the Rebellion against his Neece, until the King sent his letter Patent to *Roger Mortimer* Lord of *Chirk Land*, and to the Sherif of *Shropshire*

Shropshire to apprehend the said *Griffith Vaughan* whereupon *Griffith*, and his Brethren Submitted to the Kings Pleasure, and desired him to make a final conclusion between them, and their Neece. The King haveing a fervent desire to shew *Charlton* a kindness (contrary to all Equity) gave his Arbitrement, that *Hawys* should have her Fathers Estate and her Issue Sons and Daughters, and that her Uncles should have their Proportion, and their Issue male, then but for want of such Issue male, to *Hawys*, and her heires general for ever. But *William* commonly called *Wilcock Mowddwy*, Fourth Son to *Griffith* ap *Gwenynnyn*, did not molest his Neece for her Inheritance, so the Lorship of *Mowddwy* (which was his proportion was granted to him and his heires general both Sons and Daughters for ever, but the Issue male of the other four Uncles, were extinguished either in them or in their Sons, So their Proportion came to *Hawys* and her Husband, by whom she had a Son called *John Charlton Lord Powys* in his mothers Right, who married *Elizabeth* Daughter to *Henry Percy* Earle of *Northumberland*, and had Issue *John Charlton Lord Powys*, who married *Mawd* Daughter to *Roger Mortimer* Earl of *March*, and by her had Issue *John Charlton Lord Powys*, who died without Issue, and *Edward Charlton Lord Powys*, who married *Elinor* Daughter to *Thomas Holland* Earl of *Kent*, and Relict to *Roger Mortimer* Earl of *March*, and had Issue two Daughters, between whom he parted his Estate, *Jane* the Eldest Daughter had to her proportion *Caer Einion*, *Mechain*, *uwch coed*, *Mochnant uwch Rhaiadr*, and *Plas y Dinas* and married

married Sr, *John Gray* Knight, and by him had a Son called *Henry Gray* Lord *Powys*: The second Daughter to *Edward Charlton*, was *Joyce* whose proportion was *Arwyfily* and *Cyveiliog*, for the remaining part was Joynture to *Elizabeth* Daughter to Sr *John Barkley*, Second wife to *Edward Charlton*, the aforesaid *Joyce* second Daughter to *Edward Charlton* married *John* Lord *Typtost*. Sr. *Henry Gray* (Son to Sr. *John Gray* and *Jane* Eldest Daughter to *Edward Charlton*) was Lord *Powys* in his mothers Right, and afterwards Created Earl of *Tankerville*, he married *Antigon* base Daughter to *Humphrey* Duke of *Gloucester*, Son to *Henry* the Fourth of *England*, and had Issue Sr *Richard Gray* Lord *Powys*, and *Humphrey Gray* and *Elizabeth* married first to *Richard* Lord *Strang* of *Knockin*; and Secondly to Sr *Roger Kynaston* of *Hordley*, by whom he had Sr. *Thomas Kynaston* Kt. of the *Rhodes*, who died without Legitimate Issue, *Humphrey Kynaston* the Wild Esq; who married *Elizabeth* Daughter to *Meredith* ap *Howel* ap *Moris* of *Glasgoed* and Seven Daughters,

It is Evident by the Poetry of *Gutto'r Glyn*, to Sr *Roger Kynaston*, that he had a Title to the Lordship of *Powys*. viz.

Ystiwart Powys dawel, A dau naw fwydd dan eifel.

And likewise the Poetry of *John Ceri* to *Humphrey Kynaston* the wild

Nad ti ath lwyth etto ith Law,

I wlad Powys ledpeiaw.

And the Poetry of *Rees Cain* to *Roger Kynaston* Esquire, Son to *Edward Kynaston*, Son to *Humphrey Kynaston* the Wild, Son to Sr *Roger Kynaston*

Kynaston of Hordley.

*Pen wyt ar Wyr pont yr jaith,
 Pwys di lwfr Powys dalaitb,
 Ti iw'r gwreiddiawl teg roddlawn,
 Twysog y Wlad tai saig lawn,
 Ti iw'r Aer or Târ w eurwych,

But whether the Lorship of *Plas y Dinas*, came to the Family of the *Kynastons* by the marriage of the said *Elizabeth* Daughter to the said *Sr. Henry Gray* with *Sr Roger Kynaston*. I cannot satisfy the Reader, But however, it remains an Inheritance belonging to the House of *Hordley* to this Day.

William alias *Wilcock* Lord *Mowddwy*, married *Margaret* Daughter to *Thomas ap Llewelyn ap Owen* and had Issue, *John* Lord *Mowddwy*, who married *Jane* Daughter to *Sr Thomas Corbet ap Thomas Corbet Ar. ap Robert Corbet. ap Sr John Corbet* Knight of the Sepulcher, and Lord of *Wattleborough* and had Issue *Fouk* who died without Issue and *Elizabeth* the Sole Daughter and Heir, who married *Sr Hugh Borrough* and had by him a Son called *Sr John Borrough*, who married *Jane* Daughter to *Sr William Clifton of Gloucestershire* and by her had four Daughters

Daughters, which Coheirs viz. *Angharad* married *John Leighton* of *Stretton*, *Elizabeth* married *Thomas Newport*, *Isabel* married *John Lyngen*, and *Elinor* married *Thomas Mytton* of *Hailston* Esq; the said *Elinor* had by partition the Lordship of *Mowddwy*, the which Lordship Remaines some part of *Myttons* of the *Hailstons* Estate to this Day.

The *Kynastons* Coat were formerly, Argent, Lion Rampant; Sable, I Observe that some Gentlemen have altered their Paternal Coats, and taken some Colateral Coats, which they deemed to be more commendable, the which they may assume not, being interrupted by the Herald.

Owon Brogentyn Lord of *Edeirnion* and *Dinmael* son to *Madog ap Meredith* by the Daughter of the *Maer du* of *Rhus* in the Lordship of *Whittington*, bore Argent, Lion Rampant Sabl, Descendants from *Owen Brogentyn Madog ap Elizau* of *Crynjartb*, ap *Ferwerth* ap *Owen Brogentyn*, whose Daughters and Heireses married as followeth.

