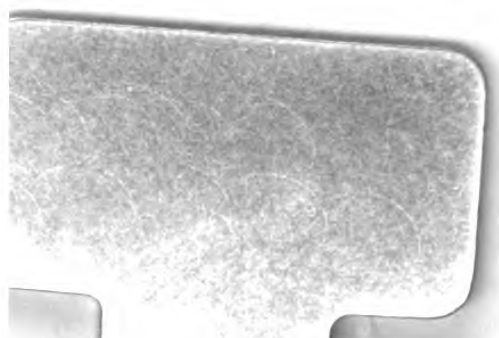

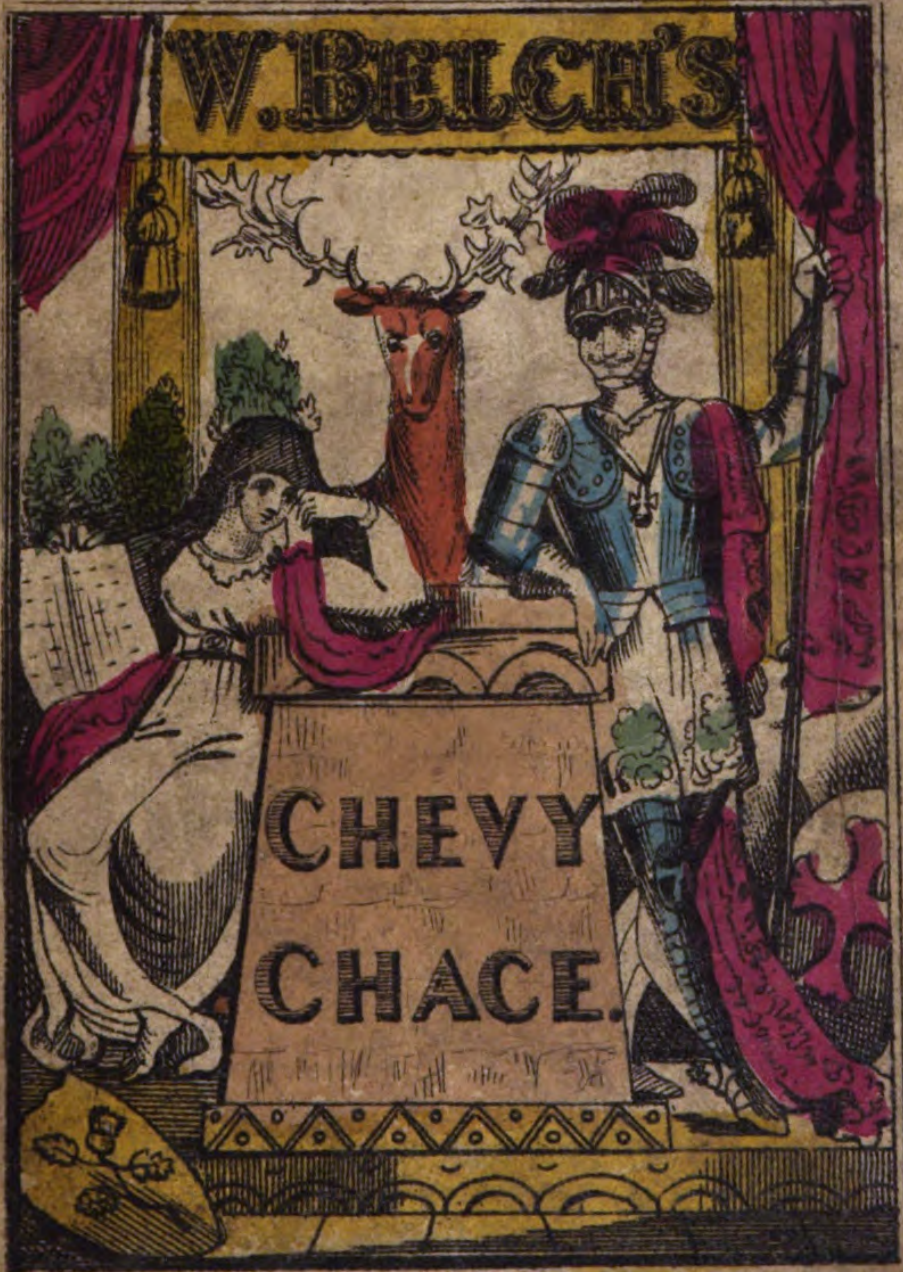

