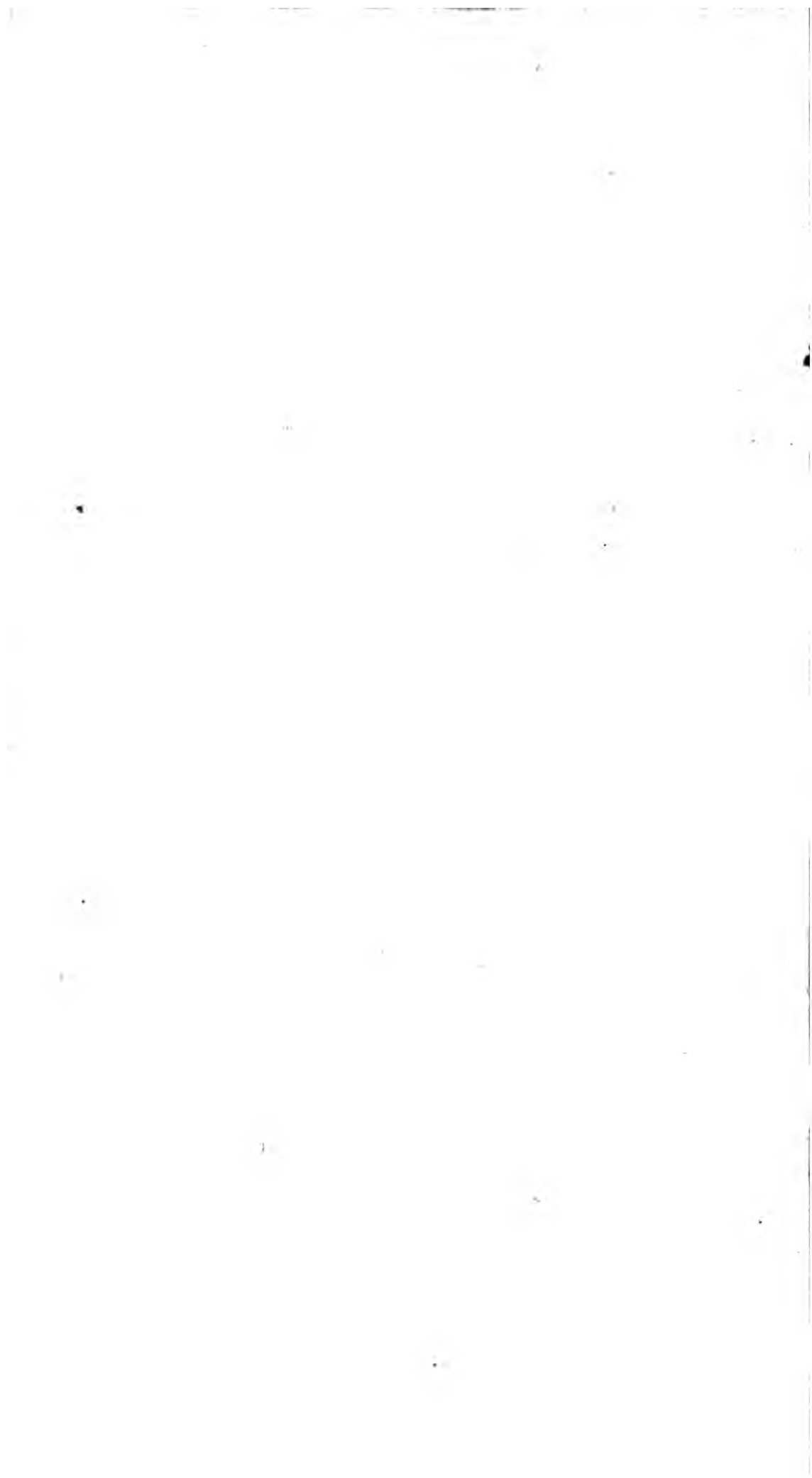

PREFACE to the READER.

Candid Reader,

I Having delighted in the *Art of Short-Hand* from my Youth, I practis'd it for some time according to the various Rules that were publish'd by divers others, before I attempted to compose any Method of my own. The first Book of this kind which I ventur'd into the World, was Entituled *A Pen* suck'd from an Eagle's Wing, &c. which was chiefly founded on Mr. Rich's Scheme, whose Short-Hand at that Time (being about 35 Years ago) was very much in Vogue: But the Experience of a few Years convinc'd me that his Basis was too narrow; which induc'd me to betake myself to the Study of a new foundation, upon which I built with better Success: This new Method I publish'd under the Title of *Arts Advancement*; which has found no unkind treatment in the World, as appears by the considerable Numbers that have been Printed for more than 20 Years together.

