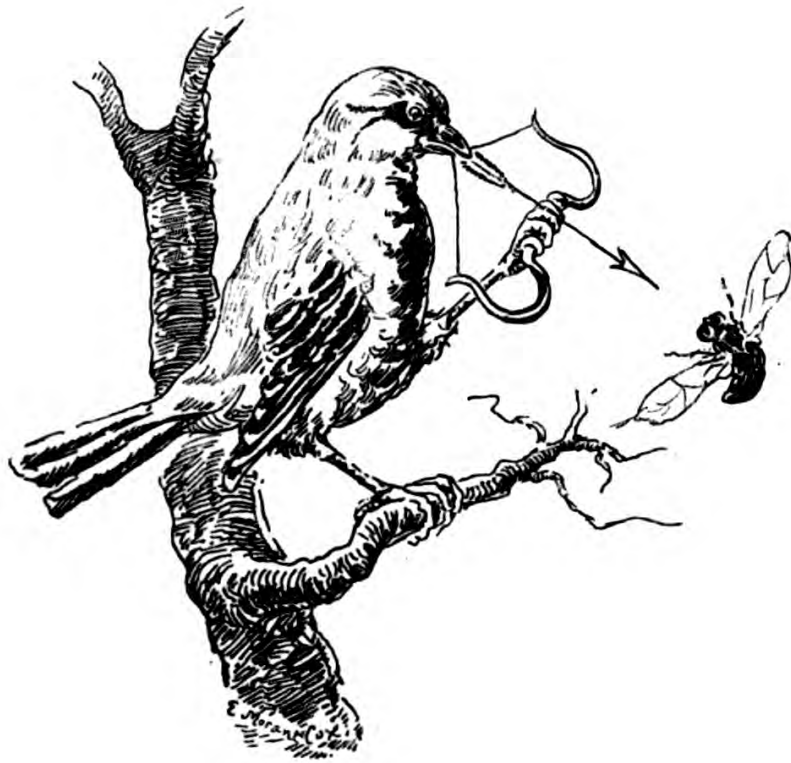

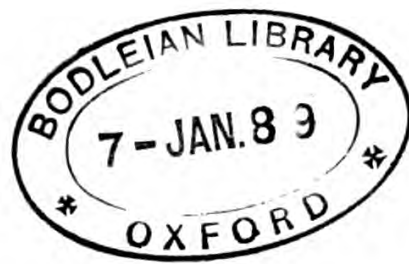

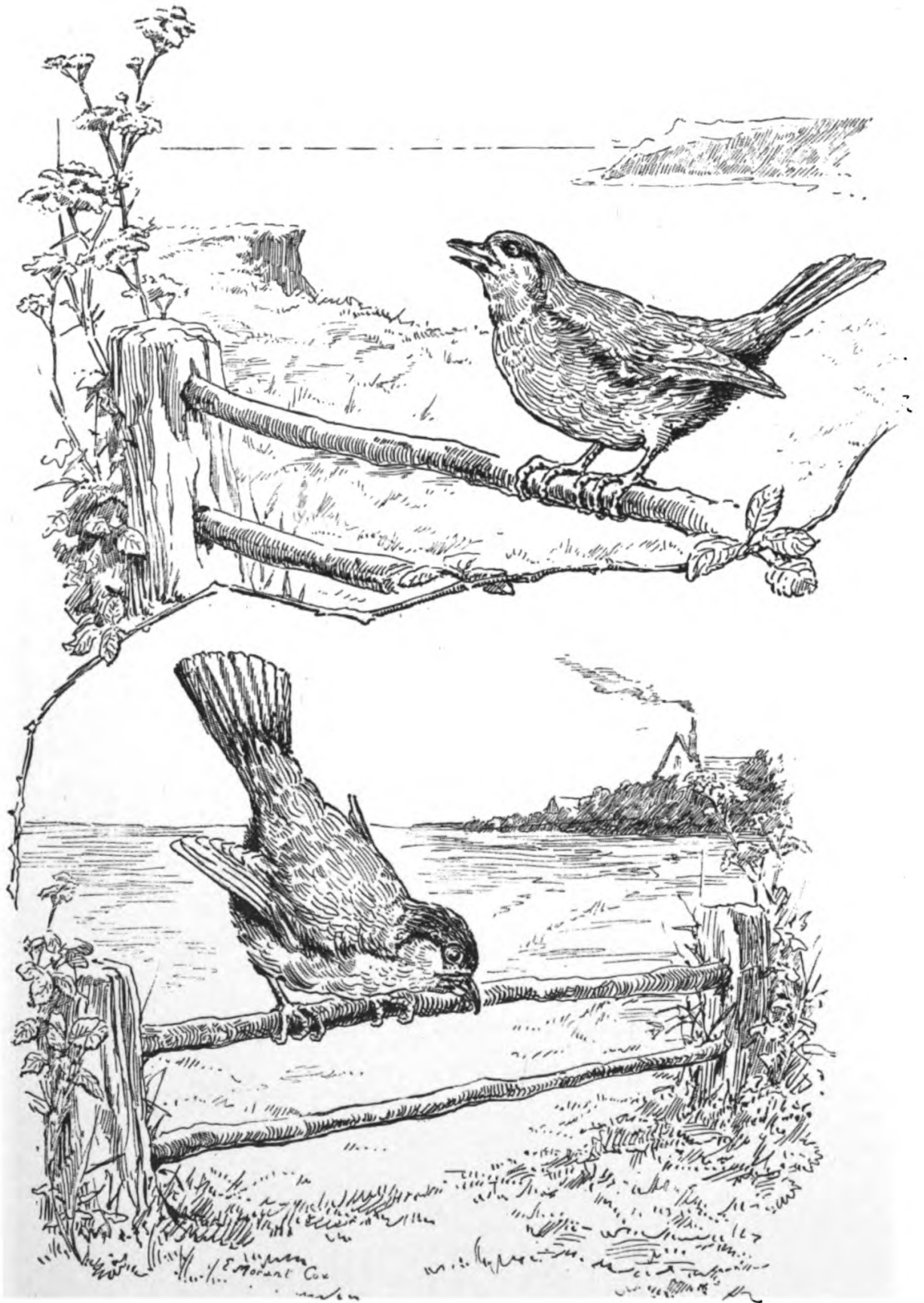

That saw him die.*