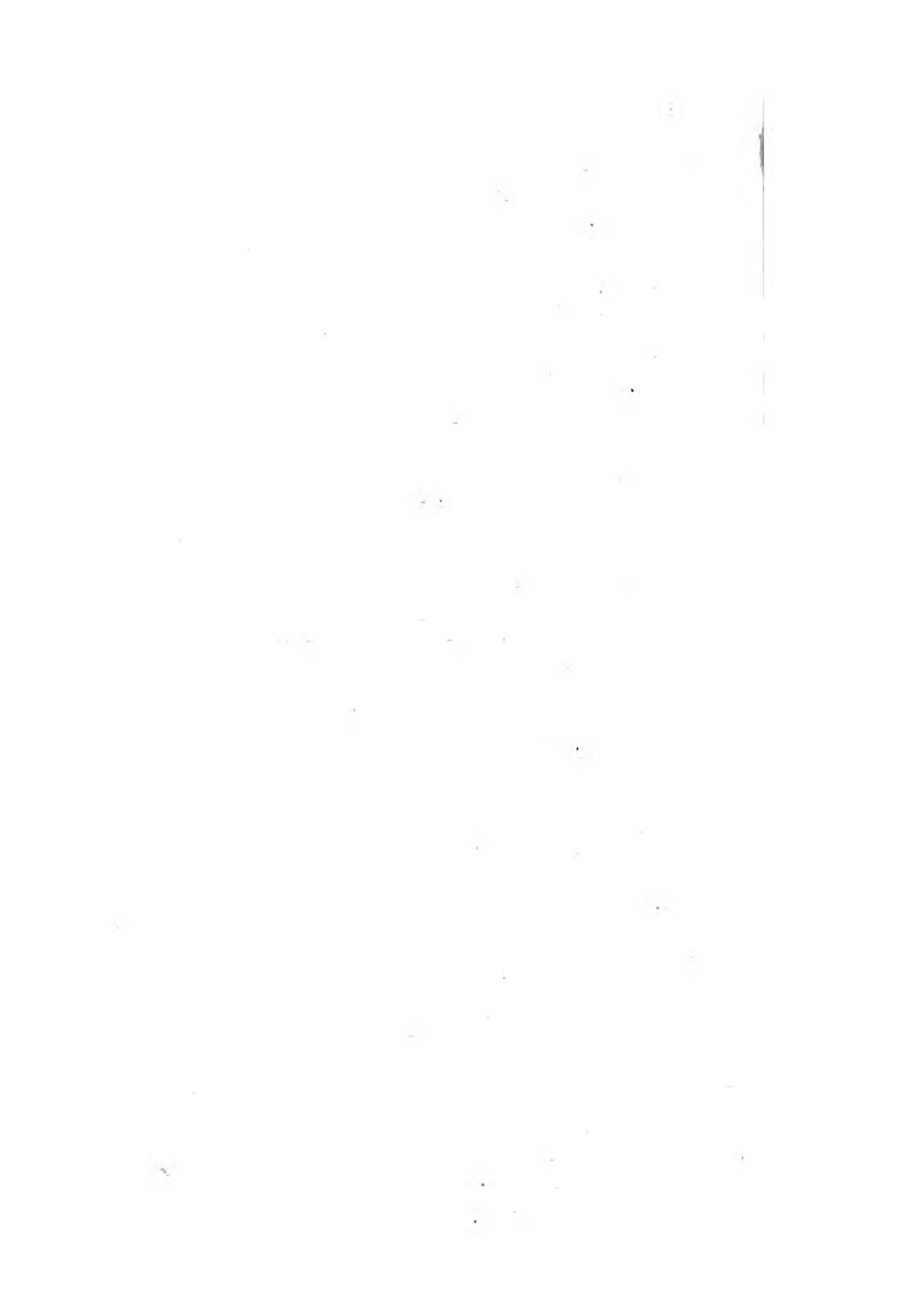

Three summer days to take ;