Gwenhwyvar married *Grono Lloyd* Sirnamed *y Penwyn* of *Meley*, *Myvanwy* married *Evan Vaughan* alias *y Crach* of *Llanwddyn*, *Meli* married *Llewelyn ap Madog*, Nest second Wife to *Evan Voelvrych*, *Margaret* married *Itbel* ap *Gwrgenau Vaughan* of *Rhivedog*, *Eva* married *Griffith ap Llewelyn ap Cynvrig* ap *Osborn Fitzgerald* Earl of *Desmond* in *Ireland*. And *Angharad* married *Madog ap Griffith Virgoch* of *Neuodd Wen* in *Llan Ervil* Parish, and mother to *Llewelyn ap Madog* of *Vaerdre*. More descendants from *Owen Brogentyn* were *David* ap *Gwyn Lloyd* of *Hendwr*, whose Eldest Daughter and

and one of his three Heirefes called *Angharad* married *Evan ap Einion ap Griffith ap Llewelyn, ap Kynvrig*, *Margaret* married *Moris ap Evan Gethin* of *Gartheryr*, and *Leiki* married to *Evan Griffith* of *Bersham*. *Madog* of *Hendwr* Son to *Ferwerth ap Madog ap Griffith ap Owen Brogentyn*, had a particular Coat viz. Argent on a Cheveron, Gules three Flowes de lucis Or: This *Madog* of *Hendwr* was great Grandfather to *David ap Giwn Lloyd*, but I cannot tell whether the Posterity of the said *Madog* gives the aforementioned Coate or the Coate of *Owen Brogentyn*. More Descendants from *Owen* were *Evan ap Howell ap Rees* of *Rug*, whose Daughter and Heir called *Margaret* married *Piers Salusbury* of *Bachynbyd Esq*; *Ellis ap Howel*, ap *Rees* his brother whose Daughter and Heir called *Margaret*, married *Howel Vaughan* of *Glan y Llynn*, ap *David Lloyd*. *Maesmors* of *Maesmors*, *Hugh Hughes* of *Gwerk-las Esq*; *Wynns* of *Plas Issa* in *Edeirnion*, of *Pentre Morgan* in *Shropshire*, and of *Gwnodl*, *Lloyds* of *Dol y Glesyn*, *Ellis ap Owen* of *Branes Issa*, whose Daughter and Heir called *Jane*, married *Richard Thelwal*, Fourth Son to *Simon Thelwal* of *Plas y Ward Esq*; *Richard Thelwal* had but one Son, who dying without Issue, left *Branes Issa* to his Cousin *Simon Thelwal* of *Plas y Ward*, *Vaughans* of *Plas Newydd* in *Dudleston*, and *Street y Ddinas*, *Evan ap Thomas* ap *Evan* of *Rheol*, *Thomas ap Evan ap David* of *Llandrillo*, *Howel Vaughan ap Griffith ap Giwn Lloyd*, whose Daughter and Heir to *Howel Vaughan* called *Katherine* married *Richard ap Jolyn*, who sold her Lands to *John ap Ellis ap Eyton* of *Rhiwfabon*

Rhiwfabon, Llewelyn ap Griffith ap Evan, ap Gwyn Lloyd, whose Daughter and Heir called *Agnes* (but by some Books *Genery*) who married *Evan ap Evan ap y Coch*, of *Garthgarmon* by whom she had a Son called *Thomas*, part of whose Lands went to the Hands of *Elizau*, ap *Owen ap John ap Owen*, and several others which for brevity sake I shall omit.

I have seen in one Book the Pedegrees of *Humphrey Branes* of *Branes Ucha*, and *Lloyds* of *Crogen* (and several other Branches from those two Houses) Lineally Descended from one *Llewelyn ddu* (in the race of *Gweklcs*) Descended from *Owen Brogentyn*, but in all other Books I found it Descended from *Llewelyn ddu*, ap *Griffith ap Ferwerth Voel*, ap *Ferwerth Vaughan*, *Ferwerth* hen ap *Owen ap Blethyn*, ap *Tudur ap Rees Sais*. And I find likewise that the mother of *Llewelyn ddu*, ap *Griffith ap Ferwerth Voel*, was *Gwervil* Daughter to *Llewelyn Vaughan*, ap *Owen ap Madog*, ap *Owen Vaughan ap Blethyn ap Owen Brogentyn*. *Llewelyn ddu*, was Lord of *Uwch Alwen*, and his Posterial Heirs kept a Court at a place called *Cynwyd*, until the time of *Morgan Branes*, and to the memory of several persons in my time. I find also in the same Book (before mentioned) the Pedegree of *David Lloyd* of *Hendwr* and *Tyvas Esq;*. Descended from *Evan ap Gwyn Lloyd*, and so to *Owen Brogentyn*.

But in all other Books I found it derived from the Tribe of *Ririd Vlaidd*, I have not seen such variety, as I find in these two last Pedegrees in any other Antiquity, But I found most to be of Congruent Opinion, But which is most
 Eroneous

Froneous, is beyond my Capacity infallibly to discern. But I find it by most Authentick Authors, that the Houses of *Branes Ucha* and *Crogen*, are Descended from *Llewelyn ddu* ap *Ferwerth Voel*, and so to *Tudur Trevor*. But if the said *Llewelyn ddu* was the Son of *David* ap *Griffith* ap *Ferwerth* ap *Owen Brogentyn* (as the Paternal line of *Gwerkles*) then his Posterity is to beare the Coat of *Owen Brogentyn*, But if the said *Llewelyn ddu* was the Son of *Griffith* ap *Ferwerth Voel*, then the Coat of *Tudur Trevor*. There are Descended from *Llewelyn ddu*, *Humphrey Branés* who sold *Branés Ucha* to *William Wynne* of *Garthgynan* Esq; *Lloyds* of *Crogen* *John Foulkes* of *Cilan* Gent. whose Eldest Daughter called *Margaret* married *Edward Smallmon* Son to *John Smalmon* of *Wildertop* near *Wenlock* Esq; *Susan* married to *Peter Meyrick* Son to *Rowland Meyrick*, Son to *Peter Meyrick* of *Ucheldre* Esq; and *Ellen Foulks* Heires of *Cilan*, married *Gabriel Jones*, and *Mary* Daughter and Heir to the said *Gabriel*, and *Ellin* married *John Lloyd* of *Bryn Lluarth* Esq; *Moris* ap *John* ap *Ellis* of *Paley* Gent. whose Daughter and Heir called *Margaret* married *Evan Lloyd* Jeffrey Gentleman and Poet. and *Robert Thomas* of *Llanddervel* Gent.

