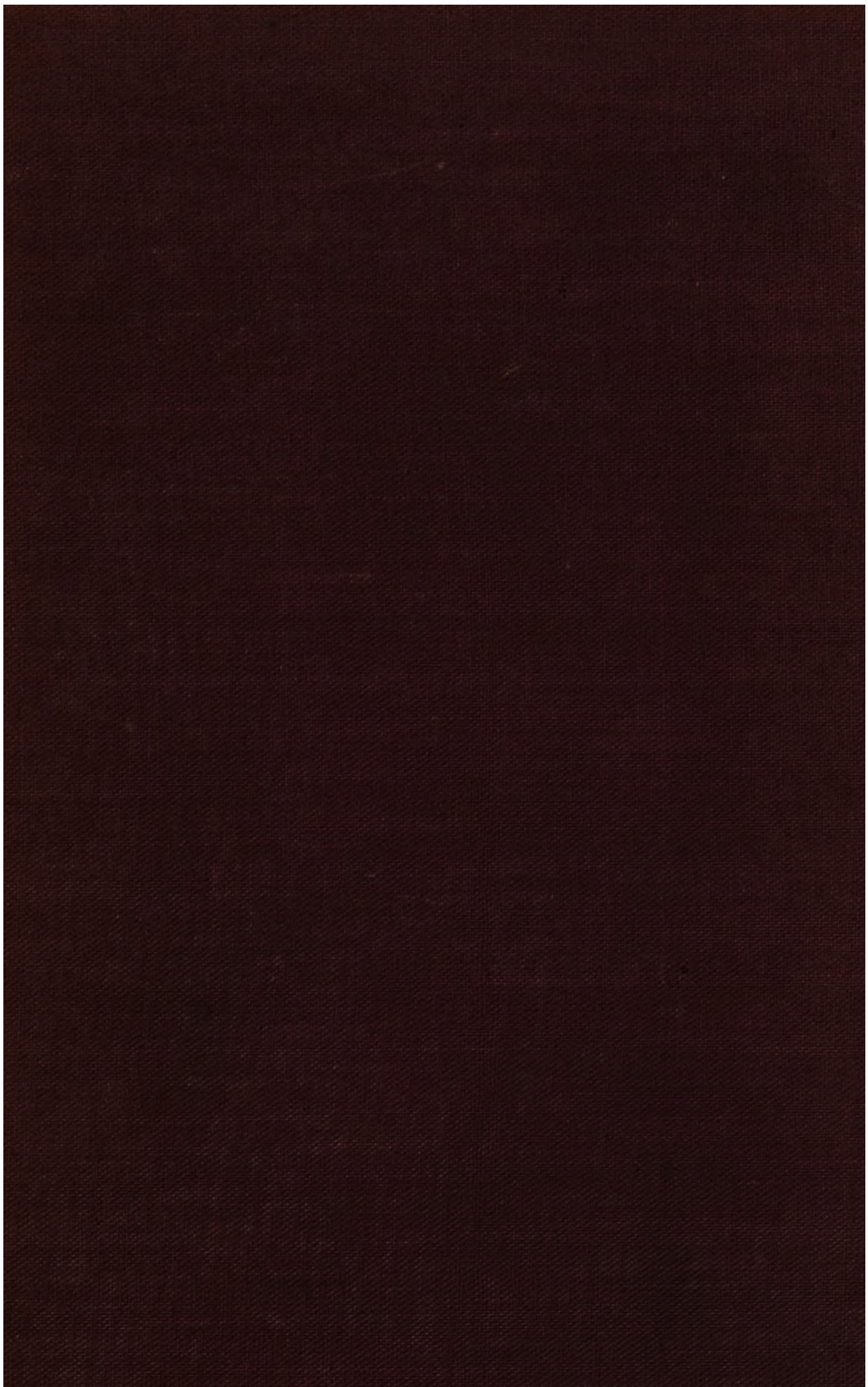

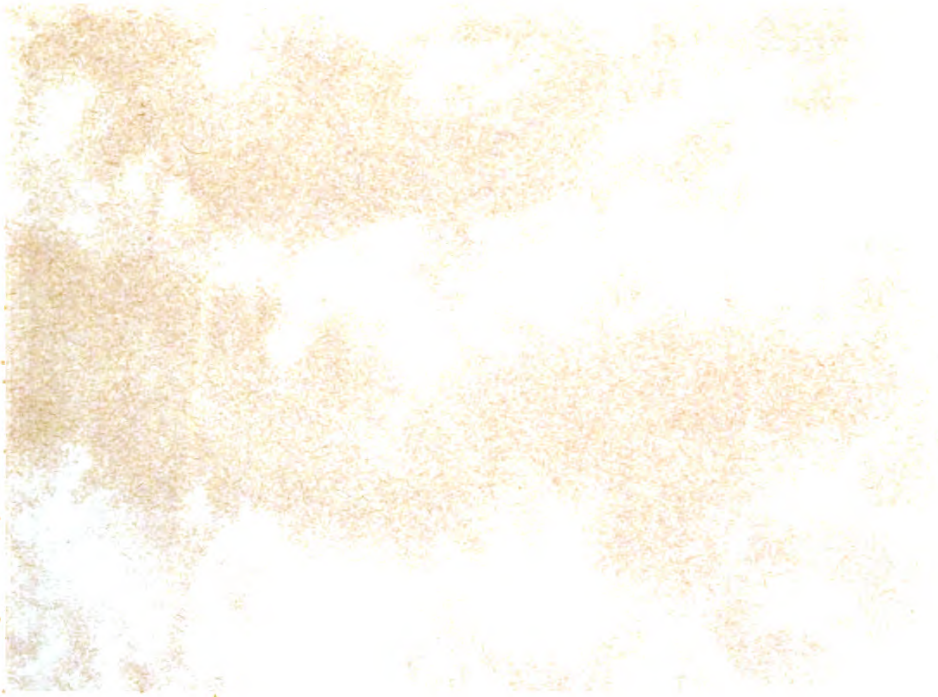

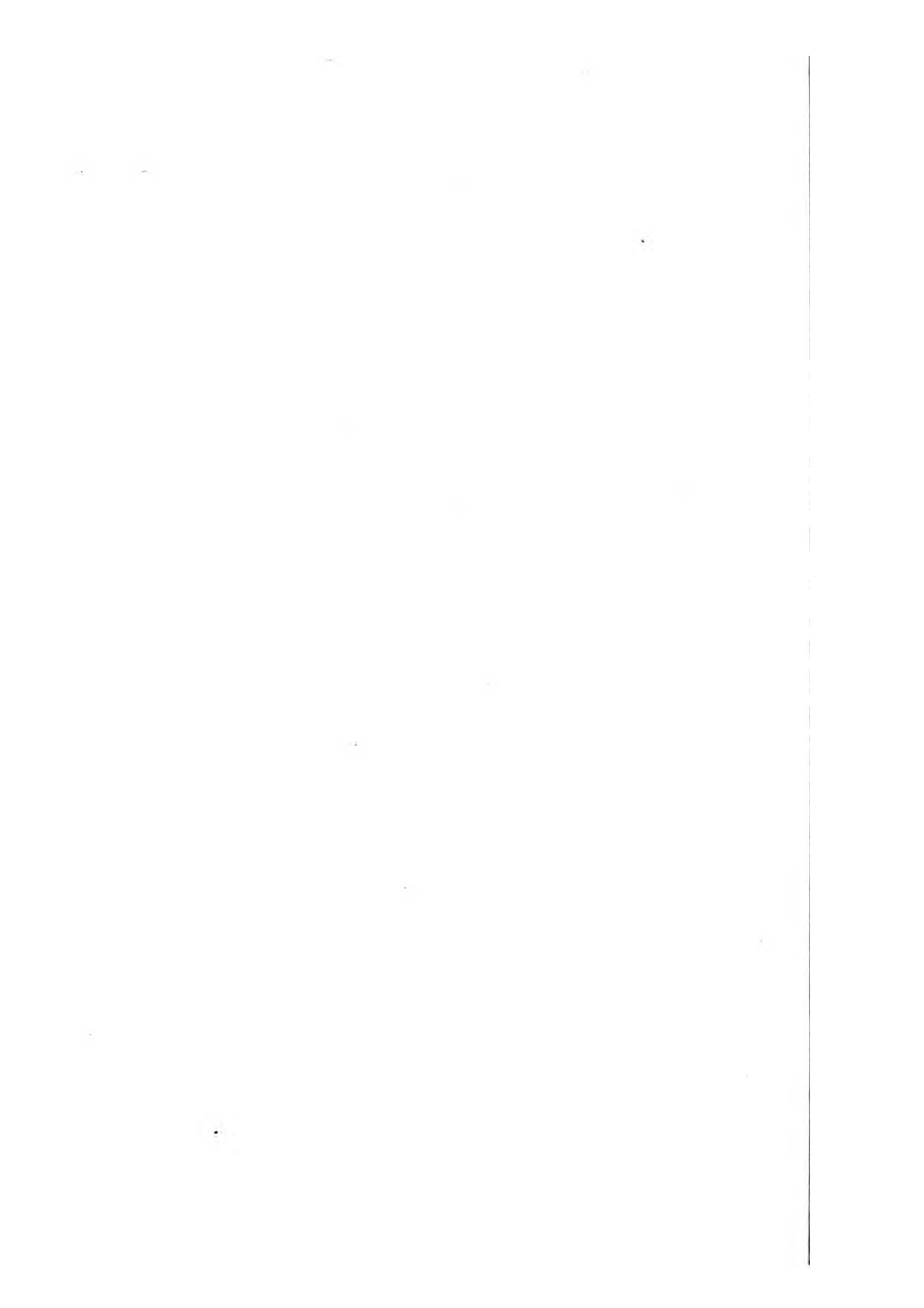

Dr. Ash was no Frenchman. When Johnson was at a loss for the etymology of the word *curmudgeon*, he was informed, through the medium of the Gentleman's Magazine, by an *unknown correspondent*, that it is a vitious manner of pronouncing *cœur méchant*. *Curmudgeon*, says Ash, is from the French, *cœur*, *unknown*--and *méchant*, *correspondent*!

Schweighœuser was induced to publish a new edition of Athe-

næus from the discovery of two MSS. unknown to former editors, one of the 14th, the other of the 12th century; which last was so well concealed in the Library of St. Marc, at Venice, that it escaped the observation of even the Aldes. Both MSS. are now in the Royal Library at Paris. It is by far the most correct edition.

This work, which abounds with grammatical remarks, was originally composed by Aulus Gellius, for the use of his children.

There are two editions in folio of Bacon's Works, one in 1740 in 4 vol., and in 1753 in 3 vol.; neither of which are so complete as the quarto edition of 1778. There is also an edition in 10 vol. 8vo. 1803.