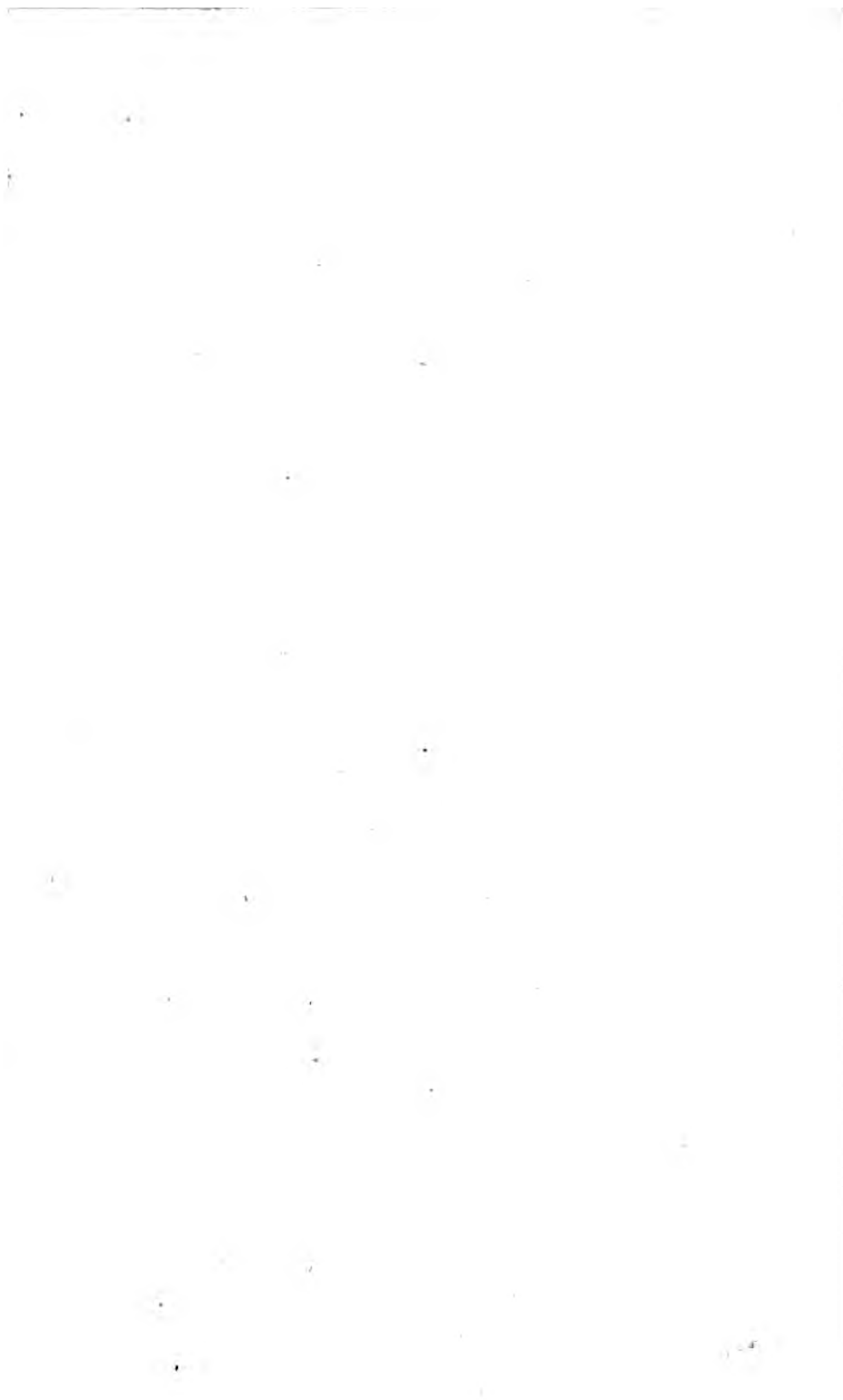

Then day light did appear,