Einion Evell Son to *Madog* ap *Meredith* by *Eva* Daughter to *Madog* ap *Urien* of *Plas* in *Maengwynedd*, holding *Cynlleth* and some part of the Lordship of *Oswestree* of his Brother *Griffith maelor* (was Baron of *Cynlleth*) He Bore Parted per Fefs Sable and Argent, Lion Rampant Counterchanged of the Field, Armed Langued Gules. Descended from *Einion Evell*,

Edwards of Great-Ness, John Edward ap Thomas of Rhiwlas, whose Daughter and Heir called Jonet, married Robert ap Evan of Glanbavon, John Thomas of Goedtre, whose Daughter and Heir called Lowry married first Griffith Owen of Main, Secondly Richard Wynne of Plas Newydd, Thomas Edwards of Lledrod, whose Daughter and Heir called Lowry married Richard Trevor of Treflech gent. Thomas Hughes of Llan-Armon, Thomas Edwards of Pant-Glas Ucha, whose Daughter and Heir called Margaret, married richard Prinallt of Lloran. Maurice Lewis of Pant glas Issa whose Daughter and Heir called Elizabeth married Hugh Jones of Plas in Dol, Thomas ap Hugh Maurice of Lloran, Edward Williams of Maes Mochnant Ucha, whose Daughter and Heir called Hannab married Henry Jones of Cae pant, Robert Daniel of Cefn yr Odva, Dr Samuel Davies Son to Nicholas Davies of Pentre'r Cned, Hugh Maurice ap Llewelyn of Cefnhir Issa, David Lloyd ap Thomas ap Maurice ap Llewelyn of Tre Brys, whose Daughter and Heir called Elizabeth married Henry Kyffin Second Son to William Kyffin of Bodvach Esq; Tanads of Trefwylan, Tredderwern, and Broxen Robert Davies of Pentre'r gaer, Edward ap Thomas of Llangadwaladr, Hugh Maurice of Cwm-bowty, and Thomas Hughes of Pentre bach gentlemen and innumerable more.

It is Evident that the Princes of Powys(because they bordered upon England) were more Subject to the incursion of the English then the remaining part of Northwales, and though the Prin-

ces and Lords of Powys were homagers and Tributaries to the princes of *Aberfraw* or *Northwales*, (who had the Superiority by the Lawes of *Howell Dda*) yet the Princes and Lords of Powys (compelled by the rigorous dealing of the English) Several times broak their alleagiance to the Princes of *Northwales*, and tooke the contrary part with the Kings of England. And because the confines of any Countrey, signifies in the Brittish Tongue *Cyffiniau gwlad*, Those that were under the Subjection of the Princes of *Northwales*, called those parts bordering upon England *Cyffiniau*, and the Inhabitants generally *Cyffiniaid*, of whose fidelity (in time of any invation) they were alwayes dubious. But *Madog Goch* who was the Fourth Descent after *Einion Ewell* had a Son called also *Madog*, who was put to a Nurse in a place called *Tre Gyffin* near *Pont y Llogel* in *Mountgomeryshire*; And to distinguish him from his Father which was *Madog Goch*, he was called *Madog of Kyffin*, Since whom none but some of his Progeny Beares the Name of *Kyffin*; and from whom all the antecedent families descended from *Finion Ewell* bringes their extraction excepting *Jeva Vaughan* of *Llwyn y Maen*, who was younger brother to *Madog Goch*.

We have it by several Authors that *Llwyn y Maen* was the Mansion House of *Einion Ewell*, and that *Jeva ap Cybelyn, ap Rhun ap Finion Ewell*, who was his great grandchild, made the first Partition of his Estate viz. *Lloran Ucha* with its appurtenances to *Madog Goch*, and *Llwyn y Maen, Llanvorda*, and other several Lands to *Jeva Vaughan*. It was a Vulgar custom in the time of *Gaul Kind* that the younger brother should have the Original House, as may take obser-

vation in these two last mentioned Brethren, but the House of Lloran, was rebuilt in their grandfathers time Anno 1230. As we find by the Poetry of a Learned Bard or Poet in those Dayes viz.

Descended from *Kynvrig Davises* of *Gwasane* and *Lleweny Vechan*, or *Llanerch*, *Wynnes* of *Tower moel*, *Eytons* of *Leeswood*, *Parrys* of *Pwllhalog*, *Davies* of *Eglwys-eagle*, *Mathusalem Jones* late of *Myvod* drover, *Griffiths* of *Gwasane*, *Williams* and *Davies* of *Arddynwynt*.

Rees ap Tewdwr or *Tudur mawr* Prince of *Southwales*, Son to *Einion ap Owen ap Howell Dda ap Cadell*, ap *Roderick the Great*, *Rees ap Tudur* Bore Gules Lion Rampant, within a bordur e Indented Or. Descended from *Rees*, *Wynnes* of *Dole Bachog*; *Fenkin Owen* of *Cefnbasod*, *Lloyds* of *Plas uwch Clawdd* in *Rhiwfabor*
Evans

Evans of Tregastell and Jones of Hain.

Alo ap **Rhwallon** of **Powys**, bore Or Three Lions heads Erased, Gardant eules within a bordure ingrailed Azure, Descendants from **Alo**, **Edward Price** of **Eghoyseagle**, whose Daughter and Heir called **Elizabeth** married **Thomas Maurice** of **Tan Llwyn bron Dinas**, and afterwards of **Trevedryd Esq**; **Mr Thomas Price** of **Llanvilling** Antiquary, **Morgans** of **Plas canol** in **Arddidwy** and **Jones** of **Castle** Parish.

Jestyn ap **Gwrgant** Prince of **Glamorgan**, bore eules three Cheverons Argent, **Newtons** of **Haethley**, **Joneses** of **Dol** in **Edeurnion** and of **Dol y Moch**.

Ethelystan Glodrudd Prince of **Ferlis**, that is all the Lands between **Severn** and **Wye**, bore Gules Lion Rampant, Regardant, Or Descendants from him **Adam Price** of **Bodvach** and **Llanmeli Esq**; **Prices** of **Newton** of **Penarth** and **Vaenor** of **Llanbister** and **Park**, **Mathewses** of **Blodwel**, **Owenses** of **Rhwsaeson**, **Powell** of **Worthbyn** and **Ednop**, **Vaughans** of **Pant y Garreg**, **Clyns** of **Clynn**.

Braint hir Tribe of **Uwch Aled** bore Vert, Cross Flowry Or, Descended from **Braint hir Vaughans** of **Pont y Gwyddyl**, **Braint Hir** lived about the year 650. and in the time of **Cadwallo**, whose Nephew and Councillor he was, and one of the Fifteen Tribes of **Northwales**.