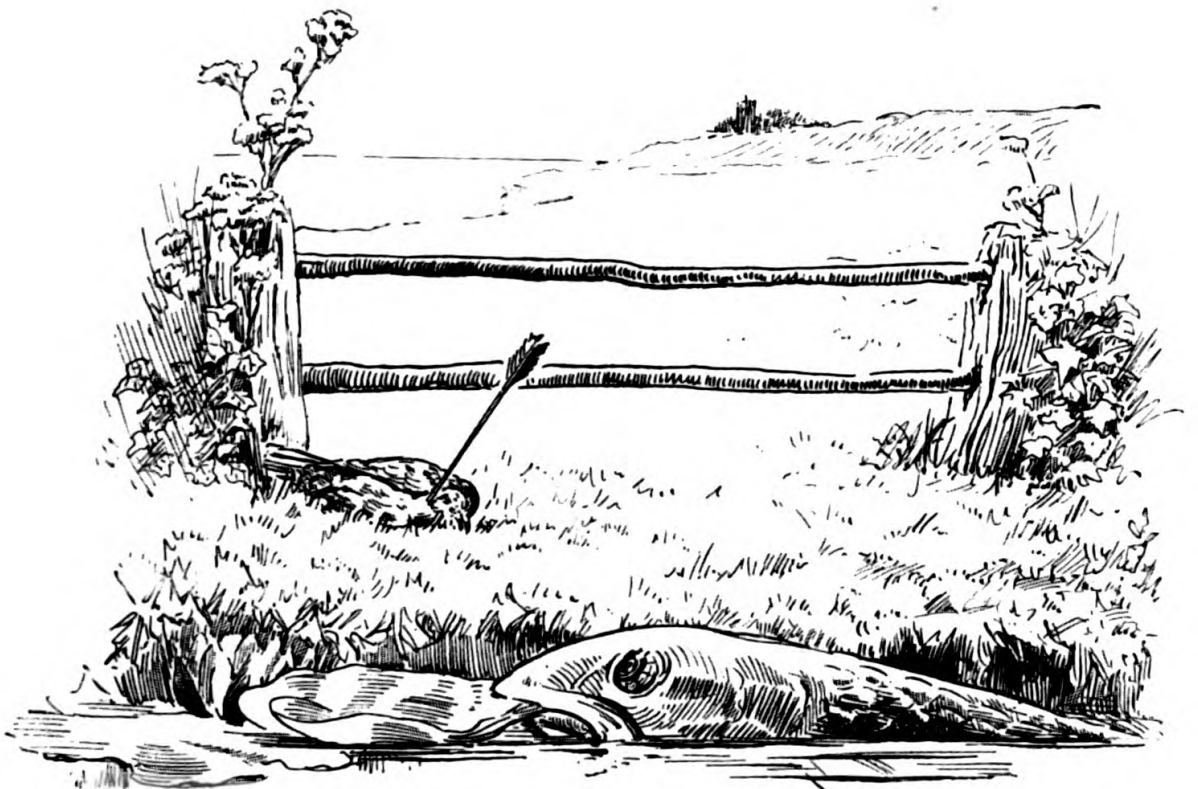


WHO caught his blood?

And I made his shroud.

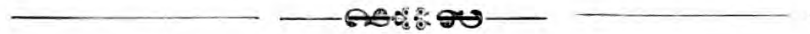
*This is the Beetle