Not yet content with the Progress I had made in cultivating this Art, I applied my self to the further Improvement of it, and perswade my self that the Method I now publish, which I have brought in Manuscript for 15 Years past, has brought it many Degrees nearer to Perfection than any that has been yet expos'd to the World.

The Rules to be perfectly learn'd are all contain'd in the 3 first Pages, and in the 19th or

Last Page of the Short-Hand: These (compar'd to those of some other Authors) are but few in number, yet General in their Use, and easy in their Practise.

I have taken Care in all Parts of this Art, to contrive my Contractions so as might best answer the End of it, which is to write with Facility and Speed; to which Purpose, Short-writing may be said to consist of 4 Parts.

1. Spelling Character's is the Writing of Words compleatly according to their Sound; by Vowels according to their Places; by Consonants, single, double or treble; or by Prepositions and Terminations, yet without quiescent or unsounding Letters: Of this sort of Short-Hand the greatest part of the Praxis in this Book consists: See the words abhor abide, &c. which are Printed in the Roman Letter, and easily known at the first Reading.

2. Symbolical Short-Hand uses such Natural Marks and Characters for Words and Sentences as are a kind of Images visibly to represent the Words or Things thereby signified; as appears in the Praxis by the Words above, above and below, &c. Printed in the Old English Letter. These are commonly learn'd by being two or three times written.

3. Deficient Writing is when some part of a Word stands for the whole; as in the first and second Words of the Praxis, ab is for abbreviate, and absn for Abbreviation, &c. Thus each Letter of the Alphabet (except C) stands for some particular

Word. This kind of Verbal Contraction by literal omission, will recompence the Trouble of those who are willing to write 'em 3 or 4 Times over, to see 'em well in their Memory. The differing Letters in Print, are to express the Composition of each character in this kind of writing.

4. Lastly. Arbitrary Characters are small Marks or Dots made at pleasure for some Words in frequent Use, which can't be made so short by the letters of the Alphabet. Of this sort the Number is so small, that they will soon be learn'd. So they are the most difficult to be remember'd. They are Printed in the Old English Letter, as well as the Symbolical Characters: For Example, consult the Praxis for the Words also, and, and e, and so forth, with some few others.

The Learner I hope will not be discourag'd at the Bulk of this Book, when he consider's that 'tis not the Rules, but the Praxis that makes it so large, the greatest Part of which is fill'd up with exemplary Words which are regularly form'd, and therefore need not be committed to memory; because that has learn'd the Rules, knows how to write these with a little Attention, without considering the Praxis: But the Variety of Words of this kind herein specified, gives delight to the Learner, and the copying of these Words, Clauses and Sentences, renders the Art the more easy and familiar to him: However, he may have recourse to this Praxis as to a Dictionary, and may attend to these words more or less, as he has leisure and Inclination.

The Symbolical, Deficient and Arbitrary Characters are to be more strictly attended to, by those
who

who would attain the greatest Perfection of the Art; For tho' they are not absolutely necessary to Short-Hand, yet many of 'em are very useful to abbreviate both Words and Sentences: Of these Characters, every one may learn more or less as he thinks fit; but those who will be at the Pains to write 'em over in orderly Lines, as they do a Copy, will soon attain their End. For I have found by long Experience in Teaching, that this Art is learn'd more by Examples than by Rules, and that 'tis the Practice of the Pen that brings a Man nearest to Perfection in this, as well as other Writing. This is all of which I think necessary to advertise the Reader.

As I desire to be thankful to the Divine Goodness that has continued my Life, and given me a competent Course of Health to finish this work: So it will be no small Satisfaction to me if I find it proves acceptable and serviceable to the Publick.

*Brief Directions to the Learner concerning the
 Three first Pages Ingraven.*

1. **A** and **E** being Vowels, their Characters serve only to *begin* Words, and must (contrary to the Formation of all other Letters) *begin* at the *Bottom*, and *end* *Upwards*.

2. **B** hath Two Characters, as different in Use as in Shape: The long *b*, is either *Initial*, to *begin* Words or Syllables with; or *Disjunct*, to set after, or in the Place of a *Vowel*.

3. But the round *b* is always *Conjunct*; or to be *Joyned* to some other Letter or Mark before it.

4. **C** and **K** need but *one* Character for *both*, or *either*; because (in this Art) **C** is never to be used, but only when it carries the Sound of *k* or *ck*.