Cilmin Troed-ddu, of **Glynllifon** in **uwch gwir** **vai**, in **Caer yn Arvonshire**, bore Argent, an Eagl display'd with two Necks Sable, Secondly Argent, Four fiery rugged Stukes, Gules the third as the Second, and the Fourth as the first over all upon an inescocheon; Argent, a **Mans**

Leg Couped aliquis Sable, Descended from Cil-
 min, Glynn of Glyn Llwyn, Cilmin Treed adu,
 lived about the year 843, in the, time of Rod-
 orick the great, and his Father Mervyn Vrych,
 with whom he came out of the North of Brit-
 tain, and was his Brothers Son called Cadrod
 ap Gwrydr ap Eliar ap Santhey.
 Marchweithian Lord and Tribe of Ise Aled
 in Denbighland, and owner of Carwed Fynydd,
 Dincadvael and other Lands within the Hun-
 dred of Ise Aled. as appears by the extent of
 the Lordship of Denbigh Anno 80. Edward the
 third, he bore Gules, Lion Rampant Argent ar-
 med and Langued, Azure, he lived about the
 year 720. His Court is said to be at Llys Lle-

All Descended from *Rees ap Meredith* of *Hiraethog* (as we have it by Tradition) standard Bearer to King *Henry* the Seventh at *Bojsworth* field, after *Sr William Brandon* was slain. *Rees ap Meredith* lies at *Spytty*, Pictur'd in Armour; Because there are so many Descendants from the Issue male of *Rees ap Meredith*. I thought it Convenient to make mention of his Daughters and marriages viz, *Eva* married *David ap Gwilym* of *Llwydiarth* in *Anglesey*, Secondly to *Meredith ap Thomas* of *Anglesey*. *Gwenhwyfar* married first to *David ap Howell ap Griffith ap Jenkin* brother to *Howell Vaughan ap Howell ap Griffith ap Jenkin* of *Llwydiarth* in *Powys*, Secondly to *Tudur Vaughan ap Tudur ap Griffith ap Einion* of *Edeirnion*, *Margaret* married to *Griffith ap Llewelyn Vaughan* of *Yal*. *Annes* Second wife to *David ap Meredith* of *Bala*. *Catherin* married first to *John ap William ap Maurice ap Evan Gethin* of *Garth Eryr*, Secondly to *John ap Jenkin ap Rees* of *Llanddervel*, ap *Howel ap Tudur*, and *Elizabeth* married to *Ellis ap Howell ap Rees*, Brother to *Evan ap Howell ap Rees* of *Rug*.

More Descendants from *Marchweithian* were *Parrys* of *Twysog*, *Tudur ap Robert* of *Berrain*, whose Daughter and Heir called *Katherine* married first *John Salisbury* of *Lleweney Esq*; Secondly *Richard Clough* of *Denbigh*. Thirdly *Maurice Wynne* of *Gwydur Esquire*. And fourthly *Edward Thelwal* of *Plas y Ward Esquire*, *John Saunders* of *Abimbury* whose Daughter and Heir called *Johnet*, married *Gabriel Good*.

Goodman, and Mary Daughter and Heir to Gabriel Goodman and Jonnet married Owen Salisbury of Rug Esq; John Kadwalader of Gallt y Celyn, Daughter, and Heir called Margaret married John Edwards of Hendre Brys in Spytty, Wynns of Havod y Maidd, and Llanganbaval David Davies of Llathwryd, Lloyds of Comb. Williams of Llanstyndwy, Foulks of Llys Llywarch, and many more.

Collwyn ap Tangno, but by Lewis Duns book Collwyn ap Cellan ap Tangno, Lord of Evionydd, some part of Llyn and Ardudwy, in Merionydd shire, he bore Sable, a Chevron inter three Flower de Lucis, Argent, his dwelling is said to be at Bronwens Tower, after called from him Caer Collwyn, now Haddlech, There are Descended from Collwyn, Bodvels of Bodvel, Wynnes of Pennardd, Lloyds of Dol y Penrhyn Rhydderchs of Tregaenan, and Vaughans of Plas hen.

Marchudd Lord of Umch Dulas and Abergeley whose Seat was at Llys Bryn Ffenigl, he bore Gules, a Saracens head Erased at the neck Argent Environed about the Temples with a wreath of Or, and Argent, but by Gwilims Argent and Sable. Descendants from Marchudd viz, Wynnes of Dyffryn Aled and Trovertb Foulkes of Erived, Jones and Ellis of Gwernfield Lloyds of Mould and Roberts of Gwasane

One Grono Lloyd Sir named y Penwyn of Meley was about ten Descents after Marchudd he bore for his Coat Armour, Gules three Boars heads in Pale wise, Erased Argent, Descended from Grono Lloyd, or the Penwyn viz, Wynnes of Meley and Lloyds of Plas Madog

in *Llanfanan*.

Ednyfed Vaughan Lord of *Abergeley*, and Baron of *Bryn Ffenigl* bore Gules a Cheveron inter three Englishmens heads Couped Argent, The Posterity of *Ednyfed Vaughan* viz. King *Henry the Eight*. *Owens* of *Pennynydd*. *Williamses* of *Cochwillan*, of *Estym Colwyn*, of *Vaenol*. of *Marl*, of *Meillionydd*, of *Weeg*, *Edward Griffithes* Eldest Son to *Sr William Griffiths* of *Penrhyn*, whose daughters and Coheiresses married as followeth. *Jane* married to *William Herbert* of *St Julian*, ap *Sr Walter Herbert*, *Katherine* married *Sr William Herbert* of *Swansey*, ap *Matthew Herbert*, and *Ellen* married *Sr Nicholas Bagnal*, the said Daughters had the most part of the Lands belonging to *Penrhyn*, but their uncl *Sr Rees Griffith* second Son to *Sr William Griffith* had *Penrhyn*, and certain Lands as Heir male, after the Death of his brother *Edward*, More Descent were *Griffithes* of *Plas Newydd* in *Anglesey*, of *Bloksame* and *Nanerch* of *Porth Aur*, and of *Caer yn Arvon*, *Roberts* of *Tregastell*, *Morgans* of *Gold Grove*, *Lloyds* of *Kinmael* of *Llanveres* and *Penwaeth*,

Ednyved Vaughan was in great Estimation with *Llewelyn ap Ierwerth Drwyndwn*, common-called *Leolinus Magnus* Prince of *Northwales* and with *David ap Llewelyn* his Son, and their cheife Councelour and General Leader of the Army, when the Earl of *Chester* came to invade *Northwales*, in which Battle three English Lords were slaine by the Valiant proves of the said *Ednyved Vaughan*, for which fact the Prince Renumerated & advanced him with honour and Armes before mentioned, the which coate all his Progeny

Progeny beares to this very day.