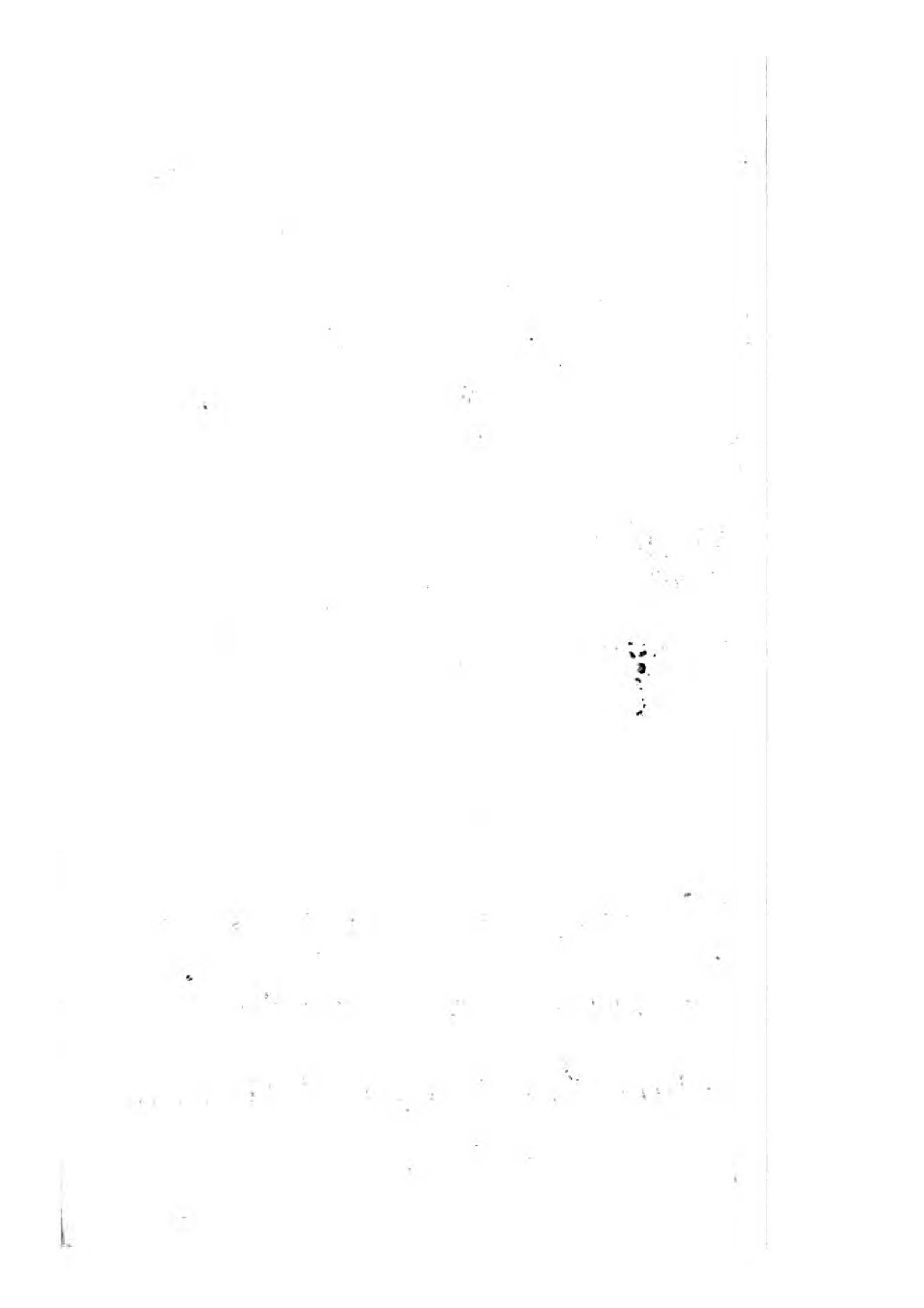
THE MARCH.

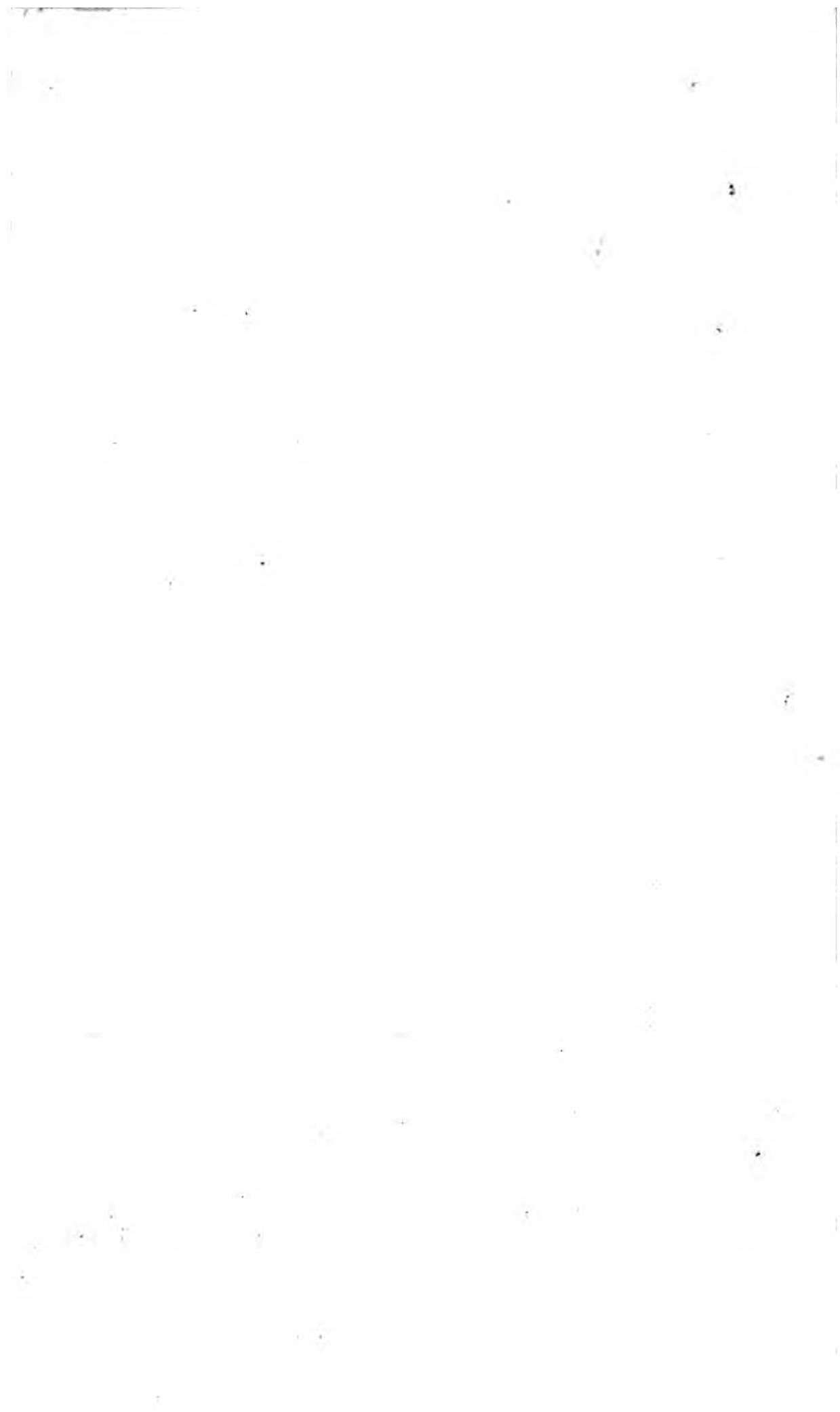
