WARWICK, 30
AUG. 1682.

THE Draught of the Cōmon Seal of the Borough of Warwick, first incorporated a^o 34. H. 8. by the name onely of Burgesses of the Town of Warwick, and since a^o 1 et 2 Ph. et Ma. reincorporated by the name of Bailiff and Burgesses of the said Borough of Warwick, and Enabled with divers great and large Privileges, as among other to be a Free Borough to plead and be impleaded, to have a Cōmon Seale, to have twelve Assistants besides twelve Principall Burgesses. To have power to make laws and ordinances for the more benefit of the said Borough, to have a Recorder, Sergeant at Mace, and Clerk of the Market, to have power to choose and elect a new Bayliffe, Burgesses and Recorder : That y^e Bayliffe, Recorder, and Two of the ancientest Burgesses shall be Justices of the Peace and Quorum within the said Borough, and no other Justices to intromitt, to have power to punish the Bayliff refusing to hold upon Election, together with many other immunities then and since granted and confirmed by King James of blessed memory. And since again confirmed by his sacred Majestie that now is, by his Charter some few years after his happy Restoration. By which Charter the Goverment of the said Borough by a Bayliff and Burgesses is changed into a Mayor, 12 Aldermen, and 12 assistant Burgesses, whereof the Mayor, Recorder, and 2 Senior Aldermen are Justices of the Peace.

And at the time of this Present Visitation, Scit̄ 30^o Aug. 1682, Moses Holloway is Mayor. The Right Hon^{ble}. Foulk Grevill L^d. Brook Recorder, Thomas Stratford and George Weale Sen^r. Aldermen, Edward Makepeace, John Townshend, John Welton, Edmund Wilson, John Warner, Anthony Lane, John Hadley, Tho: Gibbes and Will: Rothwell, Eleven of the Twelve Alderman, the other being vacant by the death of William Hind. And lastly, James Prescott, Barrister at Lawe, Deputie Recorder and Townclark.

This is a draught of the Seal of the Borough of Sutton-Coldfield in the County of Warwick, incorporated by K. Henry the 8th, the 16th of December, a°. 20, Hen. 8. By the Name of a Warden and Society of the Town Manour and Lordship of Sutton-Coldfield, and Enabled with Sundry great Privileges as to have a Comon Hall or Moot Hall for their Assemblies, to have power to choose a Guardian, who shall be sequestred from the said Societie and loose the benefit of the Charter if he shall refuse to hold upon Election. The Societie to consist of Power and Twenty Persons besides the Warden: To have a Clerk of the Market and a Steward: The Warden to be Coroner for his year: To have one or two Sergeants at Mace, and that no Shiriff shall intromitt within their Libertie. All which was confirmd by our present Sovereign King Charles the 2nd, since his happy Restoration, with the addition of two Justices of the Peace who are to hold Sessions of the Peace, viz^t. the Warden for the time being one, and the other to be elected out of the Societie. And at the time of this present Visitation viz^t. 29° Mar: 1682. John Cowper was Warden, George Sacheverell Esq^r. the elected Justice, Thomas Addys, William Chancy, Will: Wood, Mr. Leicester Grosvenor, John Addys, Henry Sedgwick, Tho: Scott, John Alport, Will: Alport, Ambrose Cowper, Ralph Cowper, Jn°. Turner, Rich^d. Turner, Sam^l. Leigh, Philip Best, Tho: Myles, George Cater, Joseph Mason, Jn°. Thompson, Rob^t. Field, Tho: Cater, John Cook, and John Eagles y^e Societie, S^r. Thomas Thyn Bar^t. Steward, and Mr. Martin Holbech of Meriden, Deputy Steward.

Mem'dum. Upon comparing this entry with y^e Pedegree of Norton entred by W. Dugd' Norroy in the Vis: of Yorksh' made a^o. 1665. Marked c. 40, f^o. 43^o. et. f^o. 62. It appears that this John Norton, 2^d Son of Richard did dye without issue, or at least without issue male, so that y^e Joyning these Nortons of Coventry to those of Norton Coniers Co. Ebor. is not authentick.

This Pedegree was taken from a Descent attested by Sir Will: Dugdale Garter, in these words;

“This descent of the Family of Eborall appeareth partly from an antient Lieger Book sometime belonging to the Collegiate Church of Knoll in the County of Warwick, & partly by Divers Court Rolls of the Mannor of Balshall, that is to say, down to Richard Ebrall who died in the year 1616, and was buried in the church Yard of St. Michael in the City of Coventry; as by the Certificate from the Register of that Church is to be seene, which Richard married Mary the eldest daughter of Will Howell of Packwood in the said County of Warwick, Gent. and at length one of the 3 sisters and Coheirs to Thomas Howell their brother, as by y^e Copy of the last Will and Testament of the said Will. Howell, and a Decree in Chancery bearing date the 15th year of King James is manifest.”

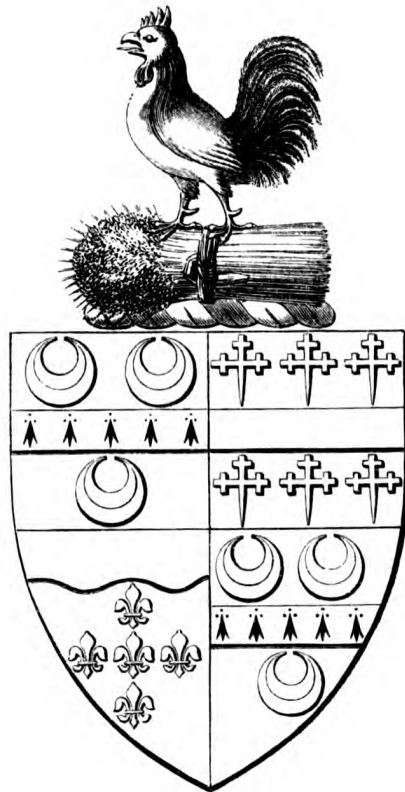

Mr. King voucheth for his Armes—Sable a Lyon ramp't queue furche or, a Lable of 3 points arg., producing an Escoccheon and Seal of the said Armes of King of Iver in co. Bucks. Entred in y^e Visitation of that County a^o 1634, C. 26, fo. 5b. Mr. King must make out his relation to that family.

John King of Kent

William King was at Bosworth Field with K. H. VII., and had lands giuen him at Higham-on-the-Hill, in co. Leic., for his service there.

Richard King of Higham aforesaid, in com. Leic.

[Granted to Thomas King, Alderman of Coventrie 26 Dec., 1683, by S^r W^m Dugdale, Garter, and S^r Henry S^t George, Clarenceux.]

John King sold his lands in Higham to Umfraville, who afterwards disposed of it to Norton, Patchet, and Hobson. He dyed at Higham circ. an. 1634.