Ednyved Vaughan married first *Tanglwst* Daughter to *Llowarch ap Brân*, Lord of *Cwm-mwd* or *Comote of Menai*, and had by her *Sr Tudur*, who was owner of the *Nant* in *Llanganbaval*, The Second Son was *Llewelyn*, who was owner of one *Moety of Creuddyn*, and the third was *Rees* who was owner of *Garthgarmon*, *Ednyfed Vaughan* married Secondly *Gwenllian* Daughter to *Lord Rees ap Griffith*, ap *Rees ap Tudur mawr*, by whom he had *Abermarlys* in *Glan Gwy*, and had Issue *Grono*, who was owner of *Tregastell* in *Anglesey*, *Griffith* who was owner of *Henglawdd* with its appurtenances, *Jerwerth* who had *Abermarlys*, *Kynwrig*, who had the other moety of *Creuddyn*, and *Howell* who was Bishop of *St Asaph* Anno 1235.

Ednowain Bendew, Lord of *Englefield* in *Flintshire*, he bore *Argent*, a *Cheveron* between three *Boares heads*, *Couped Sable*, he dwelt at *Llys Coed y Mynydd*, Descended from *Ednowen*, *Wynns* of *Galedlom* and *Caerwys*, *Pughe* of *Esgeirvrog*, *Peers* of *Llanbasa*, *Parry* of *Coshil* and *Basingwrek*, *Griffith* of *Pant y Llong ddu*, and *Rutbin*, *Ffacnallt* of *Ffacnallt*.

Evnydd ap Gwernwy, of *Llys Gwernwy* in *Dyffryn Clw,d*, and Lord thereof, he lived in the time of Prince *Blethyn ap Cynvyn* and *Rhiwallon* his brother, about the year 1068, with whom he warred against the English, for the which Service the Prince renumerated him with the *Townships* of *Alington* and *Gresfford*, and gave him the Coat viz. *Azure Lion Rampant* Or Descended from *Evnydd Simunt* of *Coed y Llai* or *Lees Wood*, *Frichard* of *Caergwrley* Rogers of

Esq;, Thomas Meredith of Pentre Bychan
Esq; and Barrister at Law, Lloyds of Grosford,
 Griffiths of Derwlwyn, Davies of Alington, Al-
 mers of Almor and Alingtons of Alington,

Edwyn called King or Prince of Englesfield,
 Son to Grono ap Owen Howell Dda, ap Cadell

Descendants from Hedd Molwynog Lloyds of Havod Unnos, of Prysgod, of Llansannan, of Perparchell and Kilken, Wynnes of Bryn Cynwrig, Merediths of Llansannan and Tudur Aled the Poet qui floruerit Anno 1490.

One Meyrig Lloyd, who was one of Posterity of Hedd Molwynog, about Eight Descents after him, was Lord of some part of Uwch Aled, would not yield Subjection to the English Government, under which the Cantref or Hundred of Dyffryn Clwyd and several others were then (as witnesseth Dr Powell) though the absolute conquest of Snowden and other places was not made untill the time of King Edward the first Anno 1282. This Meyrick Lloyd took some English Officers that came there to Execute the Law, which was contrary to the Customes of the Brittaines, hang'd some, and kill'd others, for which fact he Forfeited his Lands to the King, and fled and took Sanctuary at Hailstone in Shropshire, where (for his Notable Enterprizes and merited Chivalry) he was taken to the Protection of John FitzAlyn Lord of Oswestree and Clunnamd Earl of Arundel, who made him General of the Army in the besieging of Acon in Asia, in the time of King Richard the first, Anno Dom. 1190. Where he behaved himself with such dexterous attempts as was most admirable to the spectators
in

in which Siege when the Enemies had gotten the Emperors Standart, by scaling the Wall, he soon regain'd and restor'd it to the Emperor for which invincible courage, the Coat Armour was given him by the Emperor, the which his posterity beares to this very day viz. Argent an Eagle Displayed with two Necks Sable, Beaked and Armed, Or. not differing from the Emperors Coat but only in the field which was Or.

Meyrick Lloyd fought Several Battels against the Turks, married Agnes Daughter and heir to Jeva Vaughan of Llwyn y Maen, ap Jeva ap Cybelyn, ap Rhun ap Finion Ewell, Descended from Meyrick Lloyd, Lloyds of Llwyn y Maen; of Llanvorda, of Dre Newydd in Whittington Parish, Edward Lloyd of Blaen Yale, whose Daughter and Heir married Owen Thwal Fsq; and Lloyd of Blaen y Ddol. These Lloyds of Meyrick Lloyd, and of Hedd Molwynog, are the Ancientest Lloyds (bearing the name of Lloyd) in the six Counties of Northwales.

Newydd Hardd of Cwmwd Nantconwy in Caernarvonshire, bore Argent, a Chevron inter three Javelins Sable pointed upwards Gules.

Hwua ap cynddelw Lord of Llys Llivon in Mon or Anglesey, he lived in the time of Griffith ap Conan, and Owen Gwynedd his Son, he bore Gules, a Chevron inter three Lions Rampant, Or, Descendants from Hoova, Sr Arthur Owens of Orleton in Pembrokeshire, Sr Robert Owens of Perkinou Clenneney, Owenses of Bodeon, Llaethley and Penrhos, Bould of Tre'r-ddol, Lewis of Prysaddved, Williams of Llanbeder, Wynnes of Bodychen and Holyhead.

Descended from *Gweryd, Humphreyses of Bodlwyddan, Wynnes of Bodwryd* and *Lloyds of Gwardog*.

Llowarch ap Bran Lord of *Cwmwrd Menai* in *Môn*, bore Argent, a Chevron between three Rookes, with Ermine in their Bills, Descended from *Llowarch Ellis Lloyd of Rhiw goch Esq;* and Barister at Law, whose Daughter and Heir married *Henry Wyne* Second Son to *Sr John Wynne of Gwudur*, and Father to *Sr John Wynne of Watstay. Maelawg Crwm Lord of *Llechwedd Iſa* in *Carnarvonshire*, bore Argent a cheveron, Sable, between three Cherubims heads Or, But by *Gwillims* Argent upon a cheveron, sable, three Angels Kneeling habited in Long Robes, Clofs girt with their hands Conioyned and Elevated with their wings displayed, Or descended from *Maelawg Crwm*, *Chalencors* of *Lloran Ganol*, of *Denbigh* and *Chester* But *Sr Thomas Chaloner* gave for his Coat Sable, a Cheveron between three Cherubims heads Or There was one *Madog Crwm* of *Chalencor*, in *France*, from whome they took the Sir name of *Chalencor*: that *Madog Crwm* was son to *Trabairn ap Gwilim ap Madog ap Maelawg Crwm*.