Earl Douglas on a milk-white steed

and made a cruel fight.

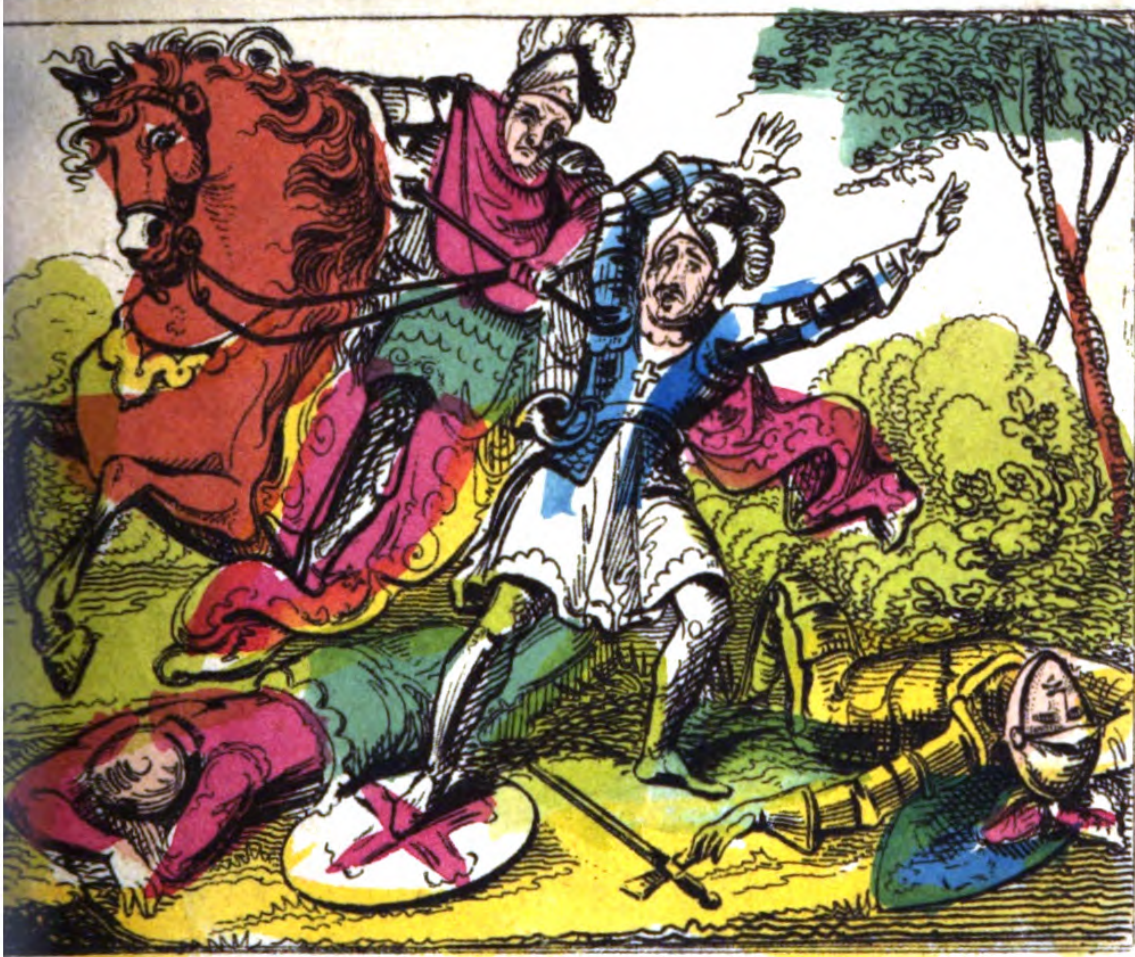