5. **Q** having two Characters, (for Conveniency, in some Cases) *each* of them stand for *qu*; because no Word that hath *q* in it, is without *u* next after it.

6. **S** hath also two Characters; the First (contrary to the Formation of *a*) *begins* at the *Top* and ends *Downward*, being either *Initial* or *Final*.

7. The

7. The second S being a *Circular* Mark, is always *Medial* and *Conjunct*, as joyning to something before and after it.

8. There are also Two Characters for *u*; the First is either *Initial*, or *Conjunct*, but the latter *Final*, and *Distinct*.

9. X hath likewise Two Characters, for more ready joyning with other Letters; as you may see by the Seven last double and treble Consonants.

10. Z sounds *S hard*, and therefore the same Character for *S*, made longer and stronger, stands for *Z*. The rest of the Letters I think are obvious to all Capacities.

11. But for the Double and Treble Consonants, I count the Nine first ought to be as perfectly got in Memory as the Letters of the Alphabet, because equally hard.

12. The Two First of these Nine, (*viz.*) *ch* and *chr*, begin at the *Bottom*, and are cast *upward*, without taking off your Pen 'till finished. All the rest (together with the Vowels Places) are very plain and easy, And I conclude the Second and Third Pages also require no further Explaining, than what relates to the Prepositions and Terminations at the Bottom of the Fourth Page; which for their Usefulness deserve a more Ample Explication, as follows.

13. Such Characters as *begin* Words are termed *Prepositions*; and such as *end* them *Terminations*; and that many of them do *both begin* and *end* Words, will be obvious to every Capacity, from the Characters themselves; and therefore I have not parted them by distinct *Pages*, or *Paragraphs*, as some others do; but (that the Learner may more readily *make* and *remember* them) I have placed such Characters together as have most Resemblance, or Likeness to each other, that their Difference may be the better discern'd.

14. In perusing the following Table of Prepositions and Terminations, printed by the common Press, you will see certain *Dots* and *Strokes*, which are *Signals*, to shew that such a Particle next them, is either a Preposition, or a Termination, and sometimes both.

15. Any part of a Word *standing before* Two Dots, or a Stroke, is a Preposition: So *ab =*, *ob =*, *sub =*, *sub =*, &c. are Prepositions.

16. Contrariwise, any Particle *following after* the like Dots or Stroke, is a Termination: So *=able*, *-ible*, *=ched*, *=ved*, &c. are Terminations.

17. But some mark'd both ways, as *-charge =*, *=good-*; or others without Signals, as *full*, *place*, &c. are indifferently used for one or t'other, being both Prepositions and Terminations, as well as whole Words also.

18. As the Hyphen-stroke thus *-*, denotes Union, or a *joyning* of Consonants, or Characters together; So the Two Dots, thus *=*, signify a *separation* of the foregoing and following Matter, by a Vowel's taking Place.

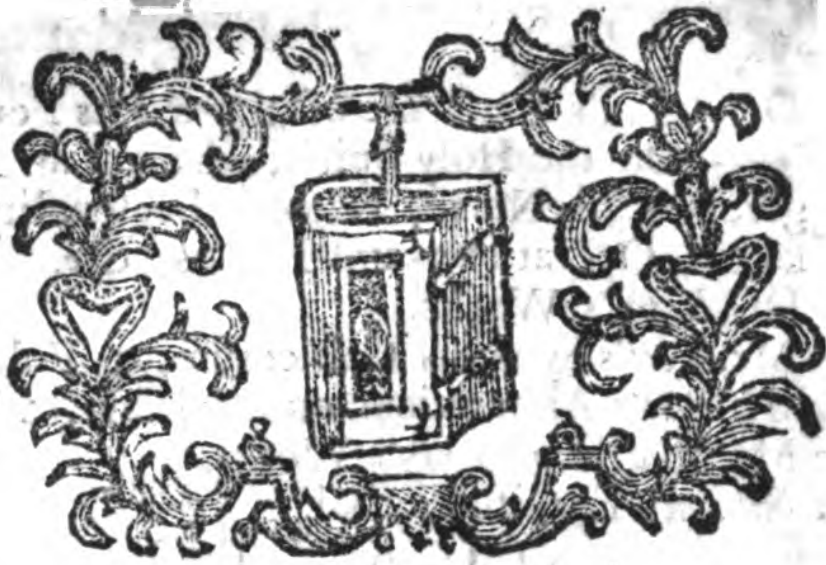