Cadwgan Lord of *Nanney*, son to *Blethyn ap Corvyn* bore Or Lion Rampant Azure. Ririd Vlaidd Lord of Penllyn, Pennant Melangell the township of Bryn and the Eleven Towns in Shropshire, bore Vert a cheveron inter three wolfs heads. Erased Argent Descendants from Ririd Vlaidd Einion ap Ithel of Rhiwedog which house by tradition, was the mansion House of Ririd Vlaidd, Gwenhwyvar Eldest daughter of the said Einion ap Ithel, married John Eyton of Eyton ap James ap Madog, and Margaret his second daughter and heires of Rhiwedog, married Meredith ap Evan ap Meredith, who had great possessions in Caer yn arvonshire, as is Evident by the Partition of John ap Merediths Lands and Moris ap John ap Merediths, Edward Vaughan of Glan y llyn and now of Llwyd iarth and Llangedwyn Esq; John Vaughan of Cefen Bodig Esq;, and Barister at Law, James Wynne late of Bala, Thomas Lloyd of Kent Drover son to Robert Lloyd of Gwern y Brech-dwn, whose daughter and heires of Thomas Lloyd married William Wynne of Garthgynan Esq; Fift son to Sr John Wynne of Gwydur, Owen Lloyd of Dwyfaen Gent. Griffith Goch Lord of *Rhos* and *Rhyuoniog*, Lineally Descended from *Marchudd* in the eleventh degree, he bore Or. a Griffin Surgerant or Rising Gules Descended from *Griffith Goch*, *Conwys* of *Bryn Eirin*, *Hughes* of *Ceven garleg*, *Williams* of *Plas uch*a near *Conwy*, *Lewis* of *Llwyn Gwern*, *Peers Lloyd* who Sold *Dol* in *Edeirion* to *Humpbre Jones* Receiver of Northwales.

It is alledged by some great and Learned Antiquaries, that there was no Earles before the Conquest, it appeareth that many Nobles were by Ancient writers Termed Earles, both in England and Wales, being Right Brittaines, and though some of them are both intituled Dukes in English Cronicles, Sometimes also they are called Earles in other places of the the History by English Writers. And in the Books written in the Brittish Tongue, they are call'd sometimes Earles and sometimes Princes. but very Seldome Dukes Some of their Names are Collected, & of what, places and Cities they bore Dominion of, and what time they lived.

Tudur Trevor, (in ancient Books of Pedegrees) is termed Earl of *Hereford*, Lord of *Whittington*, and *Llwyth y Mars*, which is the Tribe of *March*.

The cause why he is Intituled Earl of *Hereford*, is that *Ymyr ap Cadvarch*, (father to the said *Tudur Trevor*) married *Riengar* Daughter and Heir to *Lluthocca ap Cariadog Freichfras*, Earl of *Hereford*; and had Issue the aforenamed *Tudur Trevor* Earl of *Hereford* in his mothers Right.

Tudur Trevor was Lord of *Whittington*, which Lordship after continued in the male Issue of him till it came to *Melet* Daughter and Co-heir to *Sr William Pefr* (*id est pulcher* or *Teg*) by English manuscripts *Peverel*. Which *Sr William* was the Seventh degree after the said *Tudur Trevor*, *Sr William* was the Son of *Grona*
ap

ap Tudur ap Rees Sais, ap Ednyfed ap Llowarch Gam, ap Lluthocca ap Tudur Trevor. And the said Melet Daughter to Sr William Pefr, married Garen de Metts Lord of Alberbury in the County of Salop, Son to Sr Foulks de Warren, and had Issue Foulk Fitz Warren, Lord of Alberbury and Whittington. from whom the Fitz-Warrens Lords of Whittington Descended.

Tudur Trevor is called the Tribe of March, because a great number of the Gentlemen of several Surnames in the Marches of England and Wales are Descended from him.

The Authors to prove this are, Evan Brechva, Guttun Owen, Griffith Hiraethog, John Tudur, William Llŷn, Simon Vaughan, Tudur Fenllŷn, John Phyllip, William Kynwal, David glan Conwy, John Cain and many more.

Lluthocca ap Cariadog Freichfras was one of the Knights of King Arthurs Round Table, and married Togeuvron, Daughter and Heir to Trahairn King of the Golden Ball.

Kynvrig ap Rbiwallon Lord of Bromfield ap Dwngad, ap Tudur Trevor Bore Ermine Lion Rampant Sable, Descended from Kynvrig, John Roberts of Havod y Eweb and Plas Newydd in Llanvair Esq; . Griffith Jeffreys of Acton Esquire, Broughtons of Plas Issa, Wynns of Gerwyn vawr and Bersham, Santleys of Santley Bron deg and Bryngwylva, Ellises of Alrhey, Picill, Clay, Main, and Wern, Powell of Alrhey Jones of Llwyn Onn, Erthig of Erthig, Edwards of Bron deg, Edward Jones of Cadwgan, who forfeited his Lands in Queen Elizabeths time, Howell ap Grono of Havod y Wern, whose Daughter and Heir call'd Alswyn married Howel

Rees ap Rotpert of Cinmael, bore sable a Chevron inter three mullets Or Starrs Argent Descended from Rees, Anwyl of Garth Garmon and Lloyd of Cinmael.

Sr Gryffith Lloyd Knight, bore Gules Chevron Or and chiefe Ermine Descended from Sr Gryffith Davies of Caerbyn, and gryffiths of Llwyndyrus.

Llewelyn aur Dorchog Lord of Tal, commonly called Leolinus Torquatus, bore Azure Lion Rampant gardant Or, Descended from

Llewelyn, Hammers of Penrte'r Pant, Lloyds of Cowny and Llanwddyn, Wynns of Derwen, Edward Price of Ewelwag, whose Daughter and heires called Margaret married first Evan Roberts of Pennant melangell, secondly Edward Maurice of Cae hir Gent. Rees ap Howel, ap John ap Madog Heddwch. of Rhiwlas whose Daughter and heires to Rees ap Howel, called Margaret, married Edward, ap Thomas, ap Rees ap Guttyn, Llewelyn, ap Howel Goch ap Meredith ap Madog Heddwch, whole Daughter and heires to Llewelyn ap Howell Goch, caled Cicili married David ap Howel ap Madog, by some Bookes called David Vain, John Owens of Sroogan and Tregeiriog, Evans of Rhyd y Carw, Roger Griffiths of Llanerch Emrys, commonly called y Corph gwyn. Thelwals of Llanrhudd, Plas Coch and Nantclwyd, bore Gules fess inter three boares heads Couped Argent.