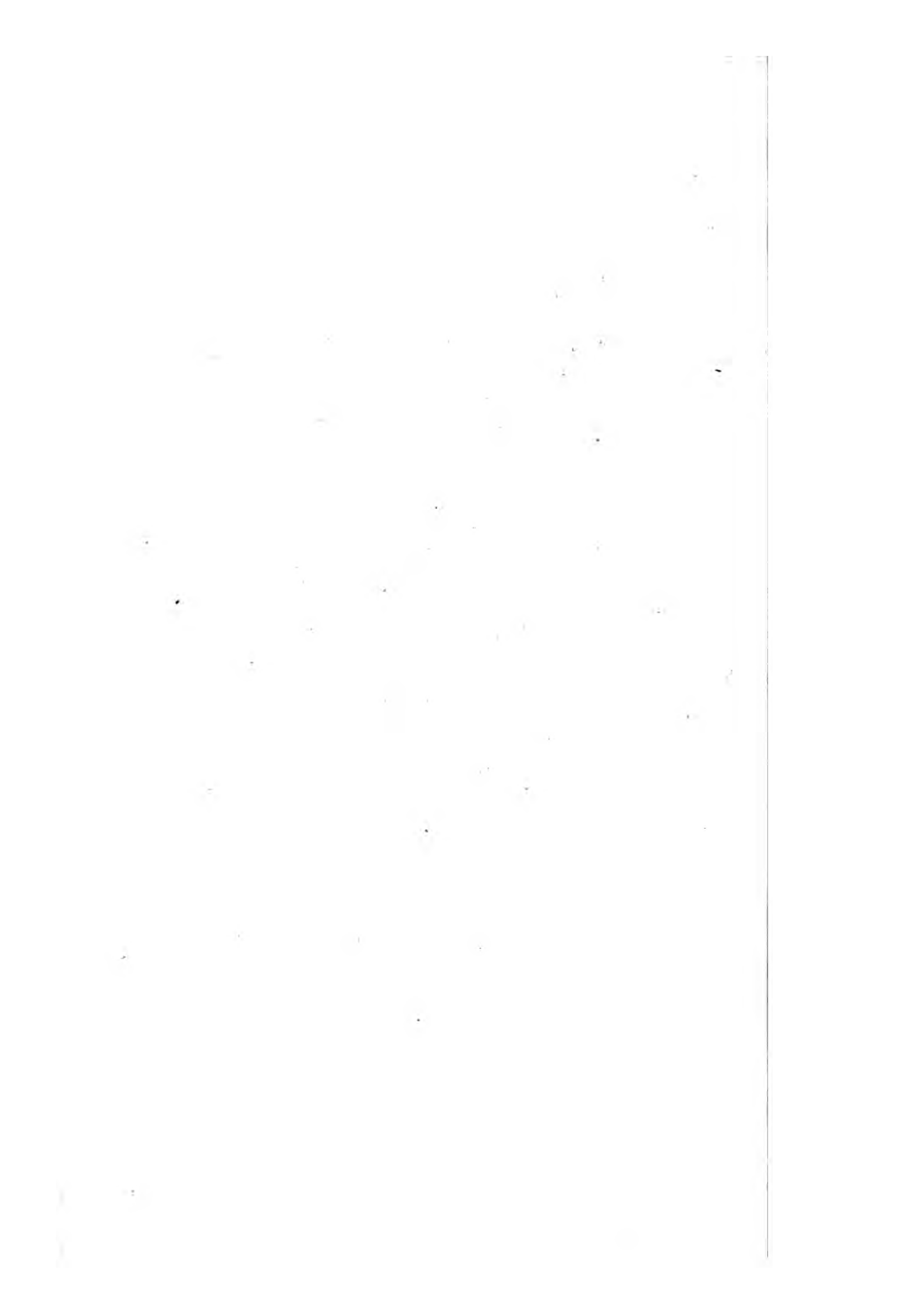
THE DEATH OF DOUGLAS.