Bacon died at the Earl of Arundel's House at Highgate, on the 9th of April, 1626, and so poor, that, some time before his death, he wrote to the King, praying *that he who had only wished to live to study, might not be obliged to study to live*.

- Baretti was a very entertaining writer, though, according to his own account, his works were very rapidly composed, as he always wrote from necessity, never by choice, and was always more in search of money than fame.

Mr. Burrow has produced a book which has long been wanted among Conchologists, and which fully answers its avowed intent; that of a correct epitome of the science of Testaceology in its present state. It is illustrated with *twenty-eight* very accurate and useful plates, in outline; *two* of which are explanatory of the different parts of shells; *one* of the interior, or sections, of univalves; *two* of rare or nondescript shells; and *twenty-three* of the different genera, which are none the worse for being arranged according to the Linnæan system. The work contains a nomenclature of shells; a general description of the genera; a specific description of such shells as are exhibited in the plates; a list of English trivial names and of writers on Conchology; and a table of colours. This work, which includes all the elementary knowledge that the student can require, drawn up in a very perspicuous manner, will entirely supersede the use of Da Costa's book, which was consulted only because a better was not to be had. subjects, the Author has given, in the first volume, a chapter  
on the Poets and celebrated Musicians of Naples, with an

the Kingdom of Naples. In the second volume the Cata-  
strophy of Herculaneum is detailed. The third contains the

Lister was Physician to Queen Anne, and practised his profession with great success, till he died in 1712. His *Historia Conchyliorum* is an admirable work, though devoid of any arrangement that can be useful to the scientific Conchologist. The plates, which were executed from drawings by his daughters, are for the most part very accurate, and in the above copy, are all referred to the last edition of the *Systema Naturæ*, by professor Gmelin. The first edition was published in London, in 1685, folio. The copies, which are rarely found complete, ought to contain 1057 plates, on 468 leaves, independent of the 22 plates in the Appendix. In the Oxford edition, there are 1059 plates of shells, besides the 22 anatomical subjects; also 6 pages of Lister's notes and observations, not to be found in the first edition, and two very imperfect *indices* at the end of the volume.