Conways of Bodrhythan beares Sable on a bend Gules a Role between two Anulets of the field Or of the first.

Holands of Hendre Vawr and Place Cadwgan bore Azure a Semi Lion Rampant gardant between seven flowers de luces Argent Meredith ap Conan Lord of Rhiwhirieth, Coed Talog, and Neuodd Wenn and brother to Griffith ap Conan, Meredith bore quarterly Argent and Gules four Lions Pasant Counterchang'd of the field, Descended from Meredith Joneses of Esquenau, Joshua Roberts near Llain Wenn, Olivers of Neuodd Wenn and Llanervil, Williams of Dolanog, and Lloyds of Maerdre in Edeirnion.

Hammers of Hammer, Breadcubeth, Maes y Gwaelod

Perhaps some Heralds will Preindicate my Errour for terming these Lions in the two Precedent Coats, for in Blazoning of Arms consisting of more Lions in a field then one, they ought to be termed Lioncells, which is as much as to say, as so many Petty or young Lions, the reason of this Rule is that in as much as the Lion hath a Prerogative Rule over all beasts, and cannot that any other should participate of the field with him: for Princes will admit no fellowes to the Impeachment of their Sovereignty, Therefore the bearing of Divers Lions In one field must be understood of Lions Whelps, which as yet have not so great feeling of their own Strength, or inbred noble Courage, nor apprehension of their ingenerate Royall Sovereignty over all Beasts as Lions have.

Breretons of *Borasham* and *Malpas*, bore Argent three barrs Sable, *Langford* of *Alington* and *Poole*, bore Gules a Shulver Argent.

Herberts of *Fowys*, of *Cherbury*, of *Dolgiog* and *Bromfield*, Sr *Edward Herbert* Knight late Lord Chief Justice of *Chester*, and *Arthur Herbert* Lord *Terrington*, Bears for their Coate Armour Parted per Pale Gules and Azure, Two Lioncells Rampant Argent, by some Books three Lioncells, if so, then I suppose the field ought to be parted per Pale,

Cadavel Ynfyd, bore Sable on a Chevron Argent, a Flower de luces, Azure between two Mortlets

Mortlets of the field, all between three Ragged Stucks Or, Descended from *Cadavel*, *Meyricks* of *Bodorgan* and *Ucheldre*,

Most of these Subsequent Coats are worn out in these Dayes, Especially in the six Counties of *Northwales*.

As *Rees ap Marchan*, from which *Marchan*, *Coed Marchan* by *Ruthin* beares the name, *Rees Marchan* had a Daughter and heir call'd *Gwenllian* married to *Gwaeddgar* alias *Gwaedd-fawr*, Father to *Gwerngwy*, Father to *Eunydd ap Gwerngwy* Lord of *Dyffryn Clwyd* and *Alington*, *Rees ap Marchan* bore Azure a Fess Or between Three Naggs or Horses heads, Erased Argent, So I think it would be very decent to all the gentlemen Descended from *Eunydd ap Gwerngwy*, to quarter their Coat with the Coat of *Gwenllian* Daughter and heir to *Rees Marchan*, because she was reputed to be the absolute heir of the Hundred or *Cantref* of *Dyffryn Clwyd*.

Howel ap Ferwerth of *Anglesey*, bore Gules Lion passant Argent.

Cadrodd calchvynydd bore Azure Lion Ram Arg.

David ap Owen Gwynedd prince of *Northwales* bore Argent Three Eagles displayed in Fess Or.

Tanglwst Daughter to *Llowarch goch* and wife to *Llewelyn ap Ferwerth Drwyndwn*, bore Vert a Staggs Standing at gaze Argent attir'd and unguled Or.

Stephen Bwl, bore gules a dexter Hand Couped at the Wrist handling a Sword pointed upwards Argent the Pummel and hilt Or.

Gwyddno Goronir or *Goronhir* Lord of *Cantref gwaelod*, which was upon the meer of *Cardigan* and *Merionydd-shire* swallowed up by the Sea, he bore Arg. Lion Passant in Fess Sable, between three flower Deluces Gules.

Sr Aeron Bledri, by some Books *Sr Aeron ap Rees ap Bledri* Knight of the Sepulcher, Bore Argent a Cheveron between three Bulls Heads Trunched or Cabossed Sable Armed Or.

Any Pilgrim gon to *Jerusalem* to visit the holy grave, for thirty Chickens of Gold (Every Chicken amounting to nine Shillings) may be made Knight of the Sepulcher, or of the Order of *Jerusalem* by the guardian there, the Order of which Knighthood is, first they bind themselves with a Solemn vow to pray (during life) for the Pope, King of *Spain*, Duke of *Venice* from whom the Friers there receive their maintenance, and also in special for the French King, by whose means they obtain their Liberty from the great Turk, to frequent those Monumentall places. Secondly they are Sworn Enemies to Protestants and others who will not acknowledg the Superiority of the Roman Church, Thirdly they must pay yearly some Stipend unto the order of Francisan Friers. These attentations ended the frier putteth a gilded Spurr on his Right heel, Causeing the new made Knight to stoop down on his knees and lay his hands on the holy Grave, after this he taketh a broad Sword from under his Gray Gown (being Privatly Caried for feare of the Turke, for Christians are not admitted to cary weapons within the Turkes Dominions) which is (as he saith) the Sword where with Victorious *Godfrey* of *Boisnoigne* Conquered *Jerusalem*, and giveth this new upstart Knight nine blowes upon the Right Shoulder.

Knights of the Sepulcher have Certaine Priviledges among the Roman Catholicks viz if

a Malefactor being Condemned and brought to the Gallowes, any of these Knights may straight Cutt the Rope and Relieve him, And they may Carry and buy silks through all *Spaine* and *Italy* or *Els* where and Pay no Custom neither in going or comeing, nor for any Silk ware where the Romish Church hath any Comandement.