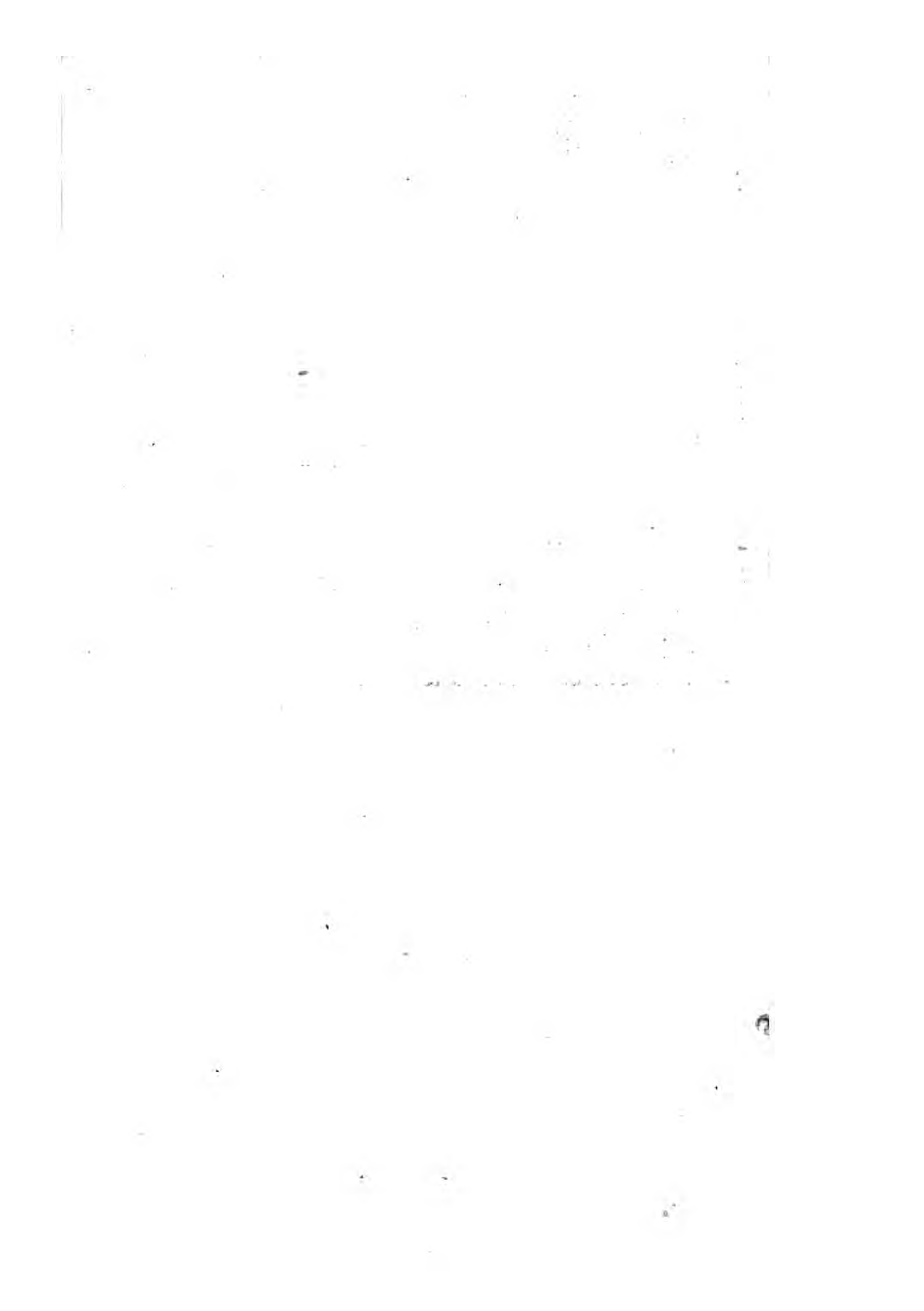
Then leaving life, earl Percy took