Gwion ben arw bore Sable three Grey hounds Current Argent Colered Or *David Holbeck*, by some Bookes *David Holbais* bore Gules a Chevron Engrailed inter three Boares heads Erased Argent, This *David Holbeck* was Deputy Steward of *Bromfield* and *Yal*, and made Denizen by Petition in Parliament, upon whose request *Owen Glyndwr* was Pardoned for his rebellion in the first yeare of King *Henry* the Fourth's Reign but *Stowes Cronickle* saith that notwithstanding the Kings Pardon, he was so timerous of shewing his face to any, that he Pined away in the Clifts of the Rockes and mountaines for want of Sustainance, the which (I am of opinion) is most Erroneous, for we have it by Severall manuscripts that he lived fifteen years after his rebellion, I Can Very well remember that I have seen it in some old author that *Owen Glyndwr* had a base Daughter

ghter married in a Place called *Geuattb* in South-wales, with whom he lived a Solitary life those fifteen yeares, as wittneffeth a Bard in those dayes

Cadwgan Seuthydd Lord of Bache, Son to *Ririd ap Cadwgan ap Ririd ap Bletbyn ap Cynbyn*, *Cadwgan Seuthydd* bore Argent a Chevron inter three Pheons Sable. According to my diligent Search I find that *Cadwgan Seuthydd* had but one Son call'd *Grono Lord of Bache*, whose Sole Daughter and Heir call'd *Eva*, married *Cybelyn ap Rhun ap Eimion Evell*.

Cadwaladr Fendigaid the last Brittish King who died at Rome Anno 688. bore Jupiter a Cross Patee on three parts and fitched on the Fourth Sol,

I have not taken the observation I should in Blazoning the precedent Princes Coats which ought to Blazoned by Planets, To Persons Enoblished by the Sovereign, by precious Stones, and to Gentlemen having no Titles of Dignity, by mettals and Colours, as in the Subsequent Example, which is the Selected Formes of Blazoning,

Owen Gwynedd bore Venus three Eagles Displayed in Fess Or, *Blethyn ap Kynvyn* bore Sol Lion Rampant mars.

Sr Aeron Bledri bore Pearle a cheveron inter three Bulls heads Truncked Diamond, And *Sr Richard Middleton* beares Pearles on a Bend Emerald, three Woolves heads Erased of the first, note that because that the field was Argent and the Charge on the Bend the same Mettal it must not be said to be Argent, Cause the same Mettall Or Colour Precious Stones Or Planet, ought not to be Termed twise in the Blazoning of the same Coat, but of the first, second, third or more if it happen to be.

Likewise for a Bend drawne from the Right side to the Left is Called a bend Dexter, but a bend Exactly drawne Like to it on the Contrary side haveing it's begining from the Left Corner of the Chiefe, and his termination in the Dexter base Point of the Escoccheon, for which cause it is Called a bend Sinister, but in Blazoning of bends, if the same be dexter, it must be onely said he beares a bend, not using the word dexter, but if it be drawne from the Sinister Chiefe to the dexter base, then in Blazoning the word Sinister by no Means should be Omitted.

Next follows the Blazon of her late Sovereign Lady Anns Achievement, according to John Guillim, late Pursuant at Arms.

THE most high and Monarch Anne, by the grace of God late Queen of Great Britain France and Ireland Defender of the Faith &c. beareth for her highness Sovereign Ensigns Armoriall these most Royal! Coat-mours quarterly quartered as followeth viz. Principally in the first, Jupiter, Three Flowers deluces Sol, for the Royal Arms of France, quartered with the Imperial Ensigns of England, that is to say, Mars, three Lions Passant gardant in pal Sol. sally. Sol within a double Treasure counter flowered, a Lion Rampant Mars,

or the Royal Armes of Scotland. Thirdly, Jupiter, in Irish Harp, Sol, Stringed Luna, for the Ensigns of her Majesties Kingdom of Ireland. The Fourth and last quarter in all points as the first. All within the garter. The chief Ensign of that most honourable Order that was instituted by the most Famous King *Edward* the third. Above the same in Helmet answerable to her Majesties Sovereign Jurisdiction, upon the same a Rich Mantle of Cloth of Gold, doubled Ermin, Adorned with an Imperiall Crown, and Surmounted by a Lion passant gardant, crown'd with the like supported by a Lion Rampant Gardant Sol, Crowned as the former: and an Unicorn, Luna gorged with a Crown thereto a chain fixed, passing between his forelegs, and reflexed over his Back Sol both standing upon a Compartment placed underneath, from the midst whereof Issue the Royall badges of her majesties Chiefe Kingdoms of *England* and *Scotland*, to wit, the Rose for *England*, and the Thistle for *Scotland*. And in the Table of the Compartment her highness Royall motto *Dieu Et mon droit*. It hath been and it is at Present questioned by severall men since these Armes are peculiar to the English Sovereign, wheretore the Armes of *France* should have the Prehemidency in Marshalling, the reasons thereof are Divers. as first because the Kingdome of *France* is the greater, secondly because the Flowers de luces from their first bearing have been the Ensignes of a King, and those of *England* viz the three Lion passant deduced only from Dukedomes for the Conqueror (as Duke of Normandy) brought in for his Coate armour two Leopards and the Kings of *England* after the Conquest did beare those two Leopards (which were the Ensignes of the Dukedome

dome of Normandy) till the time of King Henry the second, who married *Elinor* Laughter and Heir to *William Duke* of Aquitaine and *Gwyan*, One of the Peeres of France whose Coate was Mars a Lion passant Gardant, Sol, the which field and Charge was of the same from mettall and Colour, as the two Leopards, was annexed thereunto and so from thence forward they were Joyntly Marshalled in one Shield and Blazoned as before. A third reason may be given for at the first quartering of these Coates by King *Edward* the third, question being made of his title to France, the King had good Cause to Put that Coate in the first Rank, to Shew his most undoubted Title to that Kingdom and therefore would have it in the most Perspicuous Place of his Escoccheon.

Belinus magnus King of Brittain, Anno mundi 3893. which was about 70 yeares before the birth of our Saviour, *Belinus* bore Jupiter three Crownes in pale Sole, *Belinus* having Conquered France Almain, all Italy, and the City of Rome together with all Greece, he returned into this Land and assumed unto himselfe new Armes (as *Upton* reporteth) *Tres coronas auratas in campo Azordo*, quia ipse fuerat terna vice id diversis regnis coronatus viz In a field Azure three Crownes Or, because he was three times Crowned King of Sundry Kingdomes.

Its not much material whether the a foresd. Crowns are termed Or not, because it is proper to them to be made of gold, neither to terme the Raven Sable, Or the Swan Argent, and severall other things wherewith the Field may be charged, for it Sufficeth onely to mention their Form, But when they are found to be born in other kind of Mettall Or colours, It is not necessary in blazoning to make mention whereof they are. The