Upon the Earl Percy:







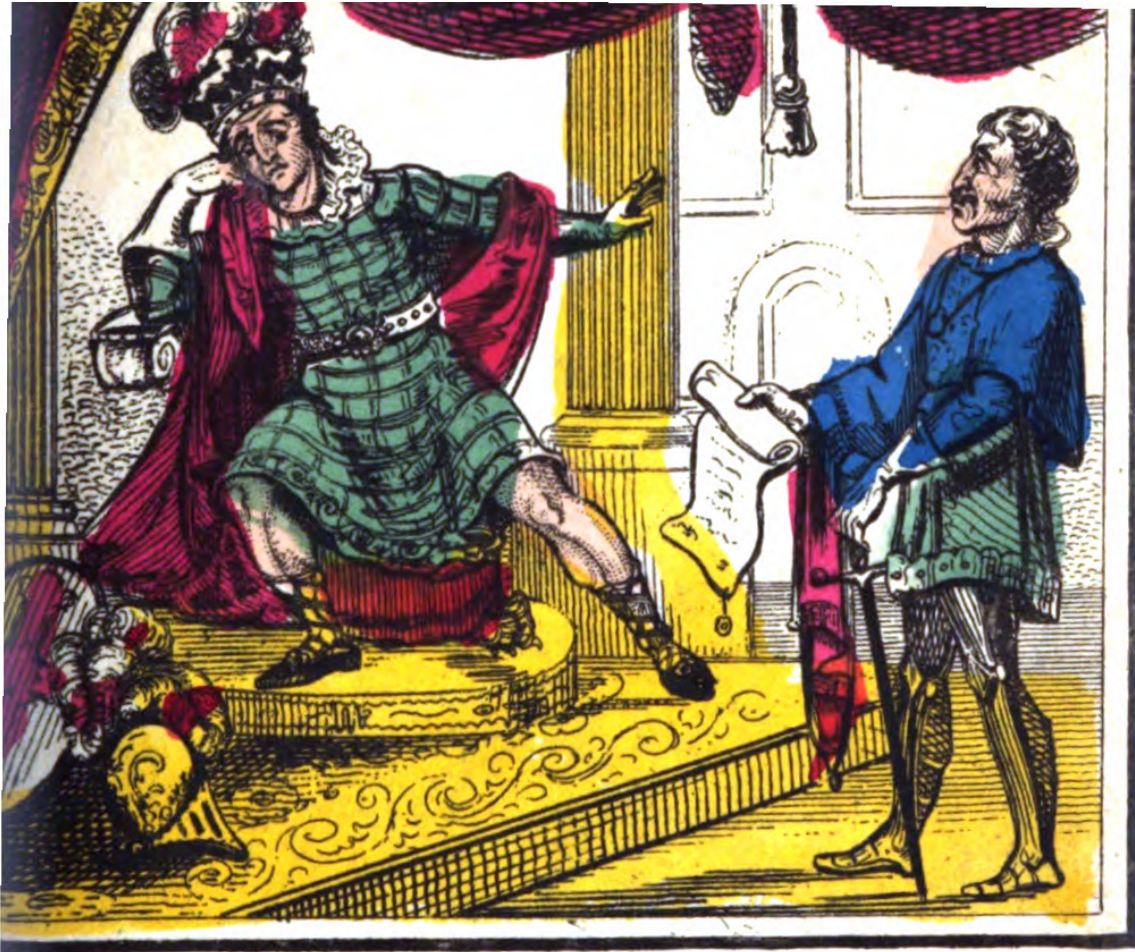
THE WIDOWS LAMENTATION.
